

Fan's Lego Terraria Build Tackles Bosses, Mining Escapades

Lego tributes are a popular way to show your love for your favorite games. One crafting game enthusiast did exactly that with a Lego Terraria-inspired build that they've been slowly building. Reddit user [advancednerd](#) began with a small house concept that was inspired by the indie game and has added more details to their design in incremental chunks, creating a large scene over multiple installments.

A simple house that has four walls as well as a chair and tables was the first model that [advancednerd](#) uploaded to the RPG game's subreddit. It features the game's guide in the interior, while a different character fights off a variety of slime creatures on the structure's roof. The post was so well-loved that they decided to add a scene that features an armored character fighting numerous flying demon eyes and zombies.

Fans expressed their desire to see the large Eye of Cthulhu boss reconstructed - and [advancednerd](#) responded with a striking design with two figures facing the giant toothy monster. The attention to detail they pay is remarkable, closely replicating common build techniques and arena layouts used by players and the models make clever use of all kinds of bricks and Lego studs to resemble the game's visuals.

Their latest update comes with two sets which includes their first attempt at underground modules as well as two-story homes for the merchant. Two brave explorers venture underground with ore patches as well as the occasional floor torch as well as wall layouts that one would expect from a Terraria expedition. We don't know how this project will expand, but we are hoping to see the map expand to different areas, such as the crimson or jungle biomes.

Another industrious Lego creator has been working on a Lego Minecraft stop motion project. The two survival games have also bumped into one another recently with the announcement of an ex-Minecraft modder being hired to work on Terraria mod tools. One player managed to achieve pre-hardmode Terraria flight recently in a rather unusual manner.
