

Treat the other Members of the Community with Respect

Your use of Minecraft is controlled by the Microsoft Services Agreement ("MSA"). The Code of Conduct section of Microsoft Services Agreement applies to all Microsoft products in addition to the **Xbox Community Standards** . **However**, as Minecraft continues to expand and adds new Minecraft games to its catalog, the Minecraft franchise is introducing new features, like new ways to interact, that could benefit from more explanation. To achieve this we've developed the following Community Standards for the Minecraft franchise. These standards are a guideline to the way the Minecraft community should interact with each other and with the game to ensure our community a safe fun, safe, and safe place for everyone.

We want to ensure that players enjoy the same, welcoming and inclusive experience when playing any of our games under the Minecraft franchise. We also want to ensure that if players choose to not follow the Community Standards in one of the Minecraft franchise games, we can ensure that players are protected across the franchise and within our community.

Community Standards

These useful Community Standards cover gameplay with Mojang-provided online service. This includes features such as Featured Servers for Bedrock Engine platforms and Realms. These policies may not apply to specific games or websites. Make sure you check them out.

o Treat other community members with respect. This is at the heart of everything we consider. If you are going to express your opinions Please do so in a respectful manner and respectfully.

Be aware of the experiences of others when you use chat functions in games or on websites. Avoid spamming or excessive posting. All-caps words can be interpreted as yelling. And yelling at someone is not always a good idea.

Our friendly moderators are available to help you if you have a dispute with another player or have an unpleasant encounter. [ayakanihei](#) Contact them or report the player using the tools within the game. Whatever the case don't "name and shame" any other members of your community publicly. This is considered harassment.

Be cautious about the information you share publicly. Don't share personal information (phone numbers emails, passwords, email addresses accounts, account information physical addresses first and last names, etc.) about yourself or other people.

You are not allowed to promote any manner of illegal activity.

Encourage positive and encouraging conversations, not demeaning and insulting. It should go without saying that you should never create content or posts for the aim to start a war or to elicit a negative response.

Minecraft has an absolute no-tolerance policy against discrimination against others, bullying or the harassment of others.

Don't share your account information. We won't ask for your password and you should not divulge it to anyone.

o Modding in Minecraft is only permitted in the core Minecraft game under the existing EULA.

All activities are subject to Mojang/Minecraft's EULA and Terms and Conditions.

How do I submit a case study

Any player who meets the following criteria may submit a case review:

It is a law enforcement activity. The duration of the enforcement is more than 24 hours in length. - The enforcement was issued within the last 12 months.
