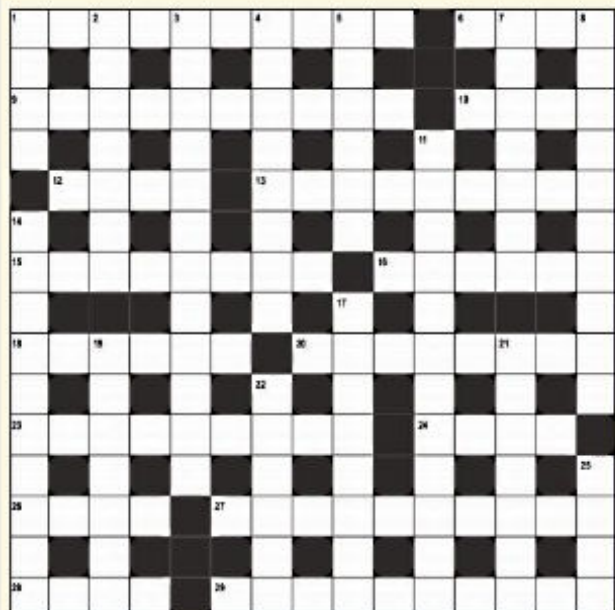


Prize Crossword No. 395
