WITH JOHN ROBERTSON

INVERNESS WIN 4-2 ON PENS

TUNNOCKS CARAMEL WAFER CUP

**Inverness Caledonian Thistle progressed to the Semi-Finals of the Tunnock's Caramel Wafer Cup as they beat Clyde 4-2 on penalty kicks, after the match finished 0-0 in normal time.**

Mark Ridgers was the shootout hero as he saved spot kicks from Tony Wallace and Chris McStay, while Caley Thistle dispatched four perfect penalties from Nikolay Todorov, Coll Donaldson, Carl Tremarco and James Keatings.

With John Robertson and Scott Kellacher missing due to illness, Barry Wilson, Ryan Esson and, ICTFC Academy Director, Charlie Christie were in the dugout for the Caley Jags.

Jordan White came closest for the Caley Jags after 18 minutes as he met Miles Storey's cross in the middle but his diving header was inches wide.

Clyde had a chance of their own after 34 minutes, Lyon played in Smith but his effort was saved by Ridgers.

Just before the break, Aaron Doran forced a save from Mitchell at his near post.

In the second-half, Charlie Trafford went close after the break but his flicked effort was over.

Wallace went close for Clyde after 61 minutes but his effort at the back-post was wide after he met Grant's long throw.

James Keatings couldn't fully connect with Miles Storey's cross in the middle of the box as Mitchell gathered the ball.

Mark Ridgers then produced a fine save to deny Chris McStay from around 25 yards

There was chances in stoppage time, Miles Storey saw his effort saved by the legs of Mitchell after he was played in by James Keatings.

Nikolay Todorov then saw a header held by Mitchell in the final minute of the match.

The match then went to a penalty shootout and Todorov, Tremarco, Donaldson and Keatings converted for the Caley Jags. Grant and McMullin scored for Clyde but Ridgers saved efforts from Wallace and McStay.

The Caley Jags will now face Rangers Colts in the Semi-Final and the match will take place on Sunday 16th February at 4.10pm at the Caledonian Stadium. Ticket info TBC.

## **4-4-2 Project Visits**

This week we visit Crown Primary School to promote our 4-4-2 reading project. We have a whole morning of sessions planned to show how reading can improve lives. Reading and writing are the most important factors in reducing the attainment gap, improve mental health issues such as anxiety, depression and dementia, and influence people's work, relationships and the economy. The ICT Community Development Trust is working in partnership with 14 SPFL clubs and local libraries, to deliver the 4-4-2 Reading Challenge which aims to inspire children aged 5-12 to read four books in exchange for match tickets. The initiative centres on a reading "challenge card" which participating clubs and libraries will issue. For every book read, children will receive a stamp on their card. When they have read four books, participants will receive a FREE match ticket for a home league match at the Caledonian Stadium, while an accompanying adult will be able to purchase a discounted ticket. This will be running through till the end of the season and kids can do this as many times as they want. So get down to the library to get started!

**Carl Tremarco wants Caley Thistle to get back on track this afternoon against Dundee as the club look to return to winning ways in the league.**

Dundee and Caley Thistle have faced off twice this campaign already with both matches being very tight but Dundee travel North for the first time this season and Tremarco hopes home advantage can play its part.

The Caley Thistle Captain said: “We started off really well at home, we started making it a horrible place for visiting teams to come.”

“Every team will have a blip, hopefully ours is over and we don’t have any more because we can’t have much more if we have ambitions of getting out of the league. Everything is focused on today’s game to get three points and get the ball rolling.”

“We’ve played them twice but both were away, maybe they’ll approach the game differently coming up here, I’m not too sure.”

He added: “I know the way we approached the two away games will be no different to the way we treat this one. We look to try and win every game, other teams may have a different approach.

I’ve said numerous times if we play to the way we can, which we haven’t of late, we’ll cause sides problems and we’ll be really hard to beat.”

Caley Thistle qualified for the Tunnock’s Caramel Wafer Cup Semi-Final against Clyde last week, Tremarco thought the Caley Jags played well in the first-half but the game became scrappy in the second.

Tremarco said: “I thought the first-half against Clyde we were ok, I think we created a couple of half chances, we had a lot of the ball and should have really punished them.”

“The second-half was a bit more scrappy, in the end it was relieving to get through, it is a cup competition and you like to get to the next round and we have a semi-final to look forward too.”

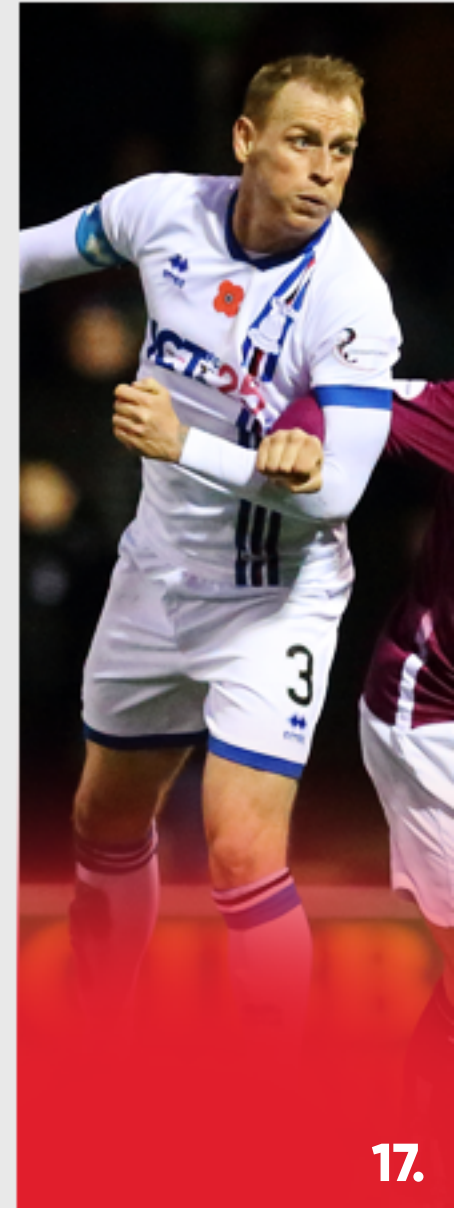
“The semi-final is miles away, so we’re just going to focus on the league.”

