








AVERAGE DIFFICULTY

"Each section in this graph represents approximately one quarter of the questions in order of presentation."









PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS




PERCENT CORRECT




Each section in this graph represents approximately one quarter of the questions in order of presentation.
