This program is designed to assist lowincome families in repairing and renovating their properties so they can continue to live in safe, decent homes. Projects include painting, porch repair, roof repair, handicap ramp installation, landscape work and other minor repair services.

General Guidelines:

- 1. Your home must by in Allegheny Valley/ Westmoreland County.
- 2. You need to have lived and or worked in Allegheny Valley for at least one year.
- 3. You must have homeowners insurance.
- 4. Your income should meet the following guidelines. (Extraordinary family expenses or circumstances may be taken into consideration when determining disposable income.)

If Approved

We will require proof of homeownership and income qualifications.

With your permission, we will verify employment, checking and/or savings account balances, and other sources of income.

You or an adult of your family will be required to volunteer 8 or more hours working on your project or another Habitat For Humanity task.

You will be asked to contribute to the building materials for your home repair project.
