

Can You Go to Jail For Driving Without Insurance?

There are few states that have "no-fault" laws. This means that if you are found driving without insurance in Michigan, you can be arrested and ticketed. The penalties can include a fine of up to one thousand dollars, or even both, depending on the offense. The first time offense can result in license suspension and up to two years in jail. The maximum amount of tickets that you can receive is four. If you can't prove that you have coverage, this can be a major issue.
