



**COMMUNIQUE OF ALL BIAFRA CONFERENCE HELD IN ACCRA,
GHANA ON 27 – 31 MAY 2016**

PREAMBLE: The meeting of All-Biafran peoples and organizations under the auspices of All-Biafra-Conference (ABC) and organised by the Organization of Emerging African States (OEAS) held in Accra, Ghana on 27 – 31 of May 2016:

- conscious of the very excruciating and oppressive conditions of Biafrans in the state of Nigeria and continuous entrenchment of laws and institutions to continue the further repression of the peoples of Biafra by successive Nigerian governments;
- mindful of the compelling need to liberate the Biafran peoples from the shackles of oppression and repression, massacres, pogroms, marginalisation and economic strangulation;
- desirous of the necessity for speedy achievement of independent state of Biafra by creating an umbrella platform for the achievement of independence, hereby agree and resolved as follows:
 1. That, all nationalities and organizations that have hitherto existed for purposes of achieving Biafra have come together under the umbrage of Biafra Peoples National Council.
 2. That, Biafra Peoples National Council under the acronym (BPNC) will form a collegiate parliament composed of representatives of Biafra Ethnic nationalities and pro-Biafra organisations.
 3. That, Biafra shall be a State founded on Equity, Fairness, Justice, Participatory Democracy and Egalitarianism and even Development. Consequently, the administrative and political capitals, shall not be concentrated in one location but shall be spread across Biafraland. These capitals shall include but not limited to:
 - (i) Executive,
 - (ii) Legislative,
 - (iii) Judicial,
 - (iv) Cultural,
 - (v) Economic,
 - (vi) Science and Technology,

(vii) Agriculture

(viii) Defence.

4. That, the conference agreed to draw up a legal framework for the New Biafra State;
5. That, the conference demands for the immediate and unconditional release of all pro-Biafran activists being detained and incarcerated by the Federal Government of Nigeria amongst which but not limited to:
 - (a) Mazi Nnamdi Kanu,
 - (b) Benjamin Madubugwu
 - (c) David Nwawuisi
 - (d) Mazi Benjamin Onwuka
 - (e) Chukwuebuka Ikenwa.
6. The conference unequivocally further demands that the Nigeria State should immediately stop the wanton killings and senseless massacres of people of Biafra extraction and destruction of their properties. These extra-judicial executions by various security apparatus of the Federal Government of Nigeria with criminal acquiescence of pro government militia under the guise of Fulani Herdsmen are unacceptable. For instance:
 - (a) The unprecedented use of brutal force by the Nigerian police and army against unarmed peaceful protesters and cold blooded murder of more than 50 Biafran activists celebrating Biafra National Day and remembrance of our fallen heroes on 30th May 2016 in various locations in Biafraland. The Biafra people will continue to hold President Buhari and his administration responsible for their murderous spree against Biafra activists and innocent and defenceless women and children.
 - (b) The recent burning and destruction of stores in a section of the Ladipo market Lagos by sponsored Yoruba youths notoriously called Area Boys.
 - (c) The genocidal invasion and massacre at Nimbo, Uzo-Uwani, Enugu State and surrounding communities by the Fulani invaders while the Nigerian state watched and did nothing.
 - (d) The raping and killing of defenceless women and children at Ugwulechi, Agwu Enugu State by Fulani Herdsmen while the Nigerian security agencies in ironic response, turned around to arrest about 76 hapless villagers.
 - (e) The recent unprovoked invasion of a prayer ground in Aba, Abia State by a combined team of Nigeria military and police during which 32 praying Biafrans were massacred.

7. The Conference draws the attention of the government of Federal Republic of Nigeria to its failure to adhere to the post-conflict agreement of Reconciliation, Reconstruction and Rehabilitation (3Rs) of the veterans of the 1967-70 civil war. To this regard, the conference brings to the attention of the international community Nigeria's Federal Government continuous prosecution of the civil war of the 1967-70 through its official policy of neglect, abandonment and persecution of veterans and their families of the civil war of Biafran origin at Oji River in Enugu State.
8. The conference vehemently demands that the State of Nigeria should live up to its promises and international obligations which she has too long neglected and denied to the veterans.
9. The conference frowns and condemns the attitude of the Commonwealth of Nations towards the senseless, cruel, inhumane, degrading and extra-judicial killings of more than 700 unarmed civilians of Biafran origin and pro-Biafran activists by various security apparatus of the Federal Government of Nigeria and its militias under the disguise of Fulani Herdsmen.
10. The conference recognises that the Commonwealth of Nations has suspended Nigeria in 1995 for its deplorable human rights record including but not limited to the unjust execution by hanging of 9 Ogoni activists including Africa's playwright Kenule Saro-Wiwa and the continuous detention and murder of MKO Abiola.
11. That, taking cognizance of point 10 above, the conference strongly rejects the blatant double standard of the Commonwealth of Nations and the attitudes of individual member-states of the Commonwealth vis-a-vis the overt extra-judicial killings of pro-Biafra activists and citizens of Biafra community who are either going about their daily activities or peacefully exercising their right to demonstrate.
12. The conference, in recognition of points 9, 10 and 11 above recommends to the Commonwealth of Nations to immediately begin the process of expelling the Federal Republic of Nigeria from the Commonwealth of Nations in compliance with the Harare Commonwealth Declaration and the norms and principles of respects to peoples and human rights.
13. The conference reiterates that in view of point 10 above, it is the right of the Commonwealth of Nations to respect its founding principles which it did over the unjust execution of 9 Ogoni activists, and which it must do now over the illegal arrest, incessant torture, detention and imprisonment of the Director of Radio Biafra - Mazi Nnamdi Kanu, the leader of Biafra Zionist Movement - Mazi Ben Onwuka, Biafran activist Chukwuebuka Ikenwa and other.
14. The conference frowns and expresses dismay on the silence of the global Christian leadership in the continuous attack of men and women of the flock in Biafranland, members of the Christian faith, and the destruction and arson of Christian places of worship within the confinement of the territory of Biafra.

15. The conference however noted with satisfaction the present reaction of the global Christian community over the attack of the members of Syrian Christian community and the destruction of their places of worship by extremist elements of the Islamic faith. By this, the conference demands that the global Christian community should turn their sight to Biafraland in the same regard.
16. The conference vehemently warns that failure to expel Nigeria from the Commonwealth of Nations will be a *carte blanche* for the Buhari administration to continue unabated the pogrom of extermination of people of Biafran origin. It will also be a free pass for the forceful islamisation of Christian people of Biafra and the extermination of the members of the Christian community within the confines of Federal Republic of Nigeria and Biafraland.
17. The conference resolved and encouraged itself to continue the Biafra struggle selflessly, united and without equivocation.
18. The conference thanked all individuals, non-governmental organizations and countries that have so far support the Biafran struggle for statehood. The conference extends special thanks and gratitude to the Organisation of Emerging African States (OEAS).




