Allmendinger, who is planning to take up residence in Toronto with his Canadian fiancee, won the hearts of his prospective neighbors despite taking the checkered flag 1.851 seconds ahead of local favorite Tracy. It was the first 1-2 for Gerald Forsythe's team since Tracy and Patrick Carpentiermanaged the feat at the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course in 2003, and Allmendinger is the first American driver to win three-consecutive Champ Car races since Al Unser, Jr. did it twice during his 1994 championship season.
The Toronto GP was also by far the best Champ Car race of the season, with only three caution periods and five leaders. Allmendinger led a racehigh 38 laps and averaged a racerecord 92.386 miles per hour.
"If I pinch myself, I might wake up," Allmendinger said after his third-consecutive triumph. "The Forsythe team is absolutely beautiful, and Michael Cannon and the engineering staff seem to get the car perfect when it counts.
"I love the Champ Car World Series, and I'm starting to love winning.' Polesitter Justin Wilson led the first 10 laps before a tangle between four backmarkers brought out the pace car.

## Toyota In NASCAR

Dave Despain's column in the June 28 issue of NSSN got me going again. Many people are fearful of what Toyota will bring to the table in NASCAR. Many are also in denial that they will likely be a force to be reckoned with. I don't believe either group is seeing the situation in its reality.
First, since NASCAR lets front-wheel-drive cars be rear drive, it is a short exercise in creative thinking to let a car with no compatible engines into the formula. Second, since the unisex body was established (and next year, the covered wagon of the future), there is no difference in style, excepting grille style and decals. So, you can't keep out some new manufacturer who wants to spend money.
Toyota can be a formidable competitor, and it has been freed from the Indy Racing League engine program due to low performance.
But to compare its performance in Formula One, which has the highest performance requirements in major auto racing, to NASCAR, which has about the lowest, is ludicrous. Witness the current standings in the pickup truck division, and how much difference is there with the taxis?
The two things that will keep Toyota from winning in the first year are the learning curve for a new division and the fact that it has only been able to attract second and third-tier drivers so far.
But that will change, as its potential improves and contracts come up. I would posit that it might take two to three years before Toyotas are well represented in The Chase for Media Attention.
So then, what will happen to the former "core group" of NASCAR?
Will the "Bubba Nation" still pour their working-class wages into a sport that has little resemblance to their Pappy's NASCAR? Stay tuned.

But remember, he did step away from his routine last year to organize Detroit's 2006 Super Bowl hospitality effort, for which he got rave reviews. Following Roger many years, we forecast fans will see him at speedways here and there wherever and whenever his teams race.

Oh those TV interviews. The final 30 minutes of Sunday's CBS Champ Car World Series telecast from Toronto were watched with great interest. Why? Because the race was over and it was an "all-fill" half hour, a rare opportunity for unhurried and interesting dialogue with key people. But what was seen and heard were bland exchanges with whomever was nearby. Why did we not hear from team-owner Carl Russo about his firing of A.J. Allmendinger, who then embarked on a remarkable three-race winning streak? And why not a word from car-owner Gerry Forsythe, who might own a championship thanks to the recent arrival of the suddenly troublesome Allmendinger? Later Sunday afternoon the Chicagoland Nextel Cup race ended in furor over Jeff Gordon spinning out leader Matt Kenseth in the closing laps and going on to victory. The TNN interviewer was told by Kenseth the spin was payback for a similar incident at Bristol earlier this year. So, why wasn't Kenseth asked if he would get even? Opportunities lost and viewers suffer. Too many of today's TV reporters are more interested in becoming buddy-buddy with

key players than in acting as competent reporters.
A pat on the back for CNN's new auto-racing TV episode "Dirt Track Warriors." A far cry from the NASCAR fare now dominating our airwaves, DTW deals with the oldest form of U.S. auto racing and does it quite well. Look for a re-air.

Should we TV fans be worrying? NBC-TV is dropping Arena Football after four seasons on OLN. The reason - a decrease to an 0.8 Nielsen rating, down from 1.1 in ' 03 . Some of today's auto-race telecasts struggle to achieve an 0.8 rating.

After putting its name on huge spectator bowls in Illinois, Texas, California and Washington State, one might ask if Toyota is also planning greater penetration of U.S. motorsport. If one anonymous tipster is right, Toyota is interested in more than NASCAR. He (or she) advises in an unsigned missive that All-American Midget Series exec Ed Adair is promising Toyota 100 midget races a year if a deal they are discussing comes to fruition. What's the skinny, Ed?

