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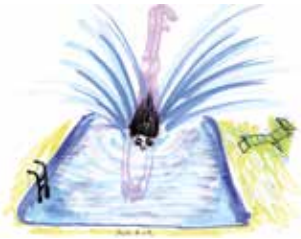

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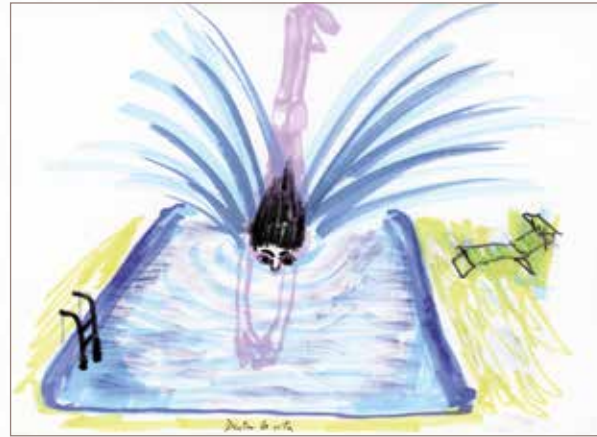

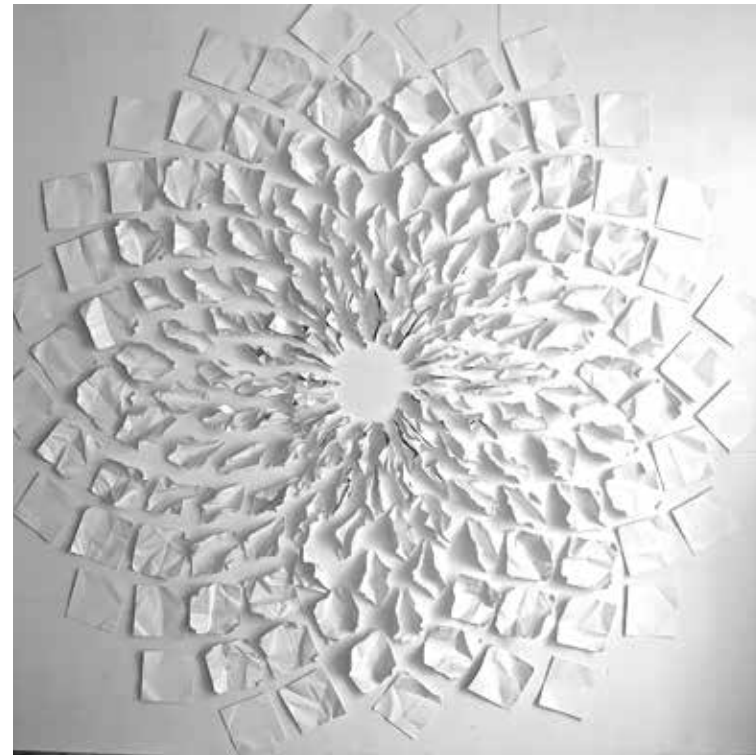

Cilento, a magical and enchanted land

Golden beached, crystal-clear water and many typical products

A land rich in history, artistic and natural beauties, Cilento hosts important **archaeological sites** such as **Paestum** and **Velia**, natural reserves such as **Punta Licosa**, national parks such as the **National Park of Cilento and Vallo di Diano**, fascinating medieval villages such as **Castellabate**, and many magical places, like **Palinuro**, the land of mermaids.

Above all, however, Cilento is known for its partly wild coast with golden beaches, coves and cliffs that each year are awarded dozens of "Blue Banners" by FEE. At 2 km from **Marina di Camerota**, you will find the magnificent **Cala d'Arconte**, with fine, golden sand, nestled between rocky cliffs covered with maritime pines and secular olive trees.

MEDITERRANEAN DIET AND TYPICAL PRODUCTS

Pioppi is the home of Mediterranean Diet, discovered in 1945 by the American doctor Ancel Keys, a clean, healthy cuisine, based on fruit, vegetables, legumes, fish, pasta and extra virgin olive oil. Cilento cuisine, tasty and healthy, features many typical products that deserve a taste. The Gioi "soppressata", for example, the fine and lean part of the pork seasoned with fennel and spicy chili; the white fig, the light and wrinkled yellow peel fruit with its sweet pasty pulp and Bufala mozzarella, made with sweet and tasty buffalo milk. Not to be missed the small, round, white Controne bean, highly digestible thanks to its thin skin and the artichoke of Paestum, round and compact. Excellent extra virgin olive oil of Cilento, with bitter and spicy flavor together. And finally, wine. Two of Cilento's denominations, Doc Castel San Lorenzo and Doc Cilento.



