How to use some of the options for Twitter's search

Ever want to find a tweet from someone in particular?

Just type it into a search box. Works for the apps and the website.

from:username for all tweets from that person.

After the username you can enter search terms to get tweets from that person including those words.

from:realdonaldtrump cruz



Trying to find a tweet that was sent to a particular person?

to:username for all tweets mentioning that person.

Like with from, you can add search terms. You can also combine these searches to find all tweets from someone and to a particular person.

from:texantruth42 to:betoorourke



Filters for searches

With many of these filters you can add a minus sign before the filter to get the opposite results. (-filter:replies to get no replies)

filter:verified This will give you search results only from verified users.

filter:replies This will give you only reply tweets.

filter:retweets This removes retweets from search results.

filter:links To see only tweets with links

filter:images For only tweets with images

filter:media For tweets with video or images


filter:native_video For tweets with video uploaded to Twitter

min_faves:10 will show you tweets with 10+ likes. You can use whatever number you wish.

min retweets:10 For tweets with a minimum amount of retweets

min_retweets isn't very reliable when mixed with the from:username filter, in my experience. It seems to work well outside of that.

Beto O'rourke min_retweets:10



Search by date

since:2018-01-01 until:2018-05-15

Tweets from within a time span of 1-1-2018 to 5-15-2018. Change as needed.

You can use since or until alone to get all tweets up to a date or since a date.

From:realdonaldtrump since:2018-01-01 until:2018-05-15



See tweets from a certain area

near:houston,tx within:10mi

Change distance as needed.

US ZIP codes also work. Unit can be changed to km.



These filters can be used and combined to allow you to find information/tweets very quickly. You don't have to scroll down someones profile trying to find something. This works for the app and the website.

On the website there is an advanced search they seem to want to hide. It has some but not all of the filters.

Direct URL: twitter.com/search-advanced

Search Operators

"United States" would find the exact phrase.

Dr -Pepper would find Dr without Pepper.

hot OR cold would find tweets with hot or cold.

lang:de for tweets in German

lang:nl for Dutch

lang:es for Spanish.. etc..

Search Operators



Operator	Finds tweets
twitter search	containing both "twitter" and "search". This is the default operator.
"happy hour"	containing the exact phrase "happy hour".
love OR hate	containing either "love" or "hate" (or both).
beer -root	containing "beer" but not "root".
#haiku	containing the hashtag "haiku".
from:alexiskold	sent from person "alexiskold".
to:techcrunch	sent to person "techcrunch".
@mashable	referencing person "mashable".
"happy hour" near:"san francisco"	containing the exact phrase "happy hour" and sent near "san francisco".
near:NYC within:15mi	sent within 15 miles of "NYC".
superhero since:2010-12- 27	containing "superhero" and sent since date "2010-12-27" (year-month-day).
ftw until:2010-12-27	containing "ftw" and sent up to date "2010-12-27".
hilarious filter:links	containing "hilarious" and linking to URLs.
news source:"Twitter Lite"	containing "news" and entered via Twitter Lite



Want to find news?

filter:news

add it to your search term(s).

It will find tweets containing those terms that are linking to news sources.



For searching for tweets from people on a list.

dogs list:MSNBC/correspondent-list

This is for searching for 'dogs' on the MSNBC correspondent list.

This one you would just want to bookmark after you search it or add it to a saved search. You have to manually go to the profile to find the list name to set it up. The list name is in URL.
