


# The H.E.LI.N. Mission and Objectives

- Provide higher quality & more effective services to their user communities.

- Value-added information services,

- A possible joint purchase of electronic resources,
- Common policy for collection development,
- New members.



## **The H.E.LI.N. Members' Meetings**

### **Organizational structure**

- horizontal administrative scheme
- absence of financial contribution
- participation on the basis of mutual benefit
- potential right of withdrawal
- voluntary participation of staffs' members in meetings, events, etc.

#### **Members' Meetings**

- monthly meetings (on a rotation basis)
- host member library is responsible for keeping the meeting's minutes
- decisions are taken after discussion and agreement of all members

### Challenges

- diverse administrative structures of members
- unequal budgets
- variety of collections
- fluctuations in the number of staff
- differences in operating regulations