It appears that Dale Earnhardt, Jr. and his stepmother, Teresa Earnhardt, are again friends. Why? Terms were recently agreed to between Dale, Jr. and DEI (owned by Teresa and which fields his Nextel Cup cars) granting him ownership rights to his name. Prior to the agreement, Dale, Jr. had to get permission from Teresa, president and CEO of DEI, to use his name in endorsements and licensing deals.

lapped car, he had to slow slightly. Before he realized it, Gordon put his bumper into the rear quarter-panel of Kenseth's Ford, sending the leader spinning out of control.
It was the same move Kenseth used on Gordon at Bristol Motor Speedway in March, and resulted in Gordon pushing Kenseth after climbing out of the race car.
Either way, paybacks are never fun in this sport.
"That wasn't an accident," Kenseth said. "He just ran over me. On the restart, he was hanging back, and NASCAR has a rule you can't hang back two car lengths or one car length, but I've never seen it enforced."
Kenseth claimed Gordon was intentionally laying back to get a better run on him when the green flag waved. It's an old racing tactic that is used on restarts.

him on that restart when he got a run," Kenseth argued.
Kenseth had a right to be upset. For the second year in a row, he led the most laps the mile-and-a-half track only to fall short at the end. Last year, he led 176 laps and finished second to Dale Earnhardt, Jr.
Sunday he led four times for 112 laps before he was punted out of the way by Gordon. "In Matt's mind, it was probably payback for Bristol, so if he came in and shoved me, it would have been a clean slate," Gordon said. "I was definitely going to move him out of the way, he just spun out. I'm not going to give an inch, and I don't expect him to give me an inch.
"I certainly didn't mean to wreck him, but I didn't mind moving him out of the way, either."
To add insult to his day, Kenseth ran out of fuel under caution as NASCAR prepared for the green-white-checkered flag finish, which mired him in the back of the pack. When the extra three laps of the race were completed, with Gordon winning,

## Why Can't Racers And Promoters Work Together? <br> TRAVELERS REST, S.C

It was with great anticipation we removed the shackles that seemingly keep us attached to a desk in the National Speed Sport News newsroom.
We grabbed a bundle of newspapers, a pen and a notepad and were quickly barreling down the highway headed for Riverside Speedway in the hills of upstate South Carolina.
This particular event, the North-South Shootout featuring the United Sprint Car Series and the United Racing Company sprint cars, held great promise and it looked to be a whiz-bang of a winged-360-sprint-car event.
The concept of bringing the best drivers from two of the country's top regional touring series together for two nights of racing (the second came Saturday at I-20 Speedway) at least on paper looked as if it would provide great racing, great car counts and the groundwork for future events, not only between URC and USCS but possibly other 360 organizations as well. What greeted us at What greeted us at
Riverside Speedway was surprising and disappointing at the same time. It was just another race. Yes, URC brought 10 travelers, including the Michael Brothers, Kramer Williamson and Brooke Weibley, but there were only 21 cars total. Most of the USCS regulars were on hand, but the race was without series kingpin Kenny Adams and his step-on, Bryn Gohn, as Gohn was racing - and finishing third - in the USAC Silver Crown race in Chicago. Maybe most disappointing was the absence of most of the North and South Carolina-based sprint-car teams. Teams that mostly race with the American Sprint Car Series Southern region. There wasn't a race scheduled for that tour, and you'd think racers the likes of Johnny Bridges, Bruce Cline, Brian Smith and Scott Young would support a potentially big sprintcar event being held in their neck of the woods.
But it didn't happen. It seems unlikely the ASCS racers were under instructions from the home office in Tulsa to stay away because of the absurd turf battle between ASCS leader Emmett Hahn and USCS headman Pete Walton, and it doesn't really matter. What does matter is that racers continue to hurt their own sport by promoting partisanship among sanctioning bodies.

The number of talented 360 -sprintcar teams and drivers in this country grows every day, and the potential for mini-series like this to help these drivers showcase their wares is definitely there.
All the time, promoters and racers of series like URC and USCS, ask how do we get to race at Lowe's Motor Speedway or how do we get in at this track. The answer is to support events like the North-South Shootout. If you were a promoter of a major track and were pitched the idea of a challenge race among sanctioning organizations, but knew it had been tried at smaller tracks without much success, it certainly wouldn't give great incentive to take the financial risk of holding such an event. The crowd at Riverside was above average, especially for an area where sprint-car racing makes only a couple annual appearances. The racing was single-file and follow-the-leader. Both Walton and URC President Jeff Zimmerman were satisfied with the event and acknowledged they were testing the waters for future events.
Let's hope they try it, and let's hope they can get some of the other 360-sprint-car organizations involved as well.
It can do nothing but help sprint-car racing.

