Topic Number 5: Broward Sheriff's Office On-Campus Response and Active Assailant Protocols

- Analyze and evaluate BSO's initial on-campus law enforcement response to the MSD shooting on February 14, 2018.
- Identify and evaluate the Broward Sheriff's Office's active assailant policies, procedures, response protocols and personnel training – generally and specifically for SRO's.
- Identify SRO staffing at MSD and the Westglades Middle School and how it played a role in the shooting.
- Determine SRO staffing across Broward Schools and how the district allocated its State Safe Schools funding.

Topic Number 6: Law Enforcement, Particularly Broward Sheriff's Office and Coral Springs Police Department, Off-Campus Response to MSD and Their Active Assailant Protocols

- Analyze and evaluate the off-campus law enforcement response to the MSD shooting, specifically the actions of the first personnel on scene.
- Evaluate the supervisory and command response – were proper command and control protocols followed and was command effective in scene control and searching for the suspect?
- How did radio communications interoperability affect the law enforcement response and coordination efforts?
- Did the structure of the Broward County Regional 911 system affect the response?
- How effective was the multi-agency response?



Law Enforcement Response

- On-Campus response by Deputy Scot Peterson
- Off-Campus response by the:
 - Broward County Sheriff's Office (BSO)
 - Coral Springs Police Department (CSPD)
 - Additional agencies



Investigative Sources

- BSO criminal case file
- Surveillance video
- BSO bodycam video
- Cell phone videos
- CSPD police reports

Both BSO and CSPD have completely cooperated with the investigation, provided all requested records and made all employees available for interviews.



Time analysis

- School surveillance video
- Wal-Mart surveillance video
- McDonald's surveillance video
- Broward Sheriff's Office body-worn cameras*
- Broward Sheriff's Office 911 calls and radio traffic
- Coral Springs Police Department 911 calls and radio traffic

Investigators are presenting timestamps as accurately as possible after reconciling the differences between these various systems.

*The timestamp of each BWC varies depending on the frequency of each user docking their device

Bodycams

- Also referred to as body-worn cameras or BWCs.
- Worn in the center of the chest.
- Sometimes hands or rifles will obscure the view.
- Requires the user to activate the recording.
- Few cameras ran for the duration of the response.
- Some were intentionally turned off. Others were turned off accidentally by rifle slings and then turned back on.



Videos

- There are multiple videos in the presentation.
- As the video is playing, multiple things are happening simultaneously at other locations on campus.

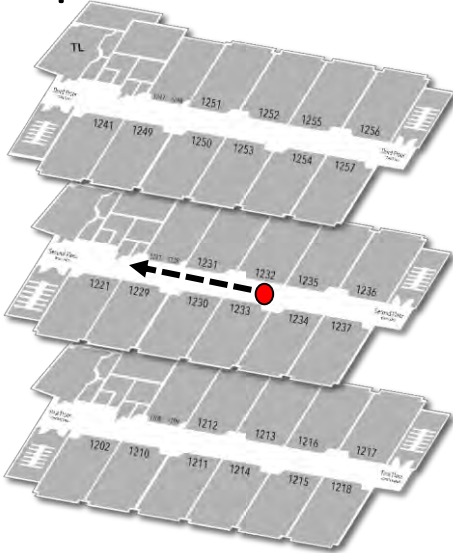


Timeline

- Events will be presented on a nearly second-by-second analysis.
- This is somewhat misleading due to the rapid and chaotic nature of the shooting and the response.
 - Examples:
 - First shots until Cruz goes to second floor, 1m 47s
 - First shots until Cruz begins shooting on third floor, 2m 54s
 - First shots until first law enforcement officers enters, 11m 4s



Maps



- All maps are oriented so the top of the map is north.
- Dots or lines which represent people are an approximation of their location or path of travel.
- In the animation, the moving dots do not directly correlate to the speed that person is traveling.