Not far away, the **Cala Bianca** beach, immersed in the Mediterranean scrub: a beautiful expanse of sand mixed with small white pebbles, from which the name derived.

The **Buon Dormire beach** is one of the most famous in Palinuro and one of the most suggestive places in Cilento. Famous for its emerald-color water and for its fine, golden sand, in front of it stands the so-called rabbit rock. To visit in Palinuro, also the beach of the

Natural Arch, a mixture of sand and rock famous for its arch, particularly suggestive at sunset. Always in Palinuro, a stop at **Cala Fetente** is a must, which takes its name from the sulfur emanations, **Cala delle Alghe** (seaweed) and **Cala delle Ossa** (bones), which has a macabre characteristic: some human bones are calcined in the rock, probably bone remains from old shipwrecks.

Cala degli Infreschi beach takes its name from the different water temperature: cooler on the surface and warmer as it gets deeper. It has a myriad of colors and a breathtaking landscape.

Trentova Beach, in **Agropoli**, is a small corner of paradise. The sea has tones ranging from emerald green to intense blue: the backdrop is low and makes it suitable for families with small children.

The **Ascea beach**, in the heart of the coastal stretch between the National Park of Cilento and Vallo di Diano, it's an immense expanse of soft and golden sand, lined with Mediterranean scrub and beautiful secular olive trees. It is

about 5 km long and culminates with a small creek bounded by a cliff, on which the beautiful **Telegraph Tower** stands. The legend of the Leucosia mermaid is linked to the protected beach of **Punta Licosa**, who is said to have been turned into a rock after jumping off a cliff, due to an unrequited love. It is fully accessible, except for a short stretch, which you can reach only by sea.

Marinella beach, one of the less well known but uncontaminated beaches of Cilento, is a large sandy beach set in a rocky valley. It offers a wonderful view of the coast and the promontory.

Cilento is also known for its sustainable tourism: **Eboli's No Limit Beach**, for example, has an area for people with disabilities with dedicated equipment and services.

The vegetation is also very characteristic: on the sandy dunes of its beaches grows the beautiful sea lily, subject to harvesting ban. At sunset, it spreads its inebriating scent all around.



Giffoni Experience

The 47th edition of the festival created by Claudio Gubitosi which has "magic" as its main theme; a festival made by young people for young people

Forty-seven years of "magic", beauty and creativity for the Festival conceived and directed by **Claudio Gubitosi**, which in half a century has transformed from Film Festival to Global Experience. A journey that lasts a full year and which produces about **480 activities**, distributed across Campania, Italy and the world, and which, despite this, still wants to regenerate itself and amaze. In this year's Edition, there will be **4,600 jurors**, aged between 3 and 22, coming from 52 countries around the world who will face each other without filters to vote for the works presented in competition,

divided into seven sections. This year, back to Giffoni, after 11 years of absence, also a delegation from Iran. The theme of the 2017 Festival is **"Into the Magic"**: it is magic that allows us to not settle and not to be subjugated by trivial every-day life but to live and pursue unique experiences. The official image of the Festival was entrusted, this year, to **Mimmo Paladino**, a well-known painter, sculptor, and engraver famous all over the world: to him the task of representing the magic that enchants children, excites the boys but also captures adults.



Festival of Murals

Don't miss the first Festival of Murals in Cilento. Painters and artists coming from all over Italy will paint the spaces made available by the Municipality to ensure that Castel San Lorenzo joins the Italian circuit of the Association of Painted Cities. Castel San Lorenzo is 26 km from Paestum and is located in the National Park of Cilento and Vallo di Diano.

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65 candles for the Ravello Festival



Starting on **July 1st**, at **Villa Rufolo**, the most anticipated summer appointment on the coast. A rich billboard of wagnerian suggestions, music, dance, jazz, and new languages

The Ravello Festival celebrates its 65th birthday with a quality billboard thanks to the artistic direction of **Alessio Vlad** (Music), **Maria Pia De Vito** (Jazz) and **Laura Valente** (dance, trends and new languages, special projects, training).

The Festival inaugurates on July 1st with the **Wagnerian concert** of the **Hungarian Radio Symphony Orchestra** directed by **Adam Fisher** in collaboration with one of the most important European Festivals dedicated to Wagner, the one in Budapest.

On the Belvedere of Villa Rufolo conductors of great caliber will alternate, such as Adam Fischer, Kent Nagano and DSO Berlin, Esa Pekka Salonen and London Philharmonic, Lahav Shani



and Rotterdam Philharmonic, Teodor Currentzis and his MusicAeterna.