Perrotte Gets A New Perspective As A Promoter

Most drivers, not to mention a substantial number of owners and mechanics, are convinced they know more about promoting a short track than the promoters themselves. A notable exception is Mike Perrotte, who drives a 358 modified at Albany-Saratoga Speedway on Fridays and Vermont's Devil's Bowl Speedway on Sundays. Saturday night his cars sit idle, as he operates the paved Airborne Speedway in
Plattsburgh with his car owners, George and Julie Huttig.
"I have to admit I like racing better," says Perrotte, the leading winner at nearby Frogtown Speedway. "I've been set on driving since I was a little kid, but I know I can't race forever, and this is something I can do for the next 15 or 20 years. Actually, promoting is a lot like racing. When you have a good night, there's a lot of satisfaction. When guys use their heads and race side by side without taking each other out, the racers and the fans all leave happy."
What is it that he dislikes about being the promoter?
"You have to listen to a lot of drivers who are never wrong," he says with a laugh. "I just wish they would race instead of complaining and running into each other. I complain too, but I at least try to be reasonable. I suppose I was as bad as the others until 1988, when we ran the track for one year. Since then I know both sides."
What's his advice for a driver with a grievance?
"They need to calm down first, then call the promoter on Monday. If they have a legitimate gripe, we'll fix it. But not on race night and not when he's ranting and raving. All drivers have huge egos, so there's seldom a night without some problem, but we work hard to prevent repeat incidents.
"The drivers in the lower classes need an explanation of what they did wrong, because most of them are still learning to race. The top classes are harder, because you can't convince them they did something wrong," Perotte says. "In the end, we try to treat everyone equally, and over time, the teams have come to understand and appreciate that. We had a case recent ly where the tech guys felt sorry for a guy and let him slide when he was light by a few pounds. I ended up disqualifying him because that wasn't right for the guys behind him."
Perrotte is a major advocate of his " A " division, DIRT-style small-block modifieds on asphalt, a class that he won a number of special events in before taking over the speedway from Tom Curley. He tells anyone who will listen that the "on the edge" cars are more exciting to drive and to watch than the more sophisticated asphalt modifieds.
"Right now, we're all pointing to upcoming shows at Sanair in Canada and the Oswego Speedway in central New York. It will give our type of racing more exposure, and some low-buck racers can experience two great tracks that they would never get to race on. Sanair, which is being promoted by Don Forte and Curley, is almost a mile, and it'll be a race for our guys like Syracuse is for the DIRT teams."
Compared to the other promoters he's dealt with, driver George Foley appreciates Perrotte.
"He's a lot more understanding when you need something," says Foley. "He listens and tries to make things right. Things aren't all black and white, because he realizes that in racing, strange things happen."
Perrotte says he'll be racing for a few more years, but he also has another major goal. "I'm trying to develop a spec big-block engine to make racing more affordable," he says. "I'm hoping a spec big block will be cheaper than the small blocks we use now but will have enough extra power to be competitive."
Mike Perrotte is a winner - helmet on or off.

DAVE DESPAIN oddities ... like the new name for last weekend's big Toronto street race. Born 20 years ago, the race featured "Indy cars" - cars that raced at Indy - so Molson beer, both the sponsor and promoter, named it "Molson Indy." The name stuck through one of my favorite racing oddities. When the Indy Racing League was born, comprised of cars that really did race at Indy, they could not be called "Indy cars." That name was leased to CART, which the IRL booted out of Indy. Thus cars that did not race at Indy were legally defined as Indy cars, while the cars that did race at Indy were not allowed to be called Indy cars. Now, that's odd!
After a bitter legal battle, CART gave up the "Indy car" name while the IRL agreed not to use it for six years. As a result, from 1997-2002, there were no Indy Cars, no matter where they raced. Then the IRL restored that name to the cars that actually race at Indy.
CART, meanwhile, had to come up with a new name and chose "Champ Car," evocative of machines that had no connection to CART but a glorious history with USAC, the organization CART effectively kicked out of the IndyCar business before there was any question whether or not Indy cars raced at Indy.
And up north, none of that prevented Molson, suddenly the promoter of a "champ car" race, from perpetuating the name "Molson Indy"
.. until last weekend, when the race became known as the Molson Grand Prix of Toronto. Why? Because Molson, though still the sponsor, sold the promotion to the owners of "The Champ Car World Series," who promptly removed "Indy" from the title.
Bear in mind, these are the same guys who are now trying to make peace with the IRL and create a single series, one I'll bet my A.J. Foyt collectibles will be called "Indy Car" something-or-other and will feature cars that actually race at Indy.
Thus, the final oddity will come if, after all those years hosting an IndyCar race with no Indy cars, Toronto actually does have an IndyCar race ... and doesn't call it that.

When Davey Hamilton, want ing to put a two-car team on the track, paired Galedrige with Murgoitio, he probably wasn't taking that big a leap of faith. Galedrige had come from the Ford Focus Midgets, where he had been California North champion in 2004 and second in the South series that same year. That was also the year the Belleville Nationals in Kansas cut its annual midget show from three days to two to give the third night to the Focus cars. Galedrige won that inaugural Belleville Focus race.

