LibreOffice.org, sign in Zoho Writer,
The Book Patch and get on Blurb.com to
feature some of your strongest authors
in a 16-18 author project where you
employ open source tech to design
everything. I invite you to pick up
The Ethereal Gazette: Issue Five and
study this so you can see how this is
done. You do have something like this
in French but produce an American
version where you top out at 208 pages
overall. The body of the book being
196-199 pages, that must be separate.

Then arrange the title and copyright pages and I will give you the fonts. The fonts for the drop cap will be Teletype. This will allow you to blend all the files like a Lulu.com release. You want this to be 6 x 9

then one of your staff does the introduction for the writers. I will provide the template for \$60.00 overall and it's sitting on my dropbox, even the TOC template is calibrated. Your introduction should be about 1800-2400 words and topping out at 3300 words using the Linux Libertine.

I recommend getting Geoffery Owens to do the introduction of this, and your female editors doing what Deborah Di Paulo did and working with an outfit like <u>The Book Patch</u> use the funds to donate to a foundation that helps with disabilities. The layout you will treat this like a Lulu.com title using Open Office. Every part done separate because that was how <u>The Ethereal Gazette: Issue Five</u> was arranged. I had a few checking The Pattern Of Diagnosis but got reviews by those who were outright vile.

Instead of making someone pay a grand to publish with you, pay me for the templates and work with somewhere like The Book Patch and Blurb.com. The Book Patch has ISBNS for \$25.00-\$50.00 then you can work with ISBN Solutions for an ISBN that's \$18.99.

Here's how you do this with Blurb and be sure to single space your paragraphs, full justification and indent at the second paragraph then give space for each short story with the title and byline at the top of where it starts, then when that ends the next author goes into the part after that. When you reply I will send you the template kit and the authors you're working with are with both Bookbaby.com, Lulu.com, and Author Solutions alumni. I am suggesting tap the folks who were with Booktango being they saw The Pattern Of Diagnosis. Instead of charging an arm and a leg, pay out and do no setup fee ad doing an anthology will allow you to do just that. Those are the fonts; then you want the templates, reply to this e-mail any 17-18 authors you can get who are short story basis that aren't drabble. And you're about to see one of the bosses of The Book Patch. Take your time to arrange your covers because the last thing you want is butthurt by Nathan Shumate.