Make way to young people: The Asian Youth Orchestra will also be featuring James Judd and Vadim Repin and the Chicago Children's Choir.

Two important returns: **Martha Argerich** and **Philip Glass**. The latter will celebrate his eightieth birthday in Ravello: he will perform with Dennis Russell Davies and Maki Namekawa in a concert for one, two and three pianos. Martha Argerich will be accompanied

by the Franz Liszt Chamber Orchestra of Budapest directed by Gábor Takács-Nagy.

Salerno's "Giuseppe Verdi" Philharmonic, as well as during the traditional Concerto all'Alba, entrusted to director Oleg Caetani, will be performing live, directed by Metropolitan Ilarion Alfeev.

This year, the Festival has, **for the first time**, an autonomous section dedicated to jazz. Among the most prestigious guests, Wayne Shorter and his quartet and the great trumpeter Enrico Rava who will perform together with another great European jazz father, the Polish Tomasz Stanko.

On stage, also **Dianne Reeves**, 5 Grammy-Award winner, accompanied by her quartet, and our **Roberta Gambarini**, who will be the protagonist of a special production of the Ravello Festival, together with the musical excellence of the Salerno Jazz Collective.

This year, ballet aims to tear down walls, overcoming prejudices and the barriers of diversity. The first date

is with the stars of American Ballet, which will perform on the music of Pink Floyd with a choreography by **Karole Armitage**, premiered at the Festival together with one of the greatest contemporary artists, **Francesco Clemente**.

Great anticipation for the eversive Canadian choreographer Marie Chouinard, new director of the Biennale Danza di Venezia (Venice Biennale Ballet), who will bring to Ravello a review of one of her masterpieces, *Le sacre du printemps*, on Stravinsky's music. For the first time in Ravello, the Israeli choreographer Ohad Naharin with his Batsheva Dance Company.

For training, we point out the project "Abballamm!", with workshops conducted by choreographers hosted at the festival: this year Ravello will also miraculously be having Israeli and Palestinians on the same stage.

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The turn of the 20th century saw the opening of the first 'Monetti' store at its historic headquarters in via Santa Brigida. Its founder Guglielmo senior, a qualified technician-watchmaker and a far-sighted pioneer of his times, defied public opinion by believing in the water-resistant properties of **Rolex** watches, an intuition that resulted in the establishment of the Monetti-Rolex partnership, a tradition perpetuated since 1932.

Over time, Monetti also began selling other coveted watch brands and, in 1968, Guglielmo junior began to make a name for himself in the world of high-class jewelry, not only by developing his own designs but also by partnering with renowned goldsmiths like Pomellato.

Today, Monetti's two Naples-based stores in **via Dei Mille** and **via Santa Brigida** are still considered a reference point in the city's historical and commercial tradition.

