ARE WE THANKFUL?

As Muslims, it is our foremost duty to do Shukr to Allah. We can read the word Shukr many times in Quran, which means the consideration of the favor and its acknowledgment. Ash-Shakur is one of Allah's beautiful names which mean according to imam Al Ghazali: "the one who expresses thankfulness by rewarding bounteously". Shukr could also be the quality of human beings which means the recognition and the appreciation of the favor. Shukr is used in the Qur'an sometimes as equivalent to faith. The faithful are thankful people and the unfaithful are ungrateful people. Allah has described His prophets and messengers among those who were thankful people. Prophet Noah was a grateful servant of Allah: "Verily, he was a grateful slave" (Al-Israa' 17:3). Prophet Abraham used to thank Allah for His many blessings: "He was thankful for Allâh's Favors" (Al-Nahl 16:121). Prophet David and his family were told to be grateful to Allah: ""Work you, O family of Dâwud (David), with thanks!" But few of My slaves are grateful" (Saba' 34:13). Allah told His Prophet Muhammad: (Nay, but worship Allah, and be of those who give thanks) (Az-Zumar 39:66). Allah also promised: "And swiftly shall We reward those that who are thankful" (Aal 'Imran 3:145).

Thanksgiving in Islam, is not an act or service; it is the whole life. The first thing we say ones we wake up in the morning is "Praise be to Allah Who has brought us back to life after causing us to die, and unto Him is the resurrection)." (Al-Bukhaari). The last thing we say before we go to bed is: "All praise is for Allah, Who fed us and gave us to drink, and Who is sufficient for us and has sheltered us, for how many have none to suffice them or shelter them." (Muslim).

Whenever we put on any new garment, we say, "O Allah, thanks be to You; You gave us this to wear. We ask You to give us the good of this dress and the good for which it is made and we ask You to protect us from the evil of this dress and from the evil of that for which it is made" (At-Tirmidhi). Our daily Prayers, our fasting during Ramadan, our zakah and Hajj are all our acts of thanksgiving. We should remember that we all are constantly under Allah's favors and blessings. Allah has promised that He will increase the blessings that have already been given to us, only if we are thankful to him: "And remember when your Lord proclaimed, if you are grateful, I will add more (favors) unto you; but if ye show ingratitude, truly My torment is terrible indeed." (Ibrahim 14:7)

Ibn al-Qayyim said in Madarij al-Salikeen: "Gratitude is based on five foundations: Humility of the thankful one towards the One Who is thanked, his love for Him, his acknowledgement of His blessing, his praise of Him for that and not using it for anything that He hates. These five are the foundations of gratitude which is built on them. If one of them is missing, then one of the foundations of gratitude is missing."

We should also thank our parents, our spouses, our brothers and sisters, our neighbors....etc.

Our beloved prophet Muhammad (pbuh) said: "Those who do not thank people, they do not thank Allah" (At-Tirmidhi).









The Mecca Center recently participated in DuPage United's Fall Assembly: Solidarity in Action - Treatment, Not Incarceration on November 17 at the Islamic Center of Naperville. As part of the continuing DuPage United "We the People" Solidarity Campaign, the over 600-person strong assembly pressed for expanded mental health resources for law enforcement and families.

The event recognized law enforcement officials for their leadership in expanding Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) efforts while providing updates on funding for and the construction of crisis diversion centers in partnership with local businesses, hospitals and health agencies to serve as cost efficient, life-saving alternatives to incarceration. Organizers of the event also announced a new refugee organizing strategy with the entire group recommitting themselves to solidarity.

The diverse group of DuPage County residents also expressed a commitment to each other, or rather a pledge, to stand, act and protect each other. They firmly stood against hate towards minorities and Muslims and promised to act promptly when and if an incident occurs.

Without collective power, exercised democratically and non-partisanly, we cannot protect the life and liberties of all our families. The Mecca Center and the leaders of DuPage United urge you to attend these important events and act now to ensure all DuPage families are heard, seen and protected. The more people that can be there to make moments like these happen, the more powerful our collective voices can be.

The banquet hall in the basement is nearly complete with carpets, lights and columns coming from Egypt and monitors to be installed.


The kitchen is nearly complete and all equipment is being tested and commissioned.

All bathrooms are complete with only fixtures needing to be installed.


The gym's wood flooring is being installed and still needs to be grinded, polished and stained and gym equipment is being delivered.
