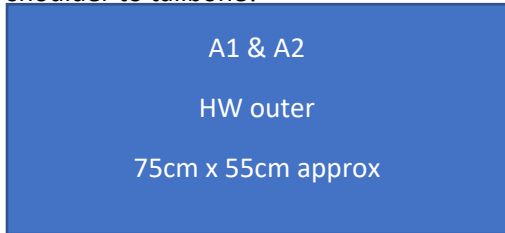
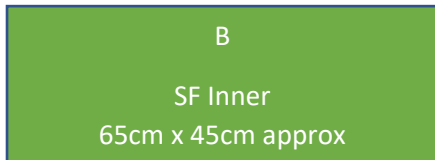


Myrtle's Cave Bed

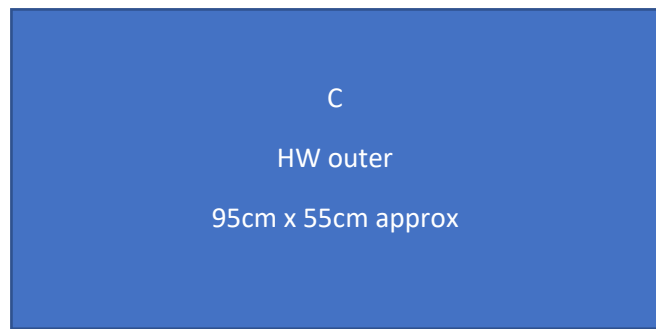
You will need two types of material, a hard wearing (HW) outer and a soft fleecy (SF) inner, in the following shapes. Fleece does not generally fray so can be sewn straight on, but hem round edges if you prefer. Allow an extra 2.5cm for seams & adjust sizes in general for your pup. These are for Myrtle who is currently 14 weeks old, 6kg and 38cm shoulder to tailbone!



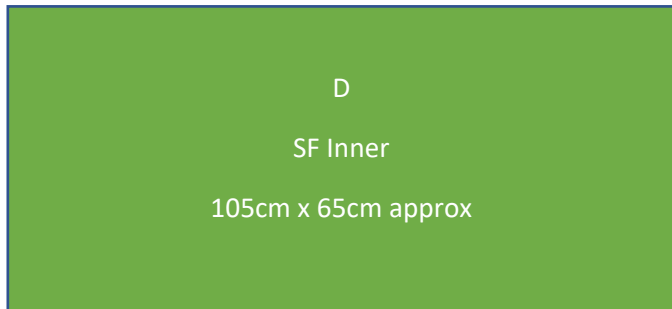
X 2 (top and bottom of cushion)

x 1 (top of cover blanket)



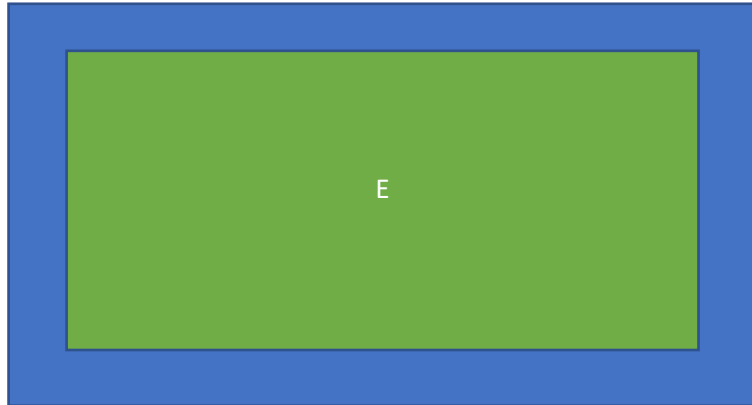
X 1 (inside of cover blanket)

Stuffing (We used a spare duvet, cut down to about 170cm x 75cm and folded double)

INSTRUCTIONS:

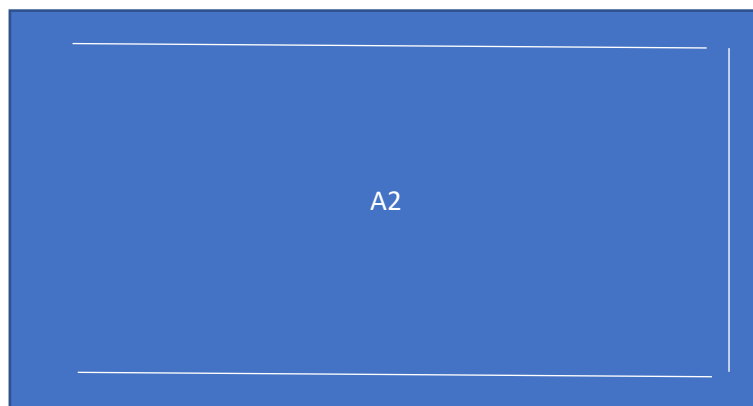
1. Fold seams of B and sew to A1. This will be the top of the cushion your pet sleeps on and should look like this:



2. Fold seams of D and sew to centre of C, leaving a border of the hard-wearing material that is about 10 cm on three edges. This will be the blanket cover that goes over the top and should look like this:



3. Place F, fleece side up, on a flat surface. On top of this, place E fleece side down so the fleece matches up. You will need to pleat parts of F (folding into a Z shape) until the edges fit the edges of E. These can be pinned in place.
4. Flip the material over so the underside of E is on top
5. Place A2 on top so it matches E and pin in place.
6. Sew three edges, ideally these three:



7. Turn inside out and put stuffing between A2 and E.
8. Fold seams and sew last edge (if you're jazzy you can add buttons or a zipper here)
9. Put your pup inside
10. Enjoy!