Background – Law Enforcement

- The investigators recognize that there is never a perfect law enforcement response to any incident.
- Mass casualty incidents (MCIs) are uniquely:
 - High-stress
 - Fast-paced
 - Rapidly changing
 - Involve a large number of agencies
 - Involve a tremendous number of personnel
- 943.687(3)(a): “Develop a timeline of the incident...”
- 943.687(3)(b): “Investigate any failures in incident responses by local law enforcement agencies and school resource officers.”



Background – Law Enforcement

- Ft. Lauderdale Airport Shooting was repeatedly referenced by deputies during the course of this investigation.
 - The same radio problems occurred at that shooting as on 2/14.
 - Overwhelming response to the airport resulted in congestion at the scene and hindered emergency vehicle movement.
- CSPD on February 14, 2018:
 - Chief Tony Pustizzi’s retirement was announced in November 2017.
 - Chief Pustizzi’s final day was March 02, 2018.
 - Current police chief is Clyde Parry; he was one of two deputy chiefs on 2/14.
- Do not equate the command post with the command bus.



Rule of “Plus One”

- Law enforcement officers are constantly trained to always consider there is always one more, or “plus one.”
 - After responding to a bank robbery and finding a suspect in the lobby, assume there is another one behind the counter.
 - After finding the suspect behind the counter, assume there is another suspect in the vault, etc...
- Despite hearing that Cruz fled, they must assume there is a second shooter lying in wait or who has blended in with the students.
- Also they must be aware of IEDs or secondary attacks.



