

UP rolls out ambitious P752-M digital project

In a bid to make the country's national university at par with the best schools in Asia and the world, the University of the Philippines (UP) unveiled on Monday, Aug. 6, a massive digital interconnection project that is expected to link its various campuses and streamline its operations.

Dubbed as eUP, the project has a budget allocation of P751.9 million in the next five years, although the interconnection component is expected to be completed by 2014.

The IT initiative, which had its kick-off at the National Institute of Physics Auditorium in UP Diliman, will be undertaken mainly with ePLDT, the Internet arm of telco giant PLDT, and Beacon Systems for system integration. Another PLDT subsidiary, Smart Communications, will provide the Wi-Fi and connectivity solutions.

In his speech during the launch, UP president Alfredo Pascual said emphatically that it was high time for the country's premier university to overhaul its processes and be able to pull out crucial data easily to aid in policy development.







What is "failure" in ERP implementation? (Young & Whitton)

- Running over budget
- Extending over the expected timeframe
- Not delivering expected features or scope
- Not achieving the promised ROI
- Requiring an inordinate effort to run the new system
- Stopping operations

Let's think a bit before the PAEP Administration *Irreversibly* Commits UP's Resources to eUP

- 1)In-house software development;
- 2)Off-the-self acquisition;
- 3)Open-source software development;
- 4) Combination of 1 and 3.

The Cost of eUP

Let's say this is the cost of development of the current version of CRS

If you conservatively allocate 10x more to develop systems for HR, finance, inventory and procurement, and for some reason, decide to develop a new CRS, and integrate everything, all in-house, this is what it would cost

What is open source software (OSS)?

- 1)The source-code of the software is accessible to everyone;
- 2) The software can be copied, shared and used without limitations;
- 3)The software can be modified and shared in a modified form;
- 4) It is often a collaborative effort.

Main Reasons of German Firms for Adopting OSS ERPs (Neubert 2011)

- No licensing costs
- Open standards
- Independence from vendor/producer
- High Quality
- Flexibility through self-customization
- Dependability
- Security
- Community Support
- More freedom through open-source licensing
- Internal Know-how
- Expandability because of source-code access
- Easier to find errors
- Fix bugs yourself

Additional Reasons:

Minimized risk of investment

Expenses go directly to development, servicing and customization rather than to license payments

BAGUIO CITY—The University of the Philippines can invest in high-stakes projects to earn bigger dividends when it completes a three-year plan to digitally centralize the administration, communication and financing systems of all UP campuses in 2014, UP President Alfredo Pascual said.

He said the P750-million e-UP project was designed to improve productivity and make managing the UP system more efficient once UP Diliman is wired with other autonomous units in Manila, Los Baños, Baguio, Visayas and Mindanao, using a dedicated information and

communication technology backbone

. We will put funds which are now dispersed across the UP system and manage these funds as one pool. We will get professional managers to help us manage our funds.... If we make only 1 percent earnings, that is P140 million. That's a lot," he said.

"The e-UP will bind us together and will also enable us to reach out beyond our borders to other state universities and colleges," Pascual said, adding that UP's scholarly papers will be made available to a much bigger online audience.

But in a period characterized by a weakened global economy, e-UP should enable the UP system to improve the way it manages its finances, Pascual said at the launch of the digital project at UP Baguio last month.

They say that ERPs will replace legacy software. CRS is not legacy, it is *our* cutting-edge

- CRS is about our processes, not someone else's "best practices."
- The best option is NOT long-term vendor lock-in with Oracle.

 The best option is to combine in-house development with involvement in a larger open-source ERP project. This is not reinventing the wheel. It is not a waste of time. Developing our capacities as a University is better than the short-term consumption of readymade software. ERP development is a burgeoning field in software development which UP students and faculty can join in. Why do programmers still develop computer languages when there are already so many? Because they rightly think they can make a better one!

- BIG QUESTION 1:
- Did the PAEP Administration consider the option of other proprietary and Open Source ERP Solutions and try to match their features and offerings with actual needs by consulting the users themselves? Probably Not.

- BIG QUESTION 2:
- Did the PAEP Administration undertake a cost benefit analysis to ensure that the vendor lockin *modus* with Oracle would at least be sustainable in the long-term beyond his six year term? Probably Not.

- BIG QUESTION 3:
- Can the PAEP Administration show us in detail to what extent the processes and procedures of the University will be impacted upon because of the inflexibility of Oracle software?
- Hopefully Yes.

- BIG QUESTION 4:
- Can we get as soon as possible a complete audited accounting of all eUP expenses since the beginning of the project in the interest of public transparency? Can we have an audit of the bidding process for the Oracle software?
- Hopefully Yes.

Conclusion

- eUP will drain UP of precious funds sourced from taxpaying Filipino farmers and workers.
- It is indeed a possibility that the PAEP Administration can make eUP work. But at what extraordinary financial cost? It is an irresponsible waste of money which could be used for other things.

Conclusion

- The PAEP Administration has a wrong sense of priorities.
- What does the *iskolar ng bayan* really need?: reduction of tuition fees and abolition of STS, adequate affordable dormitories, expansion of subsidized student food services, modernization and repair of facilities and laboratories, advanced library facilities and resources.

When PAEP is long gone we will still be paying Oracle ad
