





The 2015 season was a historic one for our First XI. We gained promotion to the highest level of cricket available in Scotland, the first time we have done this for a long, LONG time. We finished the season in second place, but only lost 2 matches, and ended up with the highest Net Run Rate in the division.

The season itself found ourselves, Stenhousemuir, Poloc, and to a lesser extent Stirling County, locked in a battle for promotion. Against the noted 3 opposi-

tion our record was, P4 W3 L1. The solitary defeat was to Stenhousemuir, early in the season. The only other defeat during the season was at the hands of St. Michael's, in what can only be described as a "freak" performance.

Doing the double over Stirling was huge, with the first game of the season at their place seeing us squeeze home by a relatively narrow margin. Finger nails were also whittled down during the away game against Greenock, where it took a last over heist from last year's professional Tim Spence to see us home in rather soggy conditions.

The away victory against Poloc was what turned out to be our "cup final", with it being very apparent that the winner of this game would be joining Stenhousemuir in the Premier Division. After falling to 177 all out on a decent wicket (credit to Abhishek Rajadhyaksha for top scoring with a fluent 56, and to Ross Patterson on 44 of the most important runs of his career), the bowlers needed to really perform against a highly-motivated Poloc side. Prestwick stalwart Gav Pitt ended up deciding the contest, coming on for a rare second spell to take the prized wicket of the fluent looking Poloc skipper Craig Young. Special mention goes to Craig Morrison who took the fantastic catch to dismiss Young in damp, dark conditions.

Gav and Mitchell were absolutely crucial to our promotion bid, and it was fitting that the two shared the end of season player of the year awards. Skipper Shaz led from the front, being our highest scoring amateur batsman. Shaz scored a maiden first XI century away at Kilmarnock on a hot July day. A seriously powerful innings punctuated by the humongous checked drive which flew over the fencing at Kirkstyle. Young Mikey Miller also deserves credit for his batting during the season, scoring some crucial runs against good attacks. Mikey's standout innings was undoubtedly against Premier League Uddingston, where his 51* guided us to a Rowan Cup semi-final. Future Saltire Mitchell also stood out that day for what was arguably shot of the season as he drilled the 3rd last ball of the match for 6 to secure the victory.

All in all a very successful season which every member of the club should be proud of. Everyone played a part along the way and we are now perfectly geared up for the challenges that await us in the Premier Division.