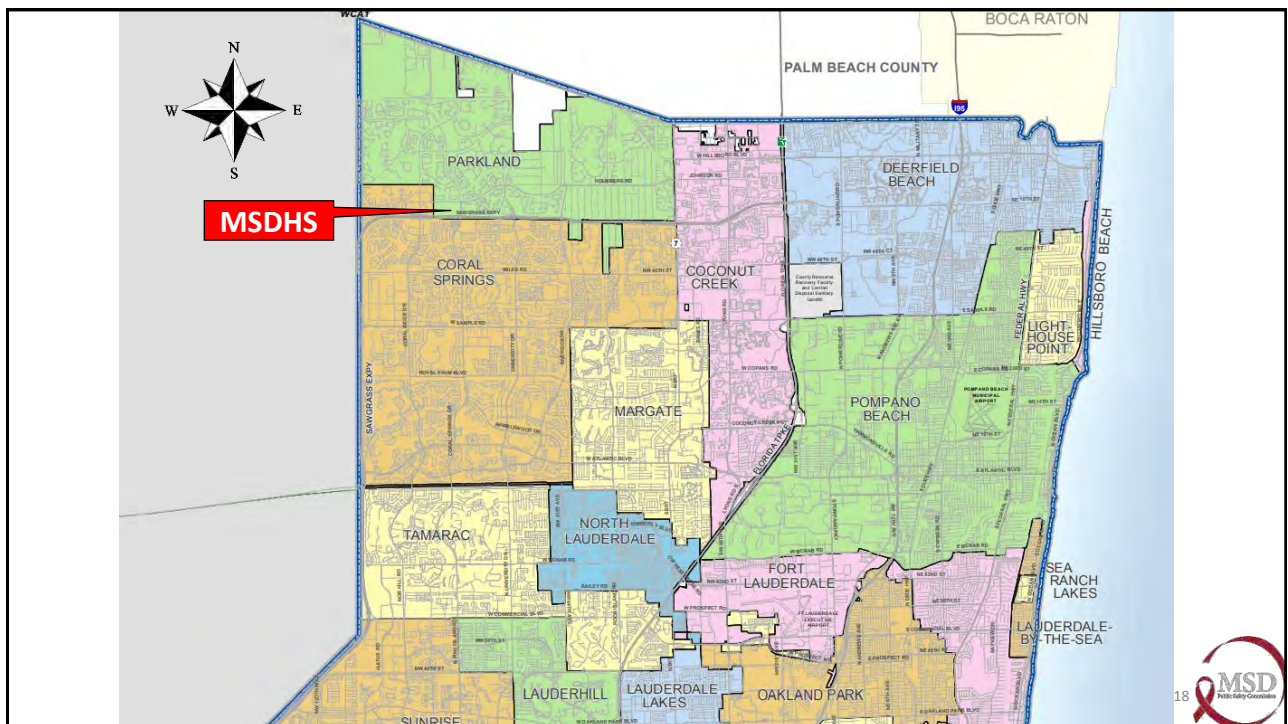
Background – MSD High School

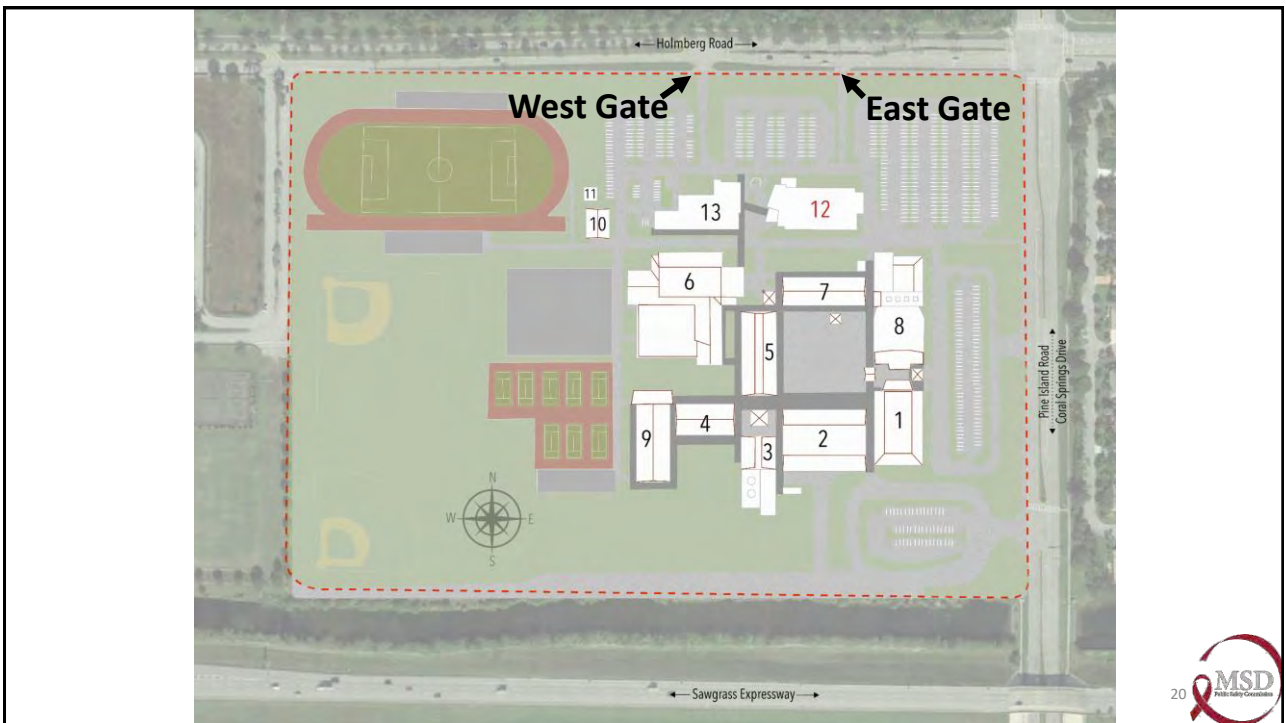
- Located in Parkland, incorporated city within Broward County
- Student population: Approximately 3,300
- Campus size: 45 acres
- Parkland contracts with:
 - Broward County Sheriff’s Office for law enforcement
 - Coral Springs Fire Department for fire services
- Surveillance cameras were motion-activated
- Building 12 (also called the 1200 building):
 - Contained 30 classrooms and numerous other offices, restrooms, storage rooms.
- Code Red and “lockdown” are often used to mean the same thing.



