

## Top Five Pillars of Islam For Muslims:

The Five Pillars of Islam are any number of acts required to be performed by a Muslim believer. They are believed to be mandatory acts by all Muslims and are performed by keeping in mind various factors. They can also be described as the pillar upon which Islam is bestowed upon the whole world. The [pillars of islam for muslims](#) are nothing but acts of worship performed by Muslim believers. They have several definitions according to various Islamic authorities.

The first pillar, commonly known as the sharia, is that which is believed to be the foremost pillar of Islam. It is defined as following the Sunnah of the Prophet Muhammad (SAW), as expressed in the hadith. The second main article is to be believed and followed strictly by all Muslims, to be called a Muslim. The third main article is to abstain from all things forbidden by sharia.

The second pillar of Islam is to practice consultation with religious scholars and religious experts. This is to learn and understand the true voice of the prophet, for those who subscribe to Islamic principles. The scholars and religious experts provide Muslims with correct and verified teachings on the path of the Islamic faith. Knowledge of the religion is one of the must-haves of a Muslim. Knowledge of the dar al-Kufri or the pillars of Islam and its ethics forms the basis of his religion.



The third article of sharia is to perform regular, customary prayers in the mosques. All Muslims believe that God has sent the prophet Muhammad (SAW) with this earth for the sake of mankind. Worship is compulsory under the shahada of the prophet. The fifth article of sharia

is to perform regular, customary exercises and sports. They form the essence of the eighth pillar of the Islamic faith. They help a Muslim in maintaining a healthy physical body and soul.

The fourth article of the Islamic faith is to follow the Sunnah or traditions of the prophet. These practices are called hadith. The fifth pillar of Islam is to participate in charitable activities. These habits are known as piranha hadith.

The sixth and last article of sharia is to visit the Hajj ritual at the site of his al-Atlanta, in the Persian Gulf. The seventh and eighth pillar of Islam is to make hajjis or Hajjans in every Muslim country. The ninth and final pillar of hajj is to perform the mecca ritual at Mecca. The ninth and final pillar of Islam is to fast during the month of Ramadan. Ramadan is the month of worship of Islam and the month where the Holy Book, the Quran, and the traditions are fulfilled.



In addition, there are twenty-nine pillars of Islamic faith found in the Holy Quran. Twenty-one pillars consist of Hajj, Fasting, Zakat, Muhammad's marriage, Zakat as night worship, child guardianship, [child marriage](#), monthly obligatory prayers, traveling to Mecca, twenty days of pilgrimage, annual migration, twenty-one years of Islam, twenty-one lashes for women, twenty-one years of Ummah as a state, Islamic world peace, twenty years as a Muslim, twenty camel yearly products, and twenty purity before marriage. Some scholars have estimated that there are as many as seventy-six pillars of Islam. Therefore, we can say that the ninth and final pillar of the Islamic faith, which is the mecca, makes up the majority of the Islamic religion.

Pillars of Islamic faith are found in the Holy Quran, Sunnah of the Prophet Muhammad (SAW), the Sunnah of his wives, the life of the prophet, Hadith, the companions, their deeds, and even personal characteristics of each of these pillars. Each one of them plays an important role in

Islam. However, all of them are not enough to form an institution called Islam. The fifth pillar, which is thought to be the most important in Islam by all scholars, is Hajj and Fasting. The fifth pillar, Zakat, cannot be separated from the Sunnah of the prophet Muhammad (SAW), as both are connected.
