## MANAGER PREVIEW WITH JOHN ROBERSTON

Good afternoon and welcome to today's Ladbrokes Championship match against Arbroath.

I would like to welcome Dick Campbell, his brother Pink, and the rest of the coaching staff, directors and players to the Caledonian Stadium this afternoon, backed by their faithful away fans, for what will be another very competitive league game.

We had two disappointing trips to Dundee, where firstly we lost 1-0 in a tight match against Dundee in the Betfred League cup that saw us exit the tournament.

There was nothing much between the sides and whilst we had a few chances in the first half we didn't look sharp enough at the other end to get the equaliser that we needed on the day, which was hugely frustrating.

Last week saw us take on the Tangerine side of the city and, whilst our overall performance was ok, we failed to take big chances we created at 0-0 and 2-1 and ultimately we gave away soft goals that saw Utd deserve to win the game, but, not by the margin it finished.

## MATCH REPORT DUNDEE UTD 4 INVERNESS CT 1

#### 03.08.19 | TANNADICE, DUNDEE LADBROKES CHAMPIONSHIP

Lawrence Shankland made the headlines as he scored four on the opening day at Tannadice to secure Dundee United all three points, in a 4-1 win over the Caley Jags.

Shankland signed for United from Ayr in the summer and he certainly made a big impression on his United league debut.

John Robertson made one change from the side which had lost to Dundee the week previous as David Carson replaced James Vincent. New signing Miles Storey made the bench.

There was a couple of chances early on as the Caley Jags cleared a scramble in the box and at the other end James Keatings hit the post after being set up by Jordan White.

Untied did have the lead after 7 minutes on the clock, Shankland fired a header past Ridgers after he met Appre's cross in the box.

Brad Mckay was forced off with a back injury after he went up for a header and landed awkwardly. James Vincent replaced him.

Caley Thistle go themselves level after 29 minutes, James Keatings' corner found McCart in the middle and his header was somehow saved by Benji Siegrist but Walsh was on hand to fire home the rebound.


However, the game wasn't level for long as, one minute later, Shankland glanced home McMullan's cross from close range to make it 2-1 to the home side.

In the second-half, Shankland completed his hat-trick after 53 minutes. The striker was found in the middle as he headed in Louis Appere's cross for his third header of the game and the match ball.

Jordan White almost got one back as he fired Charlie Trafford's cross inches past the post after 56 minutes.

With ten minutes remaining, James Vincent was called into action as he cleared Cammy Smith's effort off the line.

Shankland had his fourth with four minutes remaining, the United striker swiveled in the box and fired his effort low into the bottom right hand corner.

Graeme Bennett is a former player and director of football at the club, he featured in the the first game against Arbroath 25 years ago as he recalled

"Unbelievable, playing against the same team 25 years later and a year since the day of Alan Hercher's death so it's an unbelievable set of circumstances."

"It was a good atmosphere going into the game at the old Telford Street, you just didn't know what you were going into as it was our first league game. Hopefully it'll give a spur to the boys playing today as another 5-2 will be welcome!"


"There's been ups and downs for the club, loads of great moments. They've been a stable club in the Scottish Premiership, thats what we're aspiring to now and hopefully John Robertson can do that."

Charlie Christie is working in the Club's Youth Department now and has been a player, and is a former manager too is looking forward to celebrating the club's 25th year this afternoon.

Charlie said: "I was injured and missed the first month of the season in 1994 so didn't play in the first ever league game but it was great to be there. It's very fitting and incredibly poignant what's come around."

"It's astounding that we have Arbroath here, nearly 25 years to the date of the first game and one year since Alan died. It's an incredible turn of events."

"Graeme has helped organised what should be a brilliant day for Herchie, the lounge will be filled with former players and hopefully it'll be a great day."



Last year, Alan Hercher sadly died at the age of 52. Today, Hercher will be honoured by the club in various ways, as Alan's friends and family are in hospitality for today's match.

