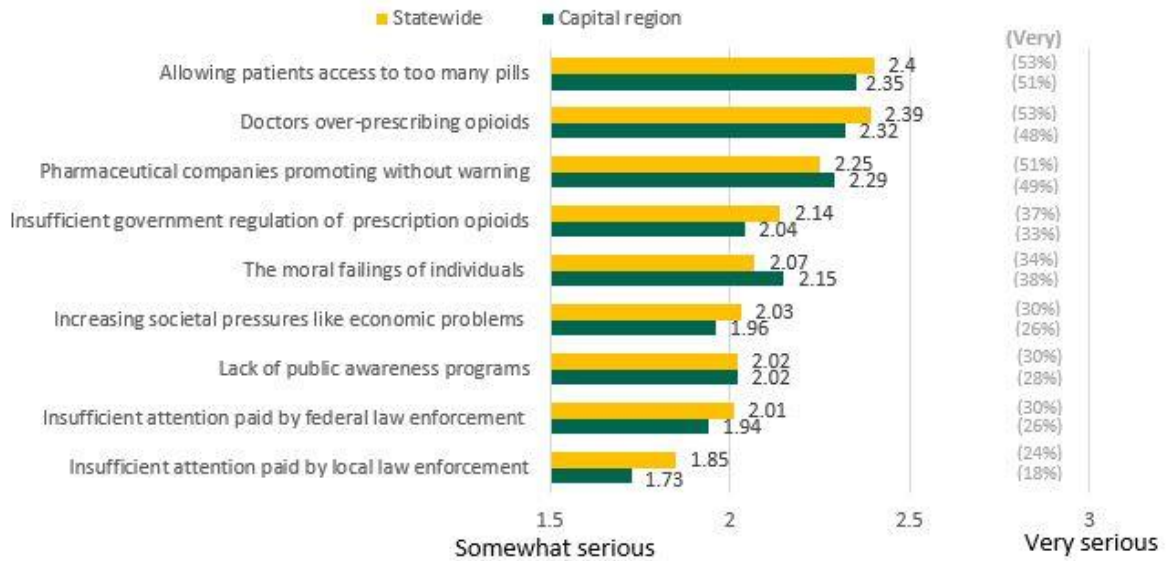

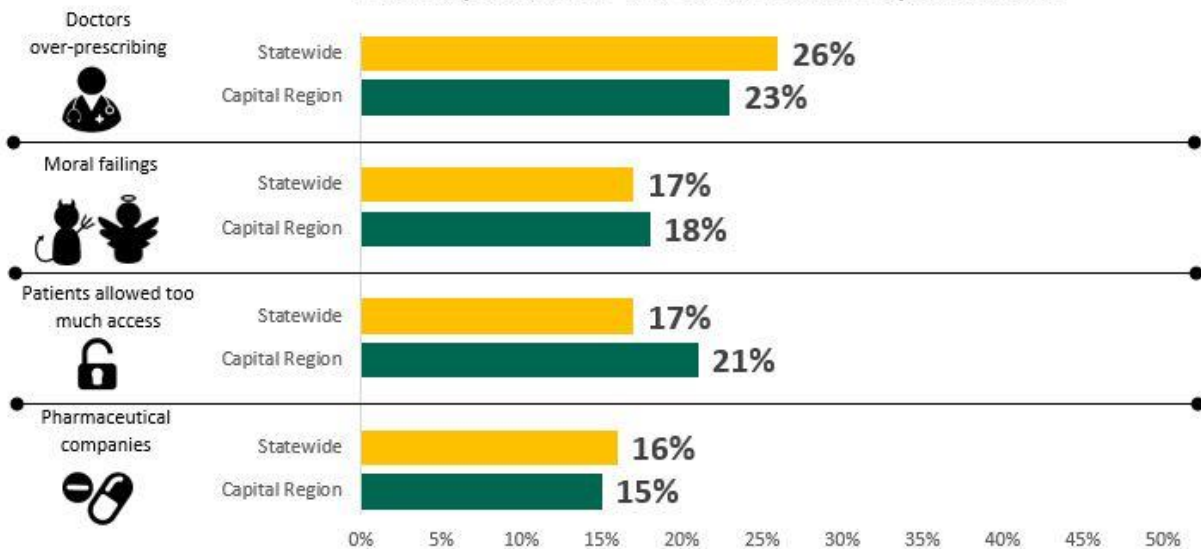
WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CRISIS?

