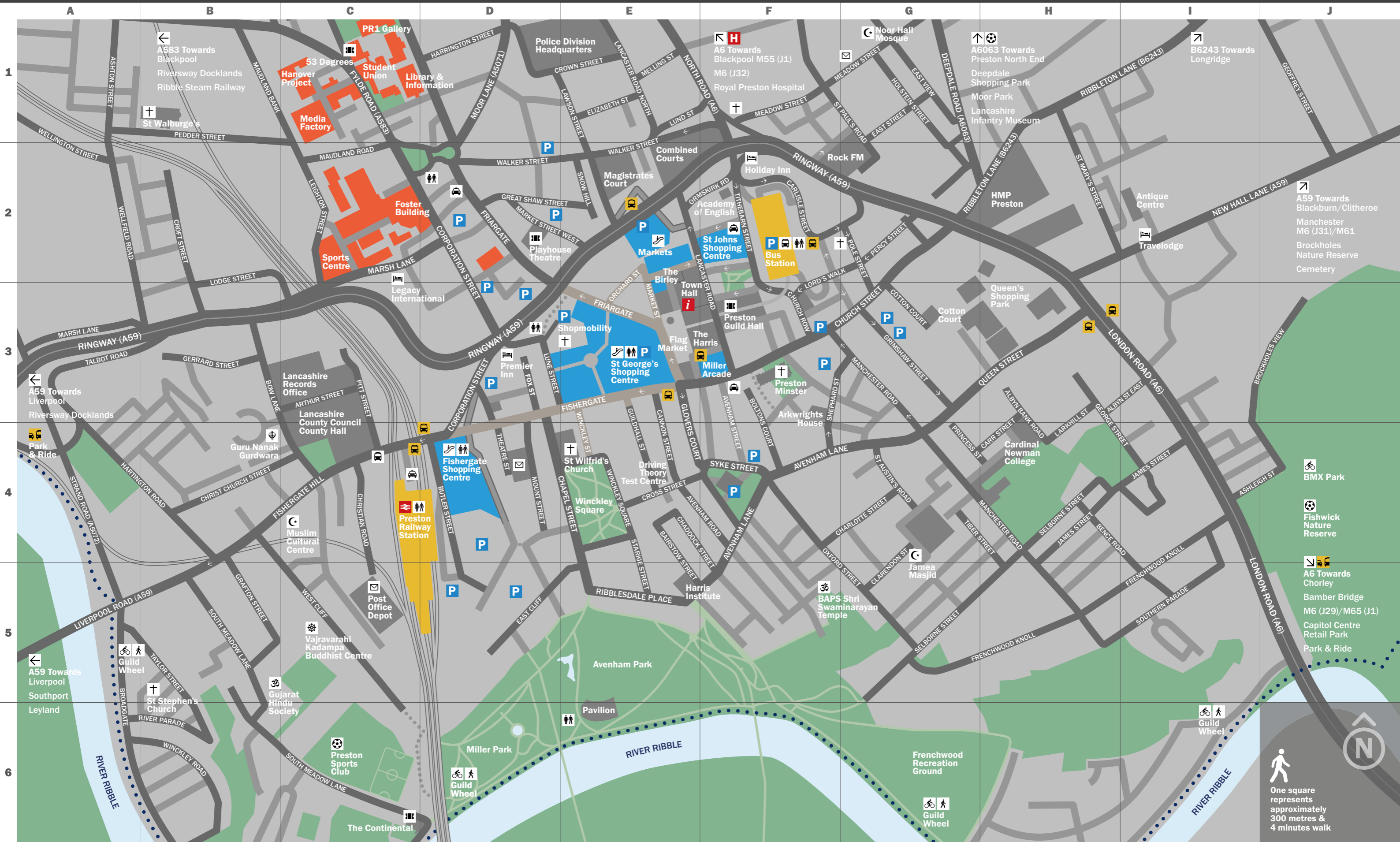

# Welcome

There is something for everybody to enjoy in Preston, these are just some **highlights** to ensure an unforgettable visit.



### Shop

Head to the main shopping street Fishergate (E3) or St. George's Shopping Centre (E3) and Fishergate Centre (D4) to find those well known high street names. Alternatively meander down some of the quaint streets off Fishergate (E3) such as Cannon street (E3), Guild Hall street (E3) and Lune street (D3) for independent cafes, jewellers, beauty salons, boutiques and more. Friargate (D2, E3) en route to the University of Central Lancashire (C1, C2) also boasts a number of independent shops.