Economaki Tells Racing's Tale With Laughter-In 'Go!'

Disclaimer: Without a hint of embarrassment, $I$ admit to having been a fan of Chris Economaki for my entire 30-year professional career as a motor sports journalist. As he slowed down with age, I begged Chris to let me write this book with him, but he chose Dave Argabright instead. It was a good choice. Nobody could have done it better.

 BerggrenChris Economaki's long-awaited "Let 'Em All Go!" is the most important book in the history of auto racing. There between two covers you can learn the history of the sport from the 1930s to today, all told with flair, drama and color by a man who saw the whole thing unfold firsthand.
Add snippets from the life of one of the most fascinating non-driver racing characters and you have an unbeatable package.
It is this incredible (a word Chris uses freely as he tells stories in the book) combination that leads to the conclusion that "Go!" is racing's most important book.
There are two versions of the book - regular and high test. The regular version is priced at $\$ 30$. I bought the high-test version that is now nearly sold out. With a black cover, a built-in gold-colored silk page marker and sized like a bible, it looks like a bible. In a way it is a bible - the gospel of racing according to Economaki!
"Go!" is an odd mixture of interesting elements of Chris's life, anecdotes and observations. It's done in short spurts so you can read half a page, spend a weekend at the track and come back to the book without missing anything.
Economaki is the dean of motorsports journalism. His enthusiasm for the sport pours out of every page. Even when Chris fingers the sport for its misdeeds, it seems he's more a parent scolding a child than someone kicking the sport in the ass.
As you travel through the book, you'll meet dozens of drivers and racing VIPs who Chris identifies as "friends." Eventually, it seems as if most everyone who ever was important during his lifetime in the sport is considered by Chris to be a friend. So, this book isn't just about racing, it's about the hundreds of friends a sport's major player has developed during a lifetime of traveling to races.
Since you're reading this review in National Speed Sport News, you no doubt read Chris's column. The origin of the column, and why for all these years it's been written in the style you read every week, are


## Want One?

There are two downsides to "Go!" First, you might embarrass yourself with it. I embarrassed myself reading it on a cross-country flight when I laughed out loud over the story of an early ABC-TV interview Chris did with A.J. Foyt. Chris is a funny guy, so there are some laughs. Be sure to read it someplace where losing control of your laugh muscle is acceptable. The other downside is that every page you turn is a page you can't ever read again for the first time. Most good books prompt a rush to the last page. Not this one. Once you start it, "Go!" is so good you'll wish it would never end.
As the book nears its end, Chris explains clearly why NASCAR has been such a rousing success while others haven't done nearly as well. He uses the sport's history to explain its present and to establish the directions in which it should go. It is fitting that the book leaves the reader thinking about what might be.
There is no other place where pictures of the colorful characters who populate the sport are as clearly painted. In "Go!" you'll learn not only about the finest racing journalist to ever live, you'll learn about people he calls his friends - the greatest racers the world has ever known.

Montoya has a large legion of fans from Colombia who follow him to many F-1 races.
"Juan Pablo Montoya's entry into NASCAR is historic," said NASCAR President Mike Helton. "It encompasses all the things that are important to NASCAR, the things that we've worked very hard to establish. Juan Pablo is someone who touches not only the Hispanic fan base, but also (he is) a driver with an international following.
"NASCAR has had success with drivers from other backgrounds who have come to NASCAR and done well, but to have Juan Pablo say "I want to compete here' is historic."
Montoya's first experience behind the wheel of a Cup car came at Indianapolis in June 2003, when he let four-time Cup champion Jeff Gordon
"Matt's a hard-nosed driver," he said, "and there'll be retribution for that, I'm sure."
Gordon was understandably jubilant about his victory.
"It feels so darn good to get a victory on a mile and a half at a place like this," Gordon said. "From start to finish, it was just a great day for us."
From the start, it appeared that Burton would run off and hide from the field. Burton's No. 31 Chevrolet started from the pole and led the first 59 laps but faded after the first round of pit stops.
"We were too tight in the middle (of the turn) and too loose on exit," Burton said. "We tried to fix both of them, and it made the car exception-
ally loose. We never quite had it where we needed it. We were close, but not right there. In today's game, you have to be all the way there."
Battling an ignition problem that prevented him from restarting strongly, Burton was able to climb back into the battle for the lead late in the race.
"Once we got going, unless (Gordon) had a problem, I didn't think we had anything for him," Burton said. "He was running (Kenseth) down, and he had the fastest car at that point. He was just better than we were."
Kyle Busch quietly placed third.
"We got it adjusted there at the end so we could make some movement and pass some guys," Busch said.
drive his spare Williams BMW Montoya drove Gordon's Chevrolet Monte Carlo around the Indianapolis Motor Speedway road course.
"You could push the car. You could slide the car, and it was really friendly to me on the road course," Montoya said. "That was really exciting to me." Montoya has been unhappy in F-1 for the past several seasons because of the politics. The European press has even taken to calling the somewhat pudgy Montoya "The Hamburglar" after the McDonald's character because of the driver's love of eating at McDonald's in every country he visits.
"I don't think you're going to be happy getting more money and being miserable all day," Montoya admitted. "When I called Chip I said, ‘Chip you know what. I want to come back racing, and I think the best place to do racing is here."
Montoya will finish the Formula One season before getting into a stock car but may attempt to compete in a few races at the end of this season.
"When people think of moving from Formula One to NASCAR, some peo-
ple think I'm crazy, but I think it's exciting," Montoya said. "I think it's a great challenge for my career. Coming here is probably going to be my toughest challenge ever. You have 36 races and race against really great guys, and I think sometimes people don't know how tough it is out here and how many great drivers are out here." Montoya and Ganassi admitted the driver is taking a pay cut to leave F-1 for NASCAR, but he may be able to gain in other areas, including souvenir sales and international TV.
"He told me what he wanted to make, and what did I say?" Ganassi asked Montoya.
"That's what you get," Montoya responded. "It was that simple. I said, 'This is what I'm looking for.' And Chip said, 'OK.' It took us an hour to close everything. It was that simple. I'm straight with him, and he's straight with me, and things just work out great. That's what I'm here for.
"I want to come back racing. How close the racing is here and how exciting it is and how the fans like it ... it's hard to turn it down."