To what extent do you think each of the following is responsible for the current level of opioid abuse? (Scale: 0 - 3)

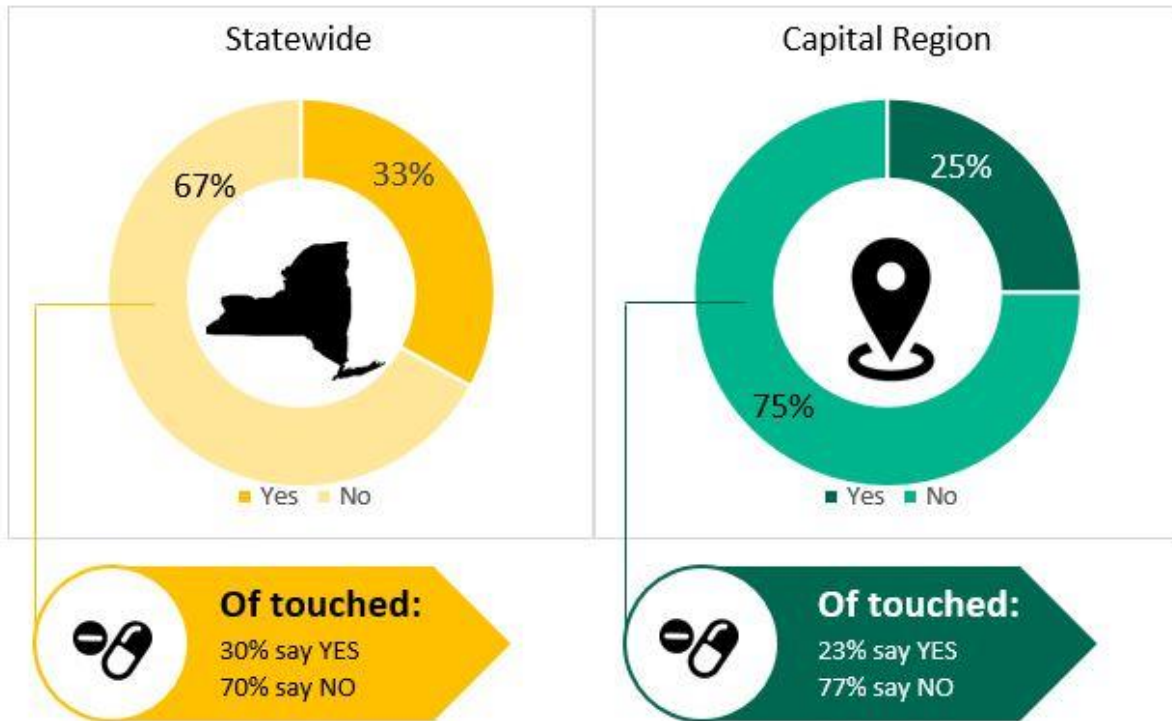


Which single contributor to the problem do you think is most responsible for the current level of opioid abuse?



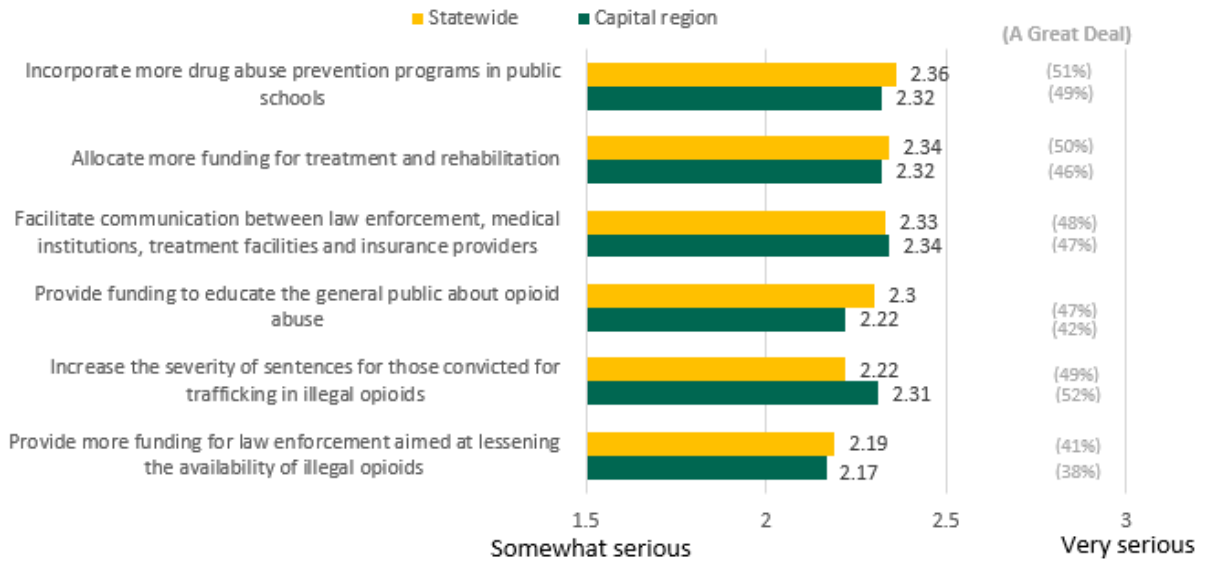
IS GOVERNMENT DOING ENOUGH?
