

2016/17 Annual Report

PARTICIPATION

The Nursing Society was ratified following our EGM in October 2016. At the first EGM, we had around 20 members turn up; participation in events has fluctuated around 50. We currently have 40 members registered on the union website as members.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Due to our late start as a society we missed the societies training, we do plan to attend future training sessions in May 2017 and plan to attend the Union Societies Training sessions coming up over February. We also increased the size of our committee to 8.

MEMBER BENEFITS

We have worked in collaboration with the University of Surrey Careers to advertise career prospects and networking events in and around Guildford, and we have worked with the Royal College of Nursing to attain funding and plan trips to RCN hearings and plan to set up and run workshops in the future – as well as building a social network of nurses and a central hub of focus for communications between the nursing community, university and union.

COMMUNITY SUMMARY

Our volunteering has been restricted by our recent start and issues of communications from the union, however we have worked with the Uni Of Surrey Department of Widening Participation on the Year 8 Experiencing HE Week, delivering sessions on what university societies get up to and delering the BHF's HeartStart qualification.

CHALLENGES

Officially being recognised as a society in October has meant we've stuggled to build a membership, especially initially due to a lack of awareness. To overcome this we have collaborated with the nursing representatives and people involved in the society last year to get advice, contacts and publicise our society. In addition, because we're a 'new' society we've had limited access to communications about events, volunteering and training – which has meant that we've had to really push as a committee to find out information and how things work ourselves, whilst also driving our membership. It has been a real learning curve.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Continue to run exciting, educational and beneficial social event for our membership and work with the union on community volunteering and fundraising initiatives. Collaborative events proved successful and more work could be done to work alongside our healthcare professional and related courses, especially with fundraising.
