



### FAQ

## 1 WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DO OUR TEACHERS HAVE?

Our teachers are all graduates who have a strong command in English. Many of our teachers have writing experiences in the industry. They have written for animation, fiction or won awards for story writing competitions. We carefully screen and select individuals with a passion for teaching. They undergo an intense training programme that prepares them with classroom management skills, marking schemes and content delivery.

### 2 WHY IS YOUR CURRICULUM EFFECTIVE?

The content of our curriculum is created by animation writer/producer, Sabreena, who has worked for Sony, Netflix and Cartoon Network. She created a curriculum, following MOE guidelines to specifically prepare students for PSLE. Her years of experience as a writer helped to develop a curriculum that equips children with the necessary components to write compelling compositions. Shabana, a child psychologist specifically curated the manner in which the curriculum is packaged to suit the developing stages of a child. Our worksheets and workbooks are designed specifically to help children not only learn, but retain what they have learnt.

#### 3 HOW LONG TILL I SEE IMPROVEMENT?

Good writing habits take 30 to 67 days to develop. As long as your child, completes all lessons, workbooks and challenges, a significant difference will be seen.

#### 4 WILL THERE BE MORE INTERACTIVE WORKBOOKS?

Yes! We release a few throughout the year and highly encourage students to complete them.

#### 5 WILL I GET FEEDBACK FROM THE TEACHER?

We work closely with parents. After every revision test, a progress card will be attached to their revision worksheet. Furthermore, our teachers write feedback for every composition written.

#### 6 WILL ONLINE CLASSES BE EFFECTIVE?

Our online classes are interactive and engaging. There's many benefits in a virtual classroom where you can present visual representations of vocabulary words. Using pictures and animations to show examples of specific actions and words create plenty of stimuli in a child's learning experience. According to Shabana, our child psychologist, the more stimuli a child is exposed to, the bigger the imprint of the lesson. Furthermore, our interactive worksheets are hands-on, enabling students to drag, drop and even match with the touch of a finger.

# 7 WHY DO CERTAIN WRITING COMPONENTS TAKE 2 WEEKS INSTEAD OF ONE?

Writing components such as facial expressions, speech tags and walk cycles have plenty of material to cover. Our philosophy focuses more on retention rather than mere exposure. We want our students to not only thoroughly comprehend but also be able to effectively form sentences with these elements. These 3 components are the building blocks to help students create their own descriptions especially when they graduate on to Primary 3.

8	WHY HAVE 2 WEEKS OF RECAP? SHOULDN'T STUDENTS REVISE ON THEIR OWN?
	In psychology, there's something called Hebb's rule. Neurons that fire together, wire together. This is why reinforcement especially for children is key! The more you reinforce, the higher the retention. After the end of a cycle, it is always good to jog the memory to ensure maximum absorption. It also prepares them for their tests where we expect them to incorporate every component they have covered into their composition. Over the cycles, this has a compounding effect and creates good writing habits.
9	WHY TWO TESTS?
	In our curriculum, we not only cover writing but theory as well. There are many writing components covered. By testing them on theory, we are able to examine how much they have learnt and give appropriate feedback to parents on where they should focus. Our aim is to ensure students incorporate the theory component effectively into writing and that's why we test both!
10	DO YOU COVER STORY PLANNING?
	Yes! We always brainstorm with the students before starting a composition. Students pitch various ideas and the teacher gives feedback on whether it is suitable for the theme and topic. We would write and draw out ideas on the interactive whiteboard with the students for every composition.
11	WILL CERTAIN WRITING COMPONENTS REPEAT IN P3/4 AND P5/6?
	Not all! Certain writing components are staples to compelling compositions. However, it will be more difficult versions of what they covered in Primary 2. They may have covered facial expressions in Primary 2. However, in Primary 3 or 4, they will tackle more detailed expressions that help them advance in their language development.
12	DOES YOUR CURRICULUM FOLLOW PSLE FORMAT?
	Yes! We follow the PSLE format closely. Many of our composition topics are from past year PSLE papers. Our curriculum writers have a MOE background.

# 13 WHAT IF A STUDENT IS ABSENT?

Even though, there are no makeup classes, students will still have access to their interactive worksheet. They are expected to complete it before their lesson. We highly discourage absenteeism and tardiness. We cover a lot in one lesson, however, we do understand when emergencies crop up.

# 14 CAN WE SKIP HOMEWORK?

We understand busy schedules. We are reasonable with our homework and only assign light loads. The homework helps with retention. Therefore, we do encourage them to complete as much as they can.

	He or she can attempt online on a later date and submit it to us.
