The Vincent Lupone Scholarship Award is given annually to a graduating senior of the Morgan School who has been involved with the Morgan Interact Club. Vincent Lupone was an exemplary model of the "Rotary's Service Above Self" motto. He was a charter member of the Westbrook Lodge of Elks 1784; a member and trustee of St. Mary's Church of the Visitation in Clinton; a third-degree knight of the Walter J. Keenan Council of Knights of Columbus; a former member of the Clinton Board of Finance for more than 25 years; an honorary member of the Girl Scouts; Order of Redman; Holy Name Society; a Clinton businessman of the year; and a civil defense spotter. He also was former treasurer of the Clinton Little League and a member of the Shoreline Business Association, Clinton Stamp Club, Clinton Men's Bowling League, and he was a founding member of Clinton Rotary Club, where he was a Paul Harris fellow. In his name, a scholarship is given to an active member of Interact annually.