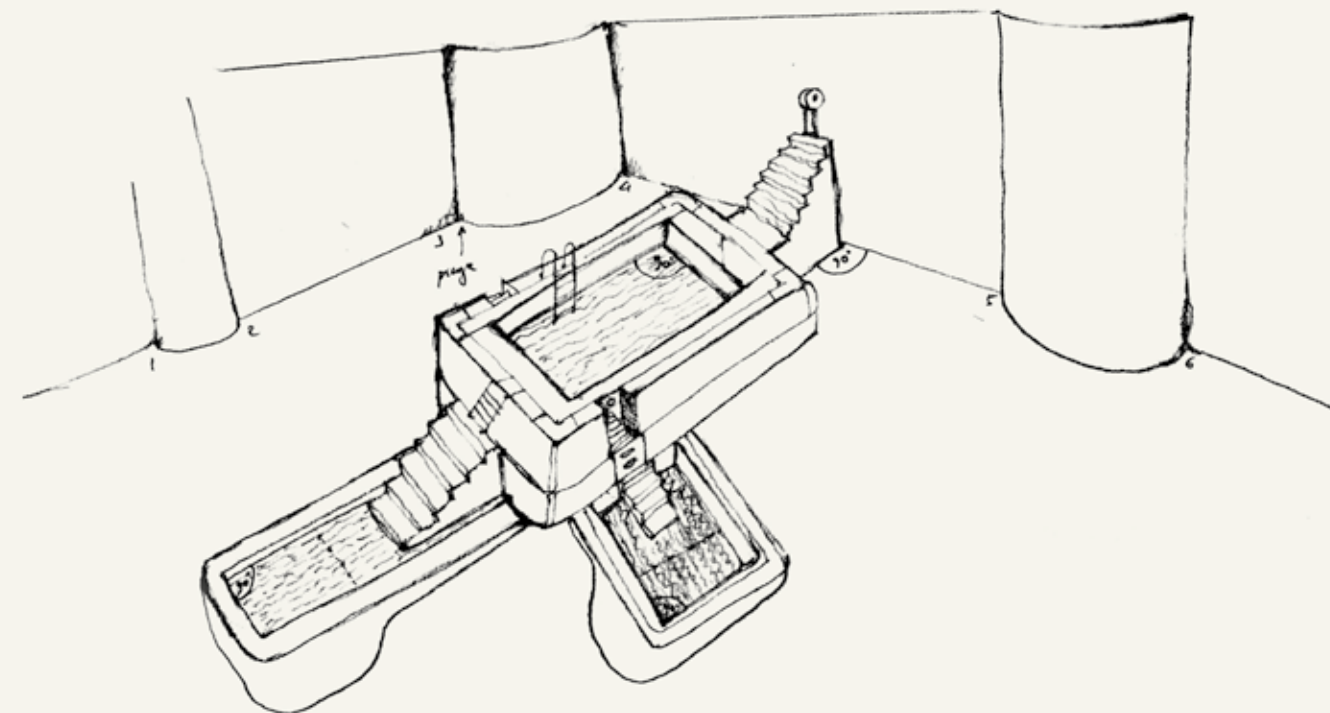

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Tramonti's pizza

Completely different from the Neapolitan one, it is prepared with 'fior di latte' cheese, from the Lattari Mountains and it is now popular all over the world. One of the most fascinating stories of southern entrepreneurship

Thirteen small villages are perched between the sweet curves that lead from the **Lattari Mountains** to the **Amalfi Coast**. The 13 bell towers that define the story of Tramonti, the place 'or of prosperity among the mountains', from which one of the most fascinating stories of entrepreneurship in the south of Italy was born. In **1947 Luigi Giordano**, nicknamed Gigino 'a casettara', left these places directed to Northern Italy, hoping to make a fortune with the production of the excellent 'fior di latte' cheese of the Lattari Mountains. However, he did not get the success he hoped for and decided to leave the management of the pizzeria, called '**A Marechiaro**', to his friend **Vittorio**

Macchiarola, known as 'stagnaro', to which he sent the surplus of dairy products he was not able to sell. The pizza was very much appreciated so, in a few years, there were hundreds of pizzerias open by the **Tramontani family members** who, called upon by Gigino, left Southern Italy to reach the North (and then Europe and the United States) to become entrepreneurs. Today there are perhaps **3000 pizzerias** (or 3000 pizza makers). These pizzerias bring the Tramonti-style pizza around the world, a product that, according to **Francesco Maiorano** from the Pizzeria Sanfrancisco di Tramonti, is completely different from the (just as good) famous Neapolitan pizza.

The dough is made, in both cases, with water and flour, but for Neapolitans the starting point is water, while for the Tramontani it's flour. Additionally, yeast and salt are added in both versions but the touch of diversity is offered by the Tramontani by adding extra virgin olive oil to the dough. After a long rising time (which can last up to three days), the Tramonti pizza is cooked, like the **Neapolitan one**, in a wood oven. In Tramonti, however, the pizza is cooked at 350° C for about 3 minutes, while in Naples the oven reaches 480° C and the pizza is cooked for 90 seconds.

And which kind of pizza is your favorite? The challenge is on!

[WORD TO THE CHEF]

Ischia on the table!



Pasquale Palamaro, star-chef of "Indaco", the Regina Isabella Hotel restaurant in Ischia, tells us about his love and passion for the cuisine and tradition of Ischia. A cuisine that, despite being characterized by the freshness of the daily catch, continues to be linked to an ancient tradition of rabbit cooked in clay pans. Its secrets? The creativity and freshness of the ingredients used.

When did you decide to become a chef?

It's the job that chose me! There has never been a day during which I felt I had made the decision. It all came very naturally. I'm in love with my job.

For a chef, are creativity or manual skills more important?

Both creativity and manual skills are fundamental to maximize the profession, but the scale certainly hangs more towards creativity: if we think of creative gourmet cuisine, for example, without imagination, nothing exciting could be done.

What are the peculiarities (also in terms of ingredients) of Ischia's traditional cooking?

Ischia's cuisine boasts a history of over a century with its famous rabbit but its peculiarity remains the daily catch with which many recipes rich in iodized freshness are prepared.