Juan Pablo Brings Diversity, Opens New Doors

In NASCAR's drive to diversity, it's not uncommon to think in terms of developmental driver programs and unfamiliar names and faces.
Not Chip Ganassi
He just answers the phone.
That's how Juan Pablo Montoya wound up replacing Casey Mears in the Texaco Havoline Dodge in 2007.
"Juan called me and asked if I was looking for a driver," Ganassi said in announcing the deal. "I told him I was, and he said he wanted to drive it. I made sure he knew it was the 42."

But it wasn't diversity that brought the two together. It was recognition on Ganassi's part that he might just have pulled off the steal of the centu ry in the driver market.
"We've had a lot of fun together," Ganassi said.
That fun included winning the 2000 Indianapolis 500 and a pair of CART championships.
"The driver market in this formula is tight, and I was looking outside the box a little," Ganassi admitted.
"Juan told me he just wanted to get back to racing."
Montoya had some opportunities with other F-1 teams, but it wasn't what he wanted to do.
"I don't think being unhappy and making a lot of money is what I wanted to do," he said. "I had to ask myself whether, three years down the line, would I be any happier."
Apparently, money was not that much of an issue in the negotiations between Ganassi and Montoya.
"I told him the number I was looking for," Montoya said, "and he said 'that's fine."
It was evident in the Sunday morning press conference at Chicagoland Speedway that Montoya, who has spent the past six seasons in Formula One, was disenchanted with the series and was looking for some competition. Despite winning seven F-1 races in six seasons, Montoya failed to achieve top-level status, and his contract with McLaren was not renewed.

"A lot of people I've talked to think I'm crazy," Montoya said, "but I think it's great. It's 36 race,s and I get to race against some really great guys. If it wasn't racing, I wouldn't be coming here."
Ganassi doesn't see that much of a problem in getting his new driver up to speed in time for the 2007 Daytona 500.
"I've seen him adapt to a car and a track like no other driver I've ever seen," Ganassi said. "It won't be a walk in the park, though. It will be a lot of work over the winter."
The plan is to run Montoya in both the Nextel Cup and Busch programs, with the possibility of a Busch race or two at the conclusion of the F-1 season in late October.
Montoya said it was more than simply wanting out of F-1 that led him to seek a return to Ganassi.
"If I had just wanted to get out of F1, I would have called Chip about his IRL team," Montoya said. "I just wanted to race.
"You know how hard it is to pass in Formula One. When you try to pass a car and touch wheels, you're an animal . I wanted something else.
That something else might not be what Montoya had hoped for. Temper tantrums and angry words are not uncommon in NASCAR, and it is likely that Montoya's credentials, while impressive, might not cut him much slack until he can prove himself in traffic.
Montoya will be the first F-1 driver in its 58 -year history to compete as a regular in NASCAR next season.
There is no doubt, however, that it will be a boost to NASCAR's diversity efforts, and it could open up a new market for them. Colombians are rabid in their support of homegrown race-car drivers, but it isn't likely that there will be very many of them in the grandstands at NASCAR venues next year.
Unless Juan Pablo Montoya starts winning Nextel Cup races.