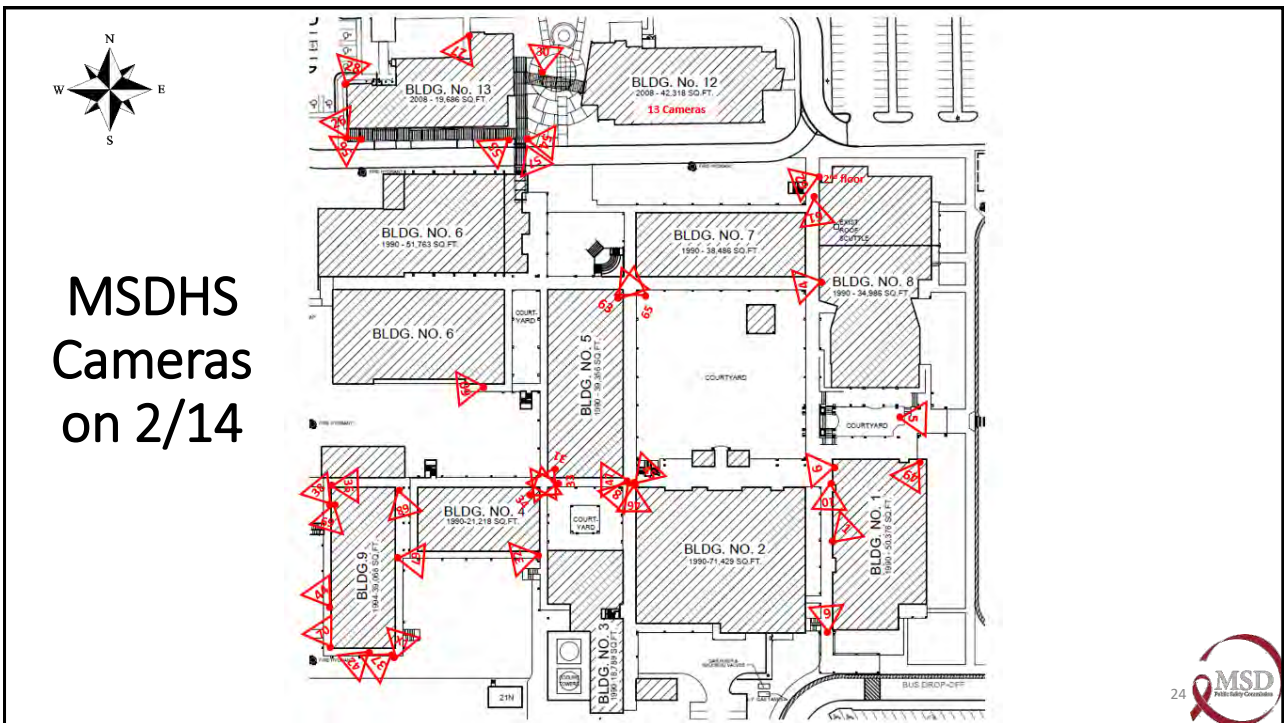

Black cameras are in the stairwells between each floor



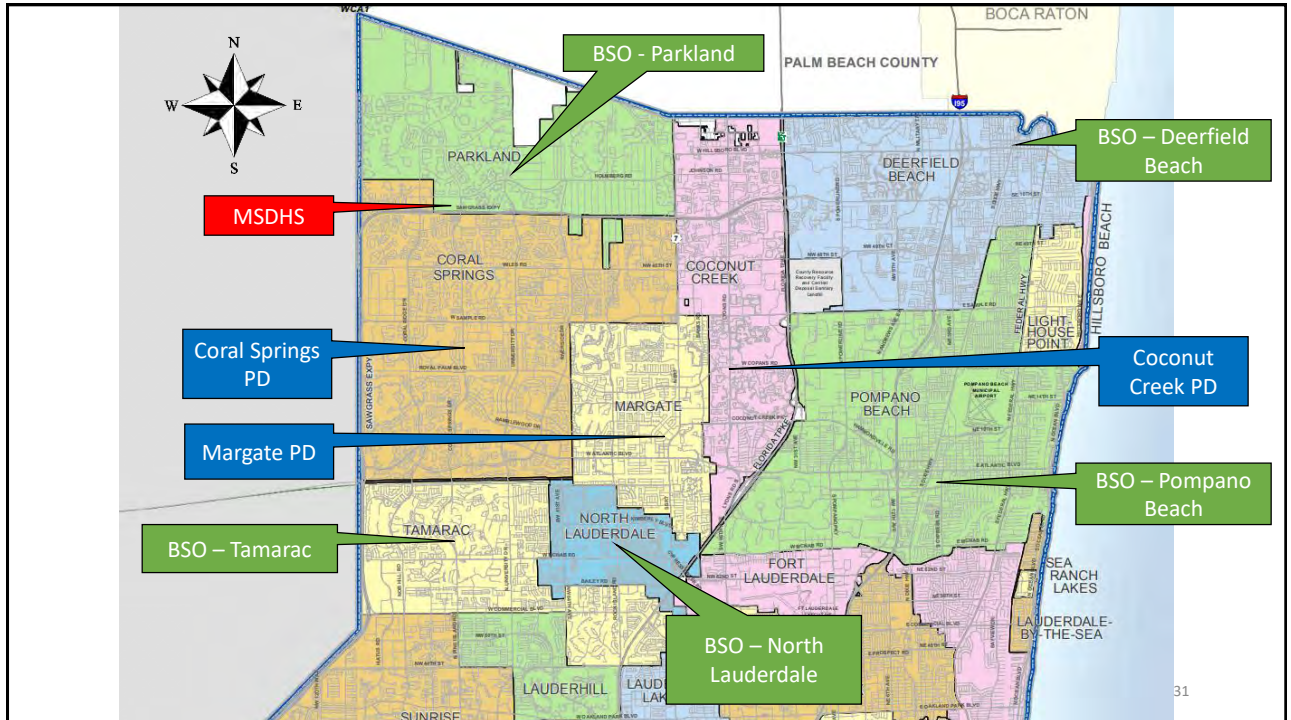

Law enforcement cameras and GPS

- Neither the Broward County Sheriff's Office nor Coral Springs Police Department had dash-mounted cameras in their cars.
- Deputies assigned to the City of Parkland did not wear body cameras.
- Deputies on the county budget and some contract cities are issued body cameras.
- Some of Broward County Sheriff's Office vehicles had GPS records.
- Coral Springs Police Department has provided their GPS records.