### Markets (E2)

Preston Markets offer quality, fresh, local produce including meat, fish, fruit, vegetables and dairy alongside hair and beauty, jewellery, clothing, pet supplies, gifts and more. The Outdoor Market located

under the Grade II listed canopies sells cards, fabric, furniture, books, clothes, bags, plants and flowers amongst many more items on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. A Car Boot market operates on Tuesday and Thursday selling bric a brac, furniture, clothing and second hand goods. Alternatively visit the Sunday Market under the Fish Market Canopy. ### Miller Arcade (F3)

An architectural gem in the centre of Preston, the building was constructed in 1899, modelled on the larger Burlington Arcade in London. It was Preston's first indoor shopping centre which also housed Turkish Baths from 1901 until 1947. Now a Grade II listed building it is home to a number of shops, bars and eateries and is worth a visit both inside and out.

### Winckley Square (E4)

One of the finest examples of a Georgian Square in the north of England with open gardens, a perfect place to enjoy a spot of lunch or coffee. Home to some fantastic Georgian architecture this is Preston's professional quarter. Head to the square via the lovely cobbled Winckley Street (E3), where you can pick up a bite to eat en route.

### Cultural Quarter

Home to **The Harris** (F3), a fantastic building housing contemporary art exhibitions, history gallery, fine art collection, glass, ceramics and lots more. In contrast **Preston Guild Hall** (F3) hosts a wide variety of shows from live music and comedy to theatre and sporting events and the **Flag Market** (E3) programs events and activities throughout the summer and winter months.

### Visit....

the glorious Grade II\* listed Victorian **Avenham and Miller Parks** (E5, D6), just a 5 minute walk from **Fishergate** (E3).

### Eat....

and enjoy a meal at the restaurants and pubs located down the quaint side streets off **Fishergate** (E3) and **Winckley Square** (E4). Spend your lunchtime in the cafes located around the city centre and sample a selection of international menus on offer. Preston city centre is the only place in Lancashire to hold the Purple Flag accreditation, awarded for a safe and vibrant night out. ### See....

the view across Preston from the Grade I listed **St Walburge's Church** (B1), the 3rd highest spire in the UK or explore the city on foot with one of our self-guided walks.

### Watch....

boats at Riversway, Preston's dock and marina, and walk around taking in the history. Make sure you stop for a coffee en route at the café. You will also find the **Ribble Steam Railway and Museum** near the north side of the dock.

### Stay....

## Explore

### Bus

Buses run to all parts of Preston and the region. Preston Bus operate all local routes. Stagecoach and Lancashire County Council operate services to neighbouring villages, towns and cities. For connections to cities further afield, National Express and Megabus operate from the **bus station** (F2).

### Taxis

Taxi ranks for Black cabs are located at the **railway station** (C4), **Church Street** (F3) and **bus station** (F2). Other city centre taxis firms are available to pre-book.

### Train

**Preston railway station** (C4) is a major hub for national and local services with direct trains to London (2hrs) and Glasgow (2.5hrs), Manchester, Liverpool, Blackpool, the Lake District and Manchester airport.

You can also store your bike at the Bike Hub 24 hours a day, hire one or have yours repaired.

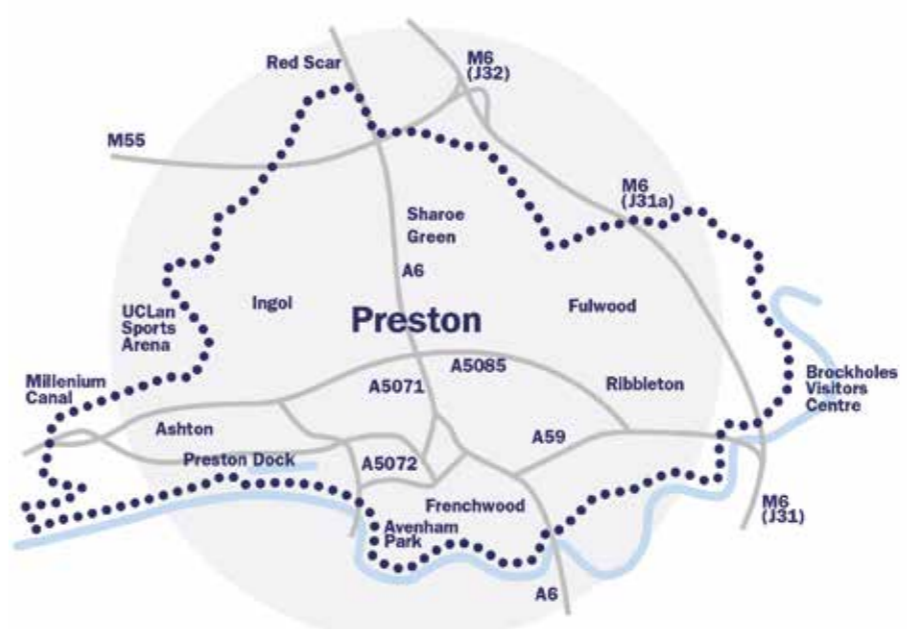
