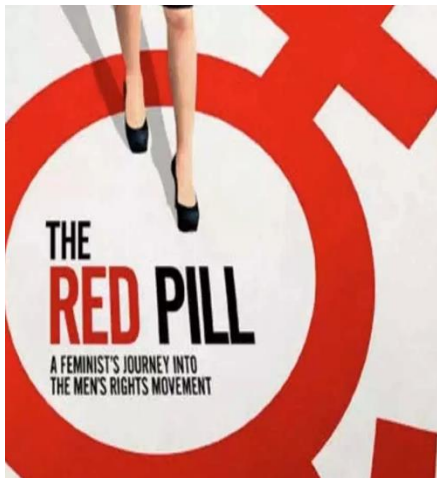


The Red Pill Documentary Review

Synopsis: ***The Red Pill*** is a 2016 American [documentary film](#) directed by [Cassie Jaye](#). The film explores the [men's rights movement](#), as Jaye spends a year filming the leaders and followers within the movement. *The Red Pill* premiered on October 7, 2016, at Cinema Village in [New York City](#), followed by several other one-time screenings internationally. It was released on DVD and Blu-ray on March 7, 2017, by [Gravitas Ventures](#).

Controversy over the documentary has led to some protests and cancellations of its screenings.