What is the most representative dish of the island?

As I said before, the rabbit, raised in "pits" and cooked in clay pots: a tradition that preserves all the flavors of our island.

Is there a recipe, among those you prepare, that fascinates tourists most?

A dish that distinguishes the Indaco restaurant I work for and myself is the sea urchin. It is a reproduction of a sea urchin with an amberjack-fish cream and mozzarella sauce.

What do you think is the most famous Campania dish?

According to my taste, the most representative dish is

"mezzanine" pasta with Genovese onion sauce but the most known and requested is no doubt margherita pizza.

What is the peculiarity of the Regina Isabella cuisine?

The freshness of the ingredients used. The greatest dishes are remembered not for their beauty, but for their tastiness!

Started in June and continuing until almost mid-July, the Naples Teatro Festival Italia, organized by the Fondazione Campania of Festivals, this year is at its tenth edition. A little over a month of cultural events, including music, ballet, theater, cinema, painting and graphics. About 80 titles divided into eleven sections: International Shows, Italian Shows, Ballet, Music, Cinema, Literature, Education, Exhibitions, SportOpera, Special Projects and Observatory. A true journey around the city's theatrical cultures, defined by Ruggero Cappuccio, artistic director of the Festival, as "The Theater Containing the Theaters".

Particularly relevant is the section devoted to Education, centered on one

of the main nodes of the 2017 edition: the relationship between the Teachers and the young talents, the encounter between languages and different generations for the transmission of the knowledge. The cinema section is held in collaboration with the Festivaletteratura di Mantova, presenting films never distributed in Italy dedicated to great writers around the world. The exhibition section offers displays of costumes for cinema, theater and opera made by great Italian artists. One of the main goals of the Festival is the reunification of the arts into an interdisciplinary vision of communication among humans. In this sense, we suggest reading the collaboration with artist Mimmo

Paladino, who designed the catalog and the promotional materials so that they would be not just information items but also art objects. For the Special Projects section, we will point to 'Attori in vetrina', an awareness raising project for the re-evaluation of acting, and 'Quartieri di Vita', which intends to enhance the work of suburban theaters in Campania. The review concerns several Neapolitan locations but also other main cities in Campania: Salerno is associated with the theme of water, Benevento to fire, Caserta to air, Avellino to the earth.

At the center of his works the state and impact of the production and circulation of digital images.

The first solo exhibition by Wade Guyton in an Italian public institution. Since the beginning of 2000s, the artist, one of the most prominent among **American artists** of the latest generation at international level, through his works investigates the state and impact of the production and circulation of digital images, representing the **potential forms** they can take and the specific sensitivities and unpublished languages that they outline in their globalized transmission.

With the use of inkjet printers, Guyton brings back **on canvas or other materials**, a series of images, signs or recurring patterns previously processed by programs such as Photoshop or Word.

The relationship between unanticipated overlaps, mechanical errors, and discrepancies at the time of printing - that the use of these tools implies - allows the artist to **highlight the conflicts of digital expression**, making us reflect on the conditional nature of his visualization made through the analogue instruments of visual arts.

The works by Guyton for the **Madre exhibition** are the result of his stay in Naples with the members of his team.

Distributed on the Madre Museum's **third floor**, they transform the authority of the museum's space into a hospitable daily work place, in a malleable architectural loop.

In this way Guyton reinterprets both the classic historical and artistic theme of the "studio" as well as the possible appeal of the tradition of the Journey to Italy or the Grand Tour: from which the ironic and self-deprecating plural of the title of the exhibition, "SIAMO ARRIVATI" derives, which quotes the slogan adopted by McDonald for the recent opening of its stores in Naples.

MONUMENTS & PLACES OF INTEREST

CASTEL DELL'OVO - According to ancient Neapolitan legend, its name stems from the egg which Virgil, the Latin poet, supposedly hid in its foundations to support the fortifications. The place where the egg was preserved was closed by heavy locks and kept secret because it was believed that all the facts and fortunes of Castel Marino depended upon it. The castle's fortifications and terrace offer a breathtaking view over the gulf. Borgo Marinaro. T:081.2400055

CASTEL NUOVO - Also known as Maschio Angioino, it is one of the most recognizable symbols of the city built in 1279 by Charles I, king of Naples, as a royal residence for the House of Anjou. From the time that it was built, it was termed "New" to distinguish it from the older Castles of Ovo and Capuano. Worthy of note are its underground passages, its two towers and its courtyard, from which you can enjoy a fabulous view, its gallery and Piazza d'Armi. Via Vittorio Emanuele III. T: 081.7955877