Today, there will be a minutes applause before the match as a tribute to Hercher, each Caley Thistle player will wear an armband with the number four on it which was Alan's old squad number and we'll see the opening of the Alan Hercher enclosure in the North Stand. Today's fixture is a fitting one to remember Alan as he scored the hat-trick 25 years old in our first league match against Arbroath.

Charlie Christie paid tribute to Alan as he said: "When the Championship fixtures came out in late June I remember having a rye smile at the astounding poignancy of our opening home match. It is quite incredible that we will play Arbroath F.C. on the one year anniversary of the passing of one of the North's most talented and popular football players ever – Alan Hercher."

"It is even more fitting that we welcome 'The Red Lichties' to the stadium almost 25 years to the day that Big Herchie scored a superb hat trick against them at Telford Street Park in our first ever Scottish League match! I remember thinking at the time that somebody up there is looking down on us and wanting us to have a special day for a very special guy."

"I have been lucky enough to have played with, and against, so many great characters in my career but I can't think of anyone who was held in such high regard in this area as Alan. A fabulous team mate that could always be counted on I could recount numerous occasions when Alan would pop up with a crucial goal just when his team needed it most; All four goals in the Qualifying Cup quarter final match at Fraserburgh, a brilliantly taken penalty in 1992 to get us back in the Scottish Cup tie against St Johnstone, a last minute equaliser against Steve Archibald's East Fife and that late winner against Livingstone in an epic Scottish Cup tie at Telford Street being just a few of the many times that the much admired lad from Beauly came up trumps when it was needed most!"

"I am thrilled that Alan is being remembered by lots of his friends here today and that Inverness Caledonian Thistle are recognising one of the club's true 'greats' – nobody could ever argue that it is not fully deserved."



## THE OPPOSITION ARBROATH

Arbroath come to the Caledonian Stadium this afternoon drawing 0-0 with Queen of the South on the opening day last weekend. The Red Lichties have gained two promotions in three years under Dick Campbell, who took the manager's job when the club were struggling in League Two.

Last season Dick Campbell's side won the League One title in style, winning it by seven points over Forfar. Bobby Linn was among one of five Arbroath players in the PFA Scotland League One team of the season last term, the 33 year-old scored 23 goals in 38 games last season. The other Litchies in last season's team of the year were Jason Thomson, Ricky Little, Thomas O'Brien and Gavin Swankie.

Goalkeeper Derek Gaston has arrived this summer from Morton, Centre-Back Robert Wilson from Berwick Rangers, Scott Stewart from Airdrieonians and James Murphy on a free transfer.



#### Almost exactly 25 years ago to the day, Caley Thistle beat Arbroath 5-2 in our first ever league match, with the great Alan Hercher scoring a hat-trick for the Caley Jags.

Today, football shows it can work in strange and wonderful ways, as we take on the same opposition. The first goal was a simple one for the Caley Jags, Graeme Bennett's corner was powerfully headed in by Alan Hercher.

The second goal for Hercher was from a corner again but this time Arbroath failed to clear their lines and it fell to Hercher to smash it home. Hercher again caused problems for the Arbroath players, another corner was swung in and powerfully headed in by Hercher as he completed his quick fire hat-trick.

In the second-half, Craig Farnan headed one back for Arbroath to get them back into the match and Downie played in Reilly who finished past McRitchie.

However, Caley Thistle did manage to extend their advantage as McRitchie's kick out wasn't dealt with, and Paul McKenzie clipped the ball over the goalkeeper's head.

The final goal was the best of the match as Graeme Bennett went on the counter attack and he played a brilliant ball to Wilson Robertson, who timed his run perfectly, as the winger lobbed the Arbroath goalkeeper to give us our first ever three points!

#### ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

**Disorderly conduct includes:** 

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
- Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender Identity
- Disability
- Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting
- Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000

All persons entering the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible criminal proceedings, ejection from the stadium, withdrawal of a season ticket and/or exclusion from future matches at the club.
