

What You Can Expect

Obviously, religion, atheism, agnosticism, and so on will come up.

We'll examine Judaism, Christianity, various pagan beliefs, and Satanism.

You may or may not subscribe to these belief systems. That's fine.

I ask that you be respectful, but that you also have a thick skin this semester.

Triggers

These can be tricky subjects, so just as a warning, you should be aware of the following potential triggers:

- Discussions of religion's impact on society (we won't debate whether or not a particular religion is "true")
- Violence: torture of accused witches, events from the Holocaust, horror as entertainment (these could all include images)
- Language: "Adult Language," (used for academic purposes/analysis, not just to be vulgar) death/rape threats of individuals, anti-religious language.

Your Perspective

If you hold particular religious views, you will not be told you are wrong or shouldn't hold them (unless they promote violent criminal activity).

You have the right to your opinion, so please don't feel that you or your faith is under attack.

Be aware, however, that others likely do not share your worldview, so be respectful. Also, be thick skinned, and if someone misspeaks, or could benefit from a reasonable discussion, please don't be offended too easily.

If you are abusive to a student or instructor for any reason, appropriate disciplinary actions will be taken.

However, you don't need to shy away from it either; if you feel it's beneficial to bring it up. Please be respectful and attentive if others talk about this.

Groups/Topics We'll Address

Religious groups: Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Satanism.

Hate Groups: KKK, Nazis, Neo-Nazis

Topics: Extreme violence, sexual violence, child molestation, demonic violence, etc.

What to do if you feel uncomfortable