CASTEL SANT'ELMO - The first documented information regarding the castle dates back to 1275. This star-shaped castle was originally a church dedicated to St. Erasmus. In 1329 it was enlarged at the behest of Robert of Anjou, who transformed it into a real palatium for himself and his court. Later Spanish viceroy Don Pedro de Toledo had it further fortified in 1538. Used as a military prison until the 1970s, in 1976 important restoration work on the castle began, returning it to its original structure. Via Tito Angelini, 22. CHIESA DEL GESÙ NUOVO - Erected by the Jesuits between 1584 and 1601, its façade is actually part of a 15th century Renaissance palace. Its interior is spacious and light with a rich covering of coloured marbles and typical Florid Neapolitan frescoes. After the church was ravaged by fire in 1639, Cosimo Fanzago was commissioned to carry out restoration works that gave the Church a Baroque appearance. Its

interior boasts a number of magnificent frescoes while its chapels feature the works of renowned artists of the calibre of Massimo Stanzione and Giuseppe Ribera. Particularly worthy of note are its sculptural work and polychrome marble floor. Piazza del Gesù. T:081.5518613

CHIESA DI SAN DOMENICO MAGGIORE - Charles II of Anjou began the extensive rebuilding that produced the Church of San Domenico Maggiore. The work was done between 1238 and 1324, but the church has undergone extensive modifications over the centuries, including one in 1670 that recast the structure in the style of the Baroque. In the 19th century, however, the church was restored to its original Gothic design and is a motley combination of the two styles. Among the many artistic points of interest in the basilica are the frescoed ceiling by Francesco Solimena and sculptural works, including the high altar by Cosimo Fanzago. Piazza S. CHIESA DI SAN FRANCESCO DI PAOLA - One of the most characteristic and famous of all Neapolitan churches. Built in the mid-19th century, its circular form is reminiscent of the Pantheon in Rome. On the exterior, under a magnificent colonnade, you can see the statues of the four cardinal virtues and the three theological virtues while, at the sides of the stairway you will find two equestrian statues of king Ferdinand and his father, Charles III of Spain. One of the principal monuments of medieval Naples, its construction began in 1310 at the behest of Robert of Anjou and his second wife Sancia di Maiorca, who, both devotees of St. Francis of Assisi and Santa Chiara, wanted to build a Franciscan citadel to house the Clarisse nuns in the monastery and the Friars Minor in the adjacent convent. Behind the church is the Cloister of the Clarisse, the monastery's main cloister, strikingly decorated with bright majolica tiles. Via S. Chiara, 49C. DUOMO - Known as the Duomo di San Gennaro or Duomo di Santa Maria Assunta, the Cathedral was erected at the end of the 13th century by Charles of Anjou. Its present appearance is the result of the numerous modifications that took place over the centuries, partially altering its original Gothic form. Off the right aisle of the nave is the Cappella di San Gennaro, that also functions as the cathedral treasury (Tesoro) and is elaborately decorated with Baroque art. Via Duomo, 147. T: 081.449097

GALLERIA UMBERTO I - A mammoth steel and glass masterpiece built on the site of an entire block that was razed to the ground following the cholera epidemic of 1884. The Galleria was built as part of a program of renovation and modernization of the city which began with the Unification of Italy when a tender was put out. The winning project envisaged four large buildings joined to each other by an arcade designed by the engineer Paolo Boubée. Measuring 15 metres in width and 57 metres in height, the galleria was built between 1887 and 1890 and is a wonderful late Victorian marriage of technology with art. The Galleria has four access points: via San Carlo, via Santa Brigida, via Giuseppe Verdi and via Toledo.

ORTO BOTANICO - Founded in 1807 with a decree signed by King Joseph Bonaparte, Napoleon's brother, the botanical gardens extend over a surface area of almost 12 hectares. Dedicated botanists will be impressed with its rich

PALAZZO REALE - Envisaged as a 16th century monument to Spanish glory, it was erected at the behest of viceroy Fernandez Ruiz de Castro who, in 1599, decided to build a palace capable of lavishly hosting his sovereign, king of Spain and his entourage. The nucleus of the entire building is the Royal Apartment which can be accessed via a monumental white marble stairway with a double ramp whose lower part is decorated with allegoric bas-reliefs. REAL ALBERGO DEI POVERI - One of the largest, most imposing buildings in Europe it was designed by architect Ferdinando Fuga in 1751, at the behest of King Charles III of the House of Bourbon. GALLERIE D'ITALIA PALAZZO ZEVALLOS STIGLIANO

The Gallerie of Palazzo Zevallos Stigliano in Naples, together with the Gallerie in Milan's Piazza Scala and the Gallerie of Palazzo Leoni Montanari in Vicenza, comprise the Gallerie d'Italia, Intesa Sanpaolo's museum and cultural hub.