A superior pit stop got Allmendinger, who started on the outside of the front row, ahead of his former teammate at RuSPORT Racing. But they all ran behind Nelson Philippe, Oriol Servia and Bruno Junqueira, who elected to run alternate fuel strategies.
Allmendinger passed Junqueira and Servia, and he regained the lead when Philippe pitted for fuel on the 35th lap. Philippe led another 10 laps later in the race, but he and Servia collided on the 77th lap to bring out the day's final yellow. Ironically, getting that caution was probably the only way the six drivers running

## A.J. Deals With Stardom Woes

New Management Team Causes Problems With Contract Talks

CHAMPthe Champ Car circuit, but he's also acquired the attitude and entourage of a star as well.

NOTES
That almost caused some embarrassment last week for the brash 24 -year-old Californian, because some hardball tactics by his new management agency (CSS Stellar) almost prompted no-nonsense team-owner Gerald Forsythe to bench Allmendinger for the Grand Prix of Toronto. An agreement for the rest of the season was not reached until Thursday evening.
When Allmendinger was picked up by Forsythe Championship Racing after he was fired by RuSPORT Racing June 9, it was a two-race deal only. A.J. gave himself maximum bargaining power by winning his first two starts for Forsythe, but he was reportedly unwilling to sign a multi-year deal with the team.
"We offered A.J. a multi-year package, but it was not agreed," Forsythe said. "He will be with us for the rest of the season, and I hope he wants to stay in Champ Cars. He's a good fit with our team, and I'm hopeful we will remain together"
CSS Stellar founder Julian Jakobi and American representative Adrian Sussman prefer to sign their clients, which include Dario Franchitti and Dan Wheldon in the United States, to a series of one-year deals. Jakobi became known as one of the sport's toughest negotiators in 1993 when he convinced McLaren F-1 team boss Ron Dennis to pay Ayrton Senna \$1 million a race.
Allmendinger brushed off questions about his new representation during the Friday press conference at Toronto, but he later discussed his motives with reporters.
"I got to know Adrian about four years ago, but Carl Russo was not a big fan of agents, so I didn't sign with him," Allmendinger explained. "Even before all the RuSPORT stuff happened, I was talking to Adrian about doing this. I felt like the time had come in my life to focus more on racing and let somebody else figure out the fun stuff like contracts that nobody wants to deal with.'

Attendance appeared to be down very slightly, and for the first time in race history, attendance figures were not released. The best crowd in the event's history came in 2001, with 73,628 on race day and 169,023 for the three-day weekend.
"The empty seats in the grandstands point to a drop in attendance from 2005, when about 160,000 took in the three-day event," wrote Jeff Pappone in the Toronto Globe \& Mail.

Merger Could Provide Fans Comparision Of Car Types

## TORONTO

Funny how the two open-wheel camps responded to that famous front page Indianapolis Star merger story from a couple of weeks ago: Folks on the Champ Car side basically ignored it, while Indy Racing League reps denied it. One aspect of the piece that reportedly riled the gang at 16th and Georgetown was the idea of Champ Car and IRL sharing selected race weekends. At St. Pete, for example, the Champ Cars might run on Saturday and the IRL Indy Cars Sunday. On a "Champ Car" weekend like Long Beach or Toronto, the perceived headliners would be switched. And, of course, everyone would reserve the month of May for Indy At Toronto, the topic of unification or merger never really came up, and it's obviously too late for there to be a single series in 2007. But the more I thought about the notion of a few shared weekends next year, the more I liked the idea. And not just because it might get me a few more weekends at home with my newborn son. Here's one reason why: If you assume that each group has a separate fan base, bringing them together on the same weekend would make for some happy promoters.
But the main attraction would be giving those fans the chance to observe the two types of cars in action on the same track in relatively similar conditions to provide them a voice in determining the American open-wheel formula for the future
My feelings on this matter are well known. We'll have to wait until the end of the month to see the prototype 2007 Panoz Champ Car, but I know that I vastly prefer the styling of the most recent Lolas or Reynards to the equivalent IRL - Dallaras and Panozes.
More importantly, I think if people were able to directly compare the way the two types of cars sound, they would be strongly in favor of the turbocharged Champ Car engine package. I'd estimate the turbo engines are 30 -percent quieter than normally aspirated IRL engines, and

they operate at a more harmonically pleasing sound frequency.
I suspect even Honda's Robert
Clarke would prefer returning to a more technically advanced turbo formula, even if it meant writing off some of the millions his company has invested in the normally aspirat ed engine it supplies to the full IRL field.
Imagine having a year to collect data to be able to accurately analyze the differences in lap times, running costs and other performance categories between the two series. And if Champ Car teams were invited to run at Indianapolis or other oval IRL tracks, the crashworthiness of the '07 Panoz chassis would be put to the ultimate test.

