Secret #1: Start With Generic Survey

When conducting a usability survey, the web design company must start with generic questions to get more information about the users. It will help them understand the history, personality, and experience level of the survey respondents. All the background detail can allow web developers and UX designers to connect the users' behaviors with the data gathered after the test.



Some of the most common opening questions in a usability survey include:

- What do you do for a living?
- What are your most visited websites?
- How many hours do you spend browsing the Internet?





Secret #2: Decide Which Questions To Use

Your chosen web design and UX team can discover plenty of valuable actionable insights by asking specific questions regarding the behavior of the users when accessing the site's landing page. It will let them bring out direct responses from the users who took the survey.

Common sets of questions that are included in the test include:

- What are your expectations when you click on this button?
- What is the reason why this label did not meet your expectations?
- How do you expect to perform a particular task on this page?



Secret #3: Recruit The Right Participants

For moderated in-person and moderated remote testing methods, the UX agency must know how to gather the right people to participate in the survey. Some agencies recruit the respondents through a panel, ask for participants from the site users, hire a research agency, or manually look for participants.





But ensuring that the people who will respond to the survey will provide the best outcome for the testing methods. To do this, they must find people that belong to their target demographics. They must also look for respondents with a wide range of experience related to the test. It will also help them if they include a group of respondents who are critical of your product so the UX designers will get to evaluate valid pain points.

Using usability surveys to get the pulse of your site's users can be very beneficial for your website's success. If done correctly, your investment in web development and UX design will generate favorable results.