The Gallerie houses a stunning collection of more than 120 works of Neapolitan art spanning the 17th to 18th centuries. Star attractions include the Martyrdom of St Ursula, Judith Beheading Holophernes attributed to Flemish artist Louis Finson, Samson and Delilah by Artemisia Gentileschi and Saint George by Francesco Guarini.

The museum's fine collection of landscape paintings, a movement that flourished during the 19th century, includes four paintings by Dutch artist Gaspar van Wittel. A first section is dedicated to landscapes and the School of Posillipo, with canvases by Anton Smink Pitloo, Giacinto Gigante, Salvatore Fergola, Domenico Morelli as well as many others. From here we move to the Naturalism of the Resina School right up to the more individual experiences of late 20th century artists. Another section explores areas of the city with the depiction of the interiors of monumental buildings and communal spaces. The exhibition ends with a collection of works by Vincenzo Gemito: a series of bronze and terracotta sculptures as well as drawings that chronicle his extraordinary artistic parabola.

Not only a museum space but also one of the city's social and cultural reference points, the Gallerie of Palazzo Zevallos Stigliano also host temporary exhibitions, concerts, symposiums, conventions as well as a wide offer of educational activities.

Villa Rufolo in Ravello

Benedetta de Falco, President of the Premio GreenCare, accompanies us to discover the garden that enchanted **Wagner** and **Gore Vidal** and which has been hosting the Ravello Festival for 65 years

PREMIO GREENCARE. SEARCHING FOR THE LOST GREEN

is a nonprofit initiative designed to foster urban civic sense towards preserving public and private green urban areas, in Naples and in the province.



Overlooking the blue sea of **Minori** and **Maiori**, embedded as an emerald in the silvery rock of the **Amalfi Coast**, outstretched as the spine of a ship that sets sail, the garden of Villa Rufolo, in Ravello, hasn't stopped charming Italian and foreign visitors since the Rufolo founded it, in the thirteenth century, to complete their imposing Moorish castle.

An **Arabic style garden**, initially developed on two levels, with a spectacular setting, the sea on three sides, so as to surprise the visitor. Exciting effects from the entrance: a tree-lined avenue, pergolas, fountains, small cloisters, as in a miniature Alhambra which, in literature, welcomed the "delighted brigade" of the Decameron of **Giovanni Boccaccio** and, in the music, bewitched **Richard Wagner**. Visiting it, the German composer had the stunning perception that it was the exact scenery of the garden, full of delights, which he had imagined for **Parsifal**.

From the Rufolo's to Wagner, the garden met the happy season of the Scottish **Sir Francis Nevile Reid**, an art expert, botanist, and philanthropist, who, in the nineteenth century, had bought the ruined

villa with a very damaged tree plant. He chose to make it a spectacular garden, respecting its historical memory but also adding some innovations and experimenting.

Thus, the Mediterranean scrub, a natural element of the Amalfi landscape, was corroborated by rare and foreign plants, collected throughout Europe, often reluctant to adapt to that garden so exposed to the salt-rich winds. But Reid's obstinacy prevailed and with his stubbornness, and the precious collaboration of gardener **Luigi Cicalese**, he was able to make exotic plants flourish alongside local species, in a dialogue that never stops: the representation, in the garden, of that international character that Ravello has earned over time. From the Grand Tour to today, with "Ravello

Costa d'Amalfi" candidate as "**Italian Capital of Culture 2020**".

A garden like a small world where many types of **roses bloom**, especially Dijon, while there is no longer trace of the pink "Bella Napoli" rose, disappeared due to a famous flood that affected the whole area.

The site's architectures - towers, arches, columns, stairs, terraces - are supported by the vegetation: trees, shrubs, flowering plants and fruit. The visitor is led to the discovery of a **unique and romantic place** that gives the feeling of being in paradise on earth, now entrusted to the care of the **Fondazione Ravello**.