It would also provide chances for Champ Car and IRL race officials to work together in the same conditions and prepare for an eventual joining of forces.
The former Champ Car drivers who make up more than half the IndyCar Series grid are always claiming that their IRL cars are almost as fast as the machines they used to drive.
Here's an opportunity to find out and begin to restore the faith of open-wheel racing's patient fan base.

PEVELY, Mo. - Once in a while a good luck charm is needed to turn the fortunes around for a driver or team. Brooke Tatnell had already won two races this season, but he knew he easily could have had a half dozen or more victories if luck was on his side.

## Fumes fuel Casey Mears <br> Cup starts without winning.

JOLIET, Ill. - Casey Mears made his first victory in NASCAR's Busch Series an exciting one.
Gambling on fuel, Mears ran his Texaco Havoline Dodge 70 laps on his last full tank, held off runner-up Carl Edwards to win the USG Durock 300 at Chicagoland Speedway and then ran out of fuel before he could get to victory lane
"It's unbelievable. It doesn't seem real," Mears said after climbing out of his car in the grassy area in turn one to celebrate with his crew instead of doing the obligatory burnout.
It was a hard-earned victory for Mears, who was followed to the checkered flag by 15 Nextel Cup regulars in a field that saw 21 "Busch whackers" start.
"It means everything to get a win," Mears explained. "I'm really relieved. I've been in position to win, with cars that could have won, but we never came home with it."
In the final laps, Mears said he moved the car to the top of the race track to conserve both fuel and tires.
"We were really banking on another caution," he said. "With three or four laps to go, the car started getting tight."
The victory extended the Chicagoland tradition of creating first-time NASCAR winners. In the track's brief history, it has been the scene of maiden victories by Jimmie Johnson, Justin Labonte and Johnny Sauter. It came in Mears's 69th Busch
start. He has also made 126 Nextel

Mears beat Edwards to the finish by 0.525 second in a race that could have seen the top two spots reversed but for a failed gamble by Edwards, who took the blame for his second-place finish Edwards admitted that he vetoed crew chief Pierre Kuettel's call to pit dur ing a late caution period on lap 130 . "He told me to stop and I didn't," Edwards said. "I decided to do what Kurt [Busch] did, and we both stayed out. I didn't realize that Kurt had one less set of tires in the pits than I did. It wasn't the first time I didn't take my crew chief's advice, but it may be the last time.
Mears pitted, however, on lap 130 and was able to stretch that 22 gallons to the end.
Crew chief Brad Parrott credited the crew for the victory. They got Mears back on the track ahead of Burton on the final stop.
"That's what gave us the win," Parrott said.
For much of the race, it was a battle between Edwards and Kurt Busch, who combined to lead 132 of the first 153 laps before Mears took the lead for the final 47 laps.
Burton was second after the final pit stop, but he faded slightly in the final laps to a third-place finish. Point leader Kevin Harvick finished fourth. Nine caution periods for 33 laps lowered Mears's winning speed to 125.421 miles per hour. Edwards won the pole in the Henkel Duck Tape/Henkel Ford at 176.528 mph . Dave Blaney was also on the front row.

## Pierce's Patience Pays Off

JOLIET, Ill. - Patience paid off for Aaron Pierce Friday at Chicagoland Speedway in the
SILVER CROWN form of his first USAC Silver Crown victory.
"It's been a long time in coming," the 32 -year-old Muncie, Ind., native said of his triumph. "I've been running Silver Crown for four or five years now, and it's good to finally win one." Pierce, who led 26 of the 67 laps, took the lead for good when leader Jay Drake lost an engine eight laps from the finish.
"I was just trying to save my tires, Pierce said of his pursuit of Drake, who led 41 laps. "He was sliding around a lot, but that's the name of the game with these cars and has been forever. You have to save your tires and drive the car as straight as you can."
Pierce said he thought he was catching Drake in the final quarter of the race.
"He got away from me a little, but I started catching him there at the end," Pierce explained
I picked up the pace a little, made a couple in-car adjustments, and that helped a lot. I had a lot left in the car at the end. I think I would have caught him anyway."
Pierce cut a three-second lead by Drake to a matter of a few car lengths before Drake's engine let go.
With Pierce again in command, Canadian rookie Peter Shepherd moved up to second and was convinced he had a shot at catching Pierce. "I think one more caution flag and I would have had a chance," said Shepherd, whose runner-up finish was the best ever for a Canadian driver in the series and the best finish for his Carl Edwards-owned car on pavement.
The victory ended a string of threestraight finishes of 10th or lower for Pierce, who was fourth and second in the year's first two events.
Bud Kaeding, who had won the last two Silver Crown races, maintained a six-point lead over Brian Tyler, despite dropping out of the event.
Rookie Bryn Gohn was third, followed by two-time Silver Crown champion Dave Steele and Tyler.

