## **Registration Opens For** Summer Jobs Program

Robert M. Coard, executive director of Action for Boston Community Development, announced the opening of registration for ABCD's 1980 Summer Job Program for Boston youth. The program, which has employed over 105,000 young people during its 15 years, is run in cooperation with the City of Boston and funded primarily by the federal government.

Called EASY, Employment Academic Services for Youth, the program is designed to provide work experience and training to economically disadvantaged young residents of Boston who are in or out of school, and to offer them the opportunity to

work and learn in different occupations while earning the minimum wage. In addition to low-income youth, ABCD's program employs special needs and handicapped youth in positions that are appropriate to their capabilities and needs.

Young people from the ages of 14 to 21 who are Boston residents, are in or out of school, and who meet the federally defined standards for low-income families are eligible for participation in the program. Handicapped Boston youth are also eligible.

for this summer's program should have their own Social Security cards; those without a card can request information on how to obtain them from the Neighborhood Employment

Center, One Thompson Square. Young people whose families receive welfare assistance should have their Public Assistance representative stamp their applications to verify receipt of assistance. Employment in the EASY Program will in no way affect the status of any enrollees or their families with regard to Public Assistance; they are urged to apply.

In addition to Social Security cards, youngsters will need proof of birthdate, residency and family income. Proof of residency can be established with a copy of a recent receipt or utility bill. Proof of income can be established with copies of 3 recent paycheck stubs or a copy of the latest income tax W-2 form.

Applications for enrollment in the program will be taken through March 3, 1980 at the Neighborhood Employment Center, One Thompson Square (242-4548). Applications may only be picked up during after-school hours.