In the garden, during the summer, you can hear a **classic concert** of an international orchestra. On the stage suspended on the sea,

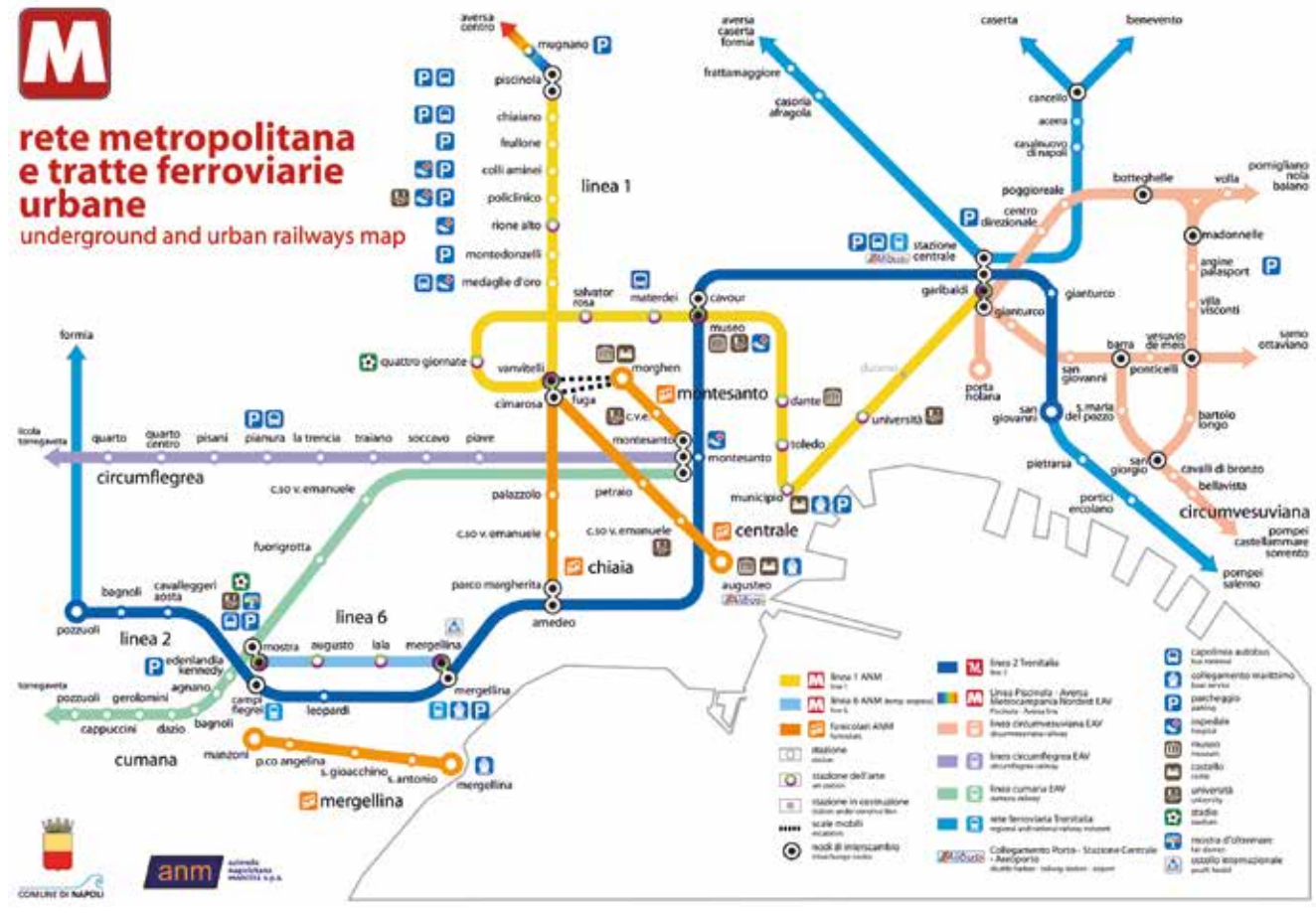
the **Ravello Festival** (see page 14) is a 65-year-old music review, dedicated to Wagner, as well as to ballet and new trends.

Gore Vidal, who had elected these places as good retreat until 2006, loved to attend it. In the garden of Villa Rufolo, this impressive image flourished: "When the orchestra plays Wagner, the full moon rises from the mountains whose contours remind you of a dragon whose head is softly reclined on the beach towards east, while the birds, musically trained after all these years, make the counterpoint from the top of the dark pines". My wish is for you to be able to visit this place at least once in your life.

Why visit Ischia during the summer?

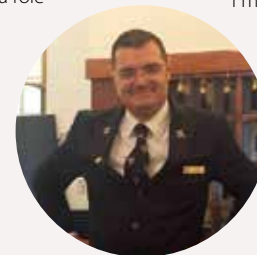
I may be a bit biased, but I think Ischia is one of the most beautiful places in the world.