## Hornaday Wins Under The Lights

SPARTA, Ky. - With the season's second victory squarely in the cross hairs, Ron Hornaday was up on the wheel and digging
And Mike Skinner couldn't do anything either to derail his longtime rival's charge or keep his Toyota Tundra off Kentucky Speedway’s outside wall.
Lap 129 turned out to be the pivotal moment in Saturday night's Built Ford Tough 225 following the race's sixth caution that had interrupted green-flag pit stops. Skinner a few laps earlier had inherited the lead from Johnny Benson, one of three drivers who were yet to pit for service before caution appeared.
But when Benson, Brendan Gaughan and Erik Darnell hit pit road, their stops allowed eight drivers to rejoin the tail of the lead lap and take the green flag ahead of Skinner. Caught in a maelstrom of side-by-side racing, Skinner found himself boxed in the middle lane off the 1.5 -mile speedway's second turn.
Hornaday raced past on the inside and disturbed Skinner's aero package enough to send the Toyota up the track and into defending race winner Dennis Setzer.
The rest of the field missed Skinner's No. 5, which did a half-spin before nosing into the wall and out of the race.
Hornaday led the rest of the way, his Kevin Harvick Inc. Chevrolet besting Rick Crawford, Gaughan, Benson and David Ragan in an eightlap shootout. The 48-year-old Californian won for the second time in 2006 and for a record-extending 29th time in the NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series.
He edged Crawford's Circle Bar Truck Corral Ford by . 586 second about five lengths - to complete the

150-lap, 225-mile distance at an aver age speed of 118.110 miles per hour. Hornaday banked $\$ 84,875$ for the unsponsored KHI entry
"It was really good around other trucks and would really dig and cut," Hornaday said. "We've been working real hard, and we did everything we could to the front of the truck. The thing was (in practice) I couldn't believe how tight it was, and we were
floating the nose.
"But once we started running, that Silverado truck was bad tonight."
Hornaday led three times for 47 laps including the last 22 trips. The triumph was his 10th on a track of a mile or more in length and first superspeedway victory since Atlanta in March 2005.
Todd Bodine leads Benson by 112 points in the standings.

# Bridgestone Named Official Tire Supplier 

By Dan Knutson NSSN CORrESPONDENT

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. Surprise, surprise, the FIA has selected Bridgestone as the official Formula One tire sup-

 plier for 2008 NOTES through 2010. It was not made public if anyother companies entered a bid, but there was little doubt that Bridgestone's bid would win. Michelin said it had no interest in the lack of competition with the single supplier concept and will pull out at the end of this season, so Bridgestone (which entered F1 in 1997) will be the sole tire company in 2007 as well. On one hand, a single tire supplier eliminates some much-needed unpredictability in the outcome of F-1 races, but by the same token it creates a level playing field.
More importantly, this will vastly reduce testing costs as the teams spend more than 50 percent of their testing work on tires, plus the number of tires allowed for testing will be limited. And it will reduce cornering speeds, as there will be no tire war to push development.
Teams will no longer be able to choose two individual specification dry weather compounds for a race weekend because Bridgestone will provide the same two options to all the teams. In the past, when there has been a single supplier, the smaller teams have sometimes complained that because the big teams developed the tires they suited their cars better.

■ Teams will no longer be allowed to run third cars during Fridays of Grand Prix weekends in 2007. Currently, teams that finished fifth or lower in the previous year's championship are permitted to use a third car and driver in the two Friday practice sessions. This was meant to give
the smaller teams an opportunity to make money by renting out the third car, but there have been complaints that bigger teams such as Honda and Williams get an unfair advantage because they can test with a third car on Friday.
The proposals needed to be ratified by a fax vote from the FIA's World Motor Sports Council, but that was just a formality.
One theory is that eliminating third cars will force the teams's regular drivers to get out on the track more on Fridays, but the current topfour teams still severely limit their running on the first day to conserve their engines. While not officially proposed yet, it's thought that the FIA
will turn Friday into a test day which would mean fans would get to see lots more on-track action than they do now.

■ Mark Webber is still waiting for Frank Williams to take up his option for 2007. There is little doubt that Williams will retain Webber and Nico Rosberg, so why put off making an announcement?
"I think that Nico and I have done quite well," Webber said, "but it's Frank's decision if he sees that there is a future for me with the team, or how financially it would work for the team for me to stay here."

■ While Scuderia Toro Rosso hasn't revealed its driver lineup for 2007, Scott Speed and Tonio Liuzzi will almost certainly remain, as Gerhard Berger says he wants consistency in the team.

■ NSSN hears that the FIA has told BMW to modify its rear wing, which some teams claimed was still flexing, prior to the French Grand Prix.