Caley Thistle have failed to find the back of the net in their last three matches during the 90 minutes, Tremarco thinks building from the back will be the basis to get back on track

The Captain said: “It’s unfortunate, but normal when that is the case then we usually keep the back door closed but we haven’t at late.”

“We got a clean sheet against Clyde but, no disrespect to Clyde, we should be keeping clean sheets and probably scoring goals against them. The clean sheet is something to build on, the platform needs to be starting to tightening it up at the back and the chances will come.”

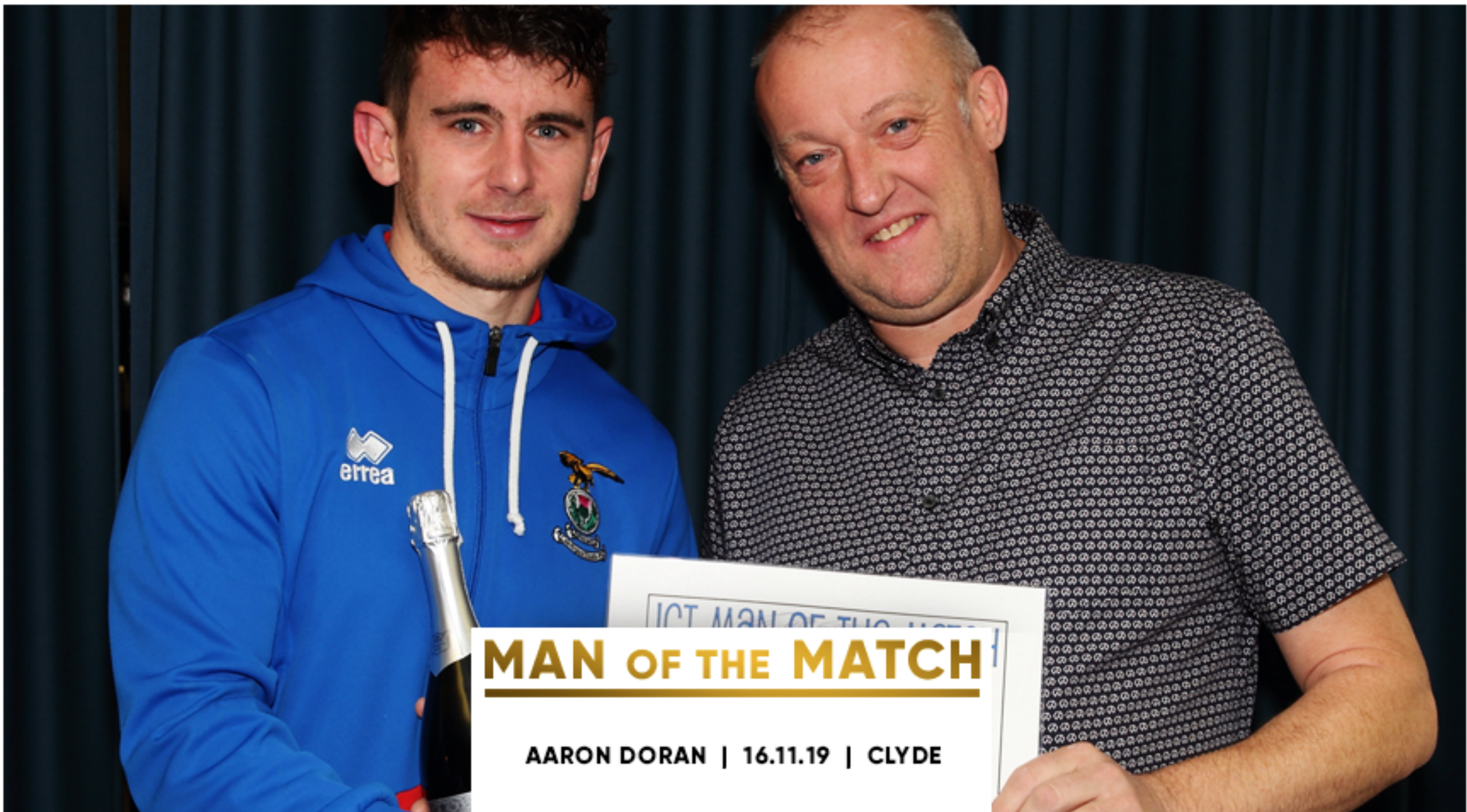

# ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

**Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.**

**Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.**

**Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.**

**Disorderly conduct includes:**

**Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:**

- **Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.**
- **Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.**
- **Sexual orientation**
- **Transgender Identity**
- **Disability**
- **Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group**
- **Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct**
- **Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting**
- **Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000**

**All persons entering The Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.**

**Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible criminal proceedings, ejection from the stadium, withdrawal of a season ticket and/or exclusion from future matches at the club.**
