A mild detergent, like a free and clear formula or Woolite, is good, however common detergent is fine - no need to purchase a separate detergent for washing stuffed animals. Follow the directions on the bottle and don't use too much detergent, as soap residue left behind can irritate delicate skin.

If the scale and shape of the stuffed animal allows for it, put the toy in a mesh washing bag to help protect elements like eyes and hair. You can too pad the load with towels to help protect toys. Machine drying is O.K. 's not always the very best option as a result of many plush toys have glued-in or plastic parts that may not survive the high heat of a dryer. If you do choose to machine dry a stuffed animal, use the no- or low-heat setting. A better selection, although, is to air dry plush toys, as a result of fur can get burned in a hot dryer; place the toy near a fan or a dehumidifier to speed up drying time and make sure that the interior stuffing doesn't retain water. If the toy appears matted after its bath, utilizing a hair dryer on low or medium heat can help restore a furry friend's fluffiness.