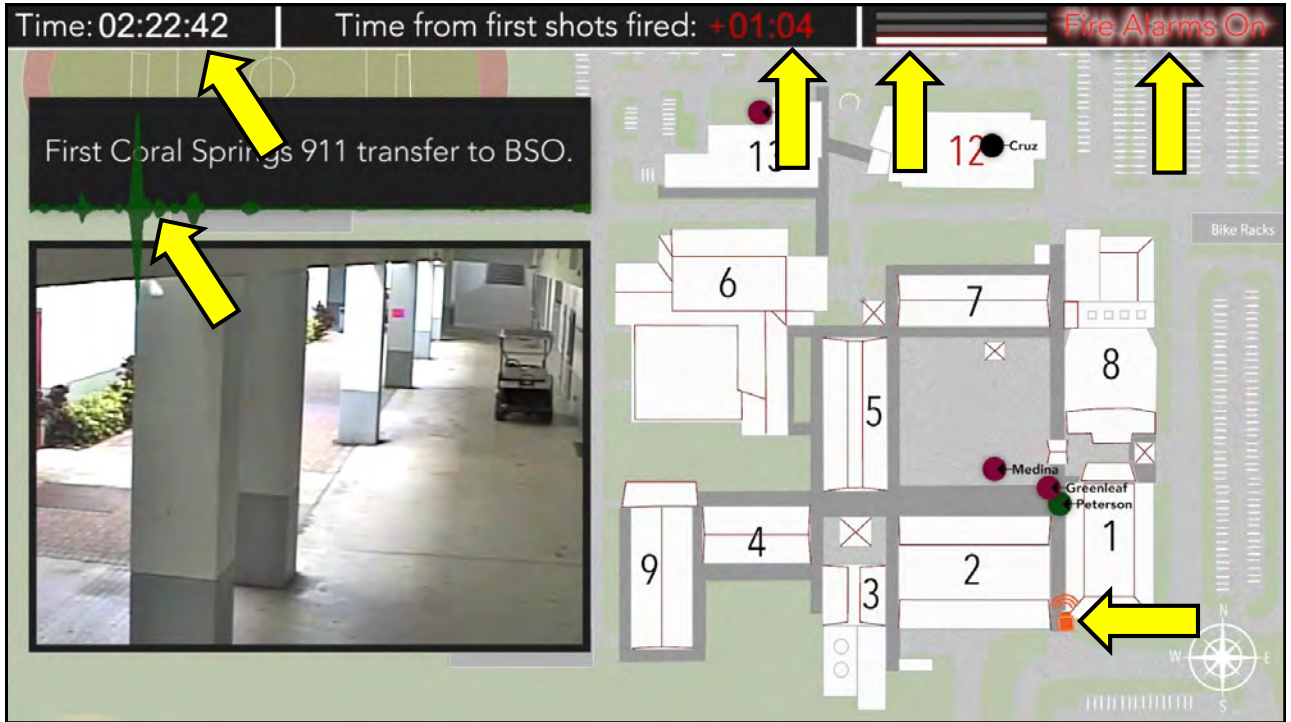

School Resource Officers/Deputies (SROs/SRDs)

- Deputy S. Peterson – MSDHS
- Deputy J. India – Westglades Middle School
 - Attending training at BSO headquarters on 2/14
- SROs carry an agency radio and a school radio.
 - School radios are not recorded.
- Surveillance video clearly shows Deputy Peterson had both radios.
- Bodycam video recorded some school radio transmissions from nearby users.

Deputy Peterson's Interviews to BSO Friday, February 16th

- *Note: Interview was conducted prior to BSO reviewing school video including exterior video which showed Peterson's movement on campus.*
- He was waiting in/near building 1 for the father of a student to arrive.
- Heard Medina on school radio say he thinks he hears a firecracker in the 1200 building.
- Stated that he ran out of his door and met up with Greenleaf.
- While running north the fire alarm activated.
- Stated that he and Greenleaf ran the entire way to building 12. Based on video we know that he got onto a golf cart with Medina.
- Upon getting within approximately 10 feet of building 12 he heard gunfire.
- Stated that the gunfire was so "clear and loud at that point I knew it was close to this building but I wasn't even sure if it was in the building, was it outside the building but I knew it was close."



Deputy Peterson's Interviews to BSO Friday, February 16th

- Did not see muzzle flashes or see anything coming from the windows.
- *How many rounds do you think you heard?* "It wasn't many, two, three."
- Broadcasts shots fired, describes building and directs other deputies to shut down Pine Island Rd. and Holmberg Rd.
- Tells Greenleaf to get away since he's unarmed.
- Peterson claimed he was on the school radio "yelling lockdown, lockdown, code red, code red." It's disputed that this took place as all other witnesses have said Bonner first called the code red.
- Describes taking a tactical position on northeast corner of building 7.
- "...my concern was because I didn't know if the shots were coming out of the building, or were they coming somewhere out on this west side somewhere cause it sounded like it might've been even outside."



Deputy Peterson's Interviews to BSO Friday, February 16th

- "I'm keeping cover on the east side of the building to keep them cover with my firearm directed towards the doors....if the shooter...was going to come out of this door."
- Officer Burton arrived.
- Additional law enforcement arrived.
- Heard radio traffic about football fields, speculated the shooter fled that direction.
- After Lt. Devita arrived he ran up to the building.
- Handed off his keys to someone on the east side of building 12.
- Described having AP Morford review surveillance video.



Deputy Peterson - Today Show interview June 05 and 06

- "As we approached near...near the building, I hear two to three loud shots. I immediately stop and I'm thinking to myself, 'Oh my God I hear shots outside.'"
- "I thought they were gunshots and I thought they were outside immediately, and the first thing I thought was (unintelligible)...shooting at us."
- "I remember it in my mind thinking like the Las Vegas shooting, I thought to myself, is someone shooting out from the windows?"
- "Because it's so difficult, Savannah, to be out...when you're outside there...and and that building, it's a three story, it's a hurricane proof building. You can...it's hard to even hear."



Deputy Peterson - Today Show interview June 05 and 06

- "...it's a very thick glass, but like I said...those shots I heard I was like immediately, I thought they were outside. I didn't know where they were coming from, if they were coming from the 1200 building..."
- After pointing out that Peterson referred to the 1200 building three times on the radio, Peterson stated:
 - "Because I, I believe there was a sniper. So, in my mind, I'm thinking to myself there's possibly maybe somebody up in there shooting out...but I didn't think they were shooting at the kids, I thought they were shooting out at the building...outside."



Deputy Peterson - Today Show interview June 05 and 06

Peterson: "...I didn't know if it was in there, I didn't know if it was outside..."

Guthrie: "Why not check it out?"

Peterson: "What I was trained is you contain the area."

This is inconsistent with BSO's active-shooter policies and the training BSO provided to Peterson.



Deputy Peterson - Today Show interview June 05 and 06

Guthrie: “I get that you didn't know but you think there's a chance there's a shooter shooting out from building 12, rather than stand there why not run up there and see if there is?”

Peterson: “It just never even dawned on me those initial first few minutes because I never believed there was even an active shooter inside.”

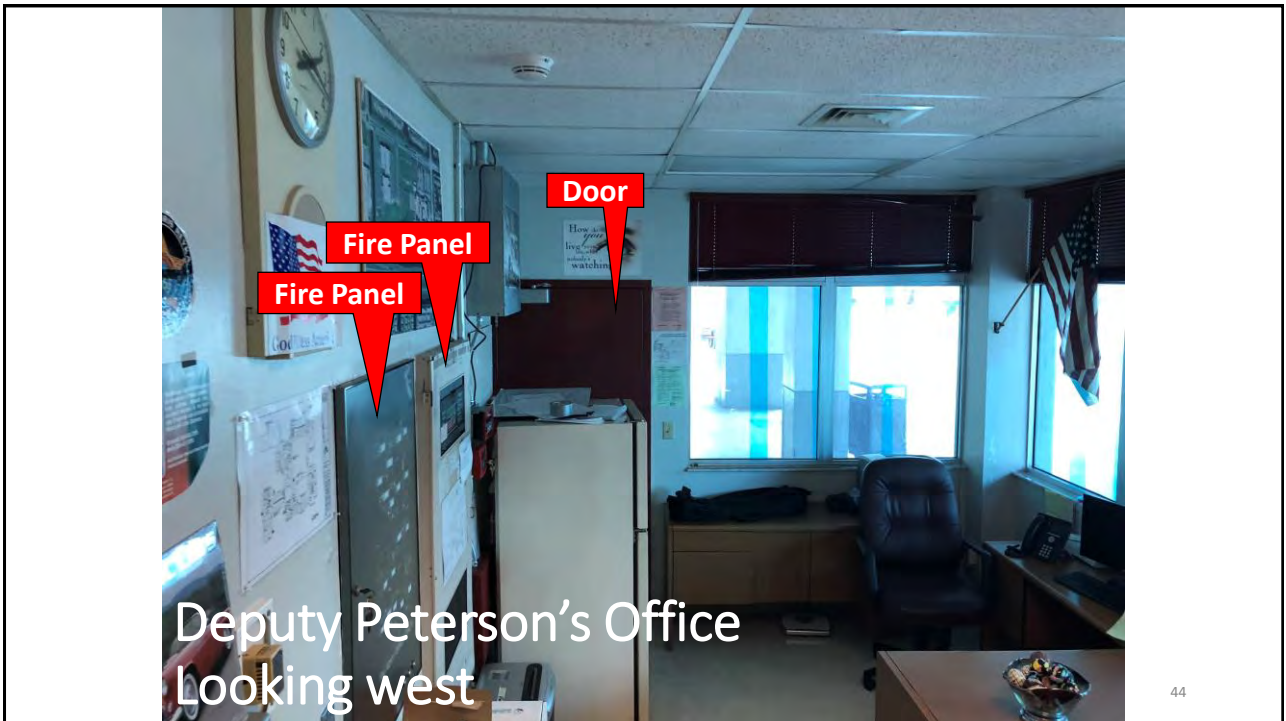
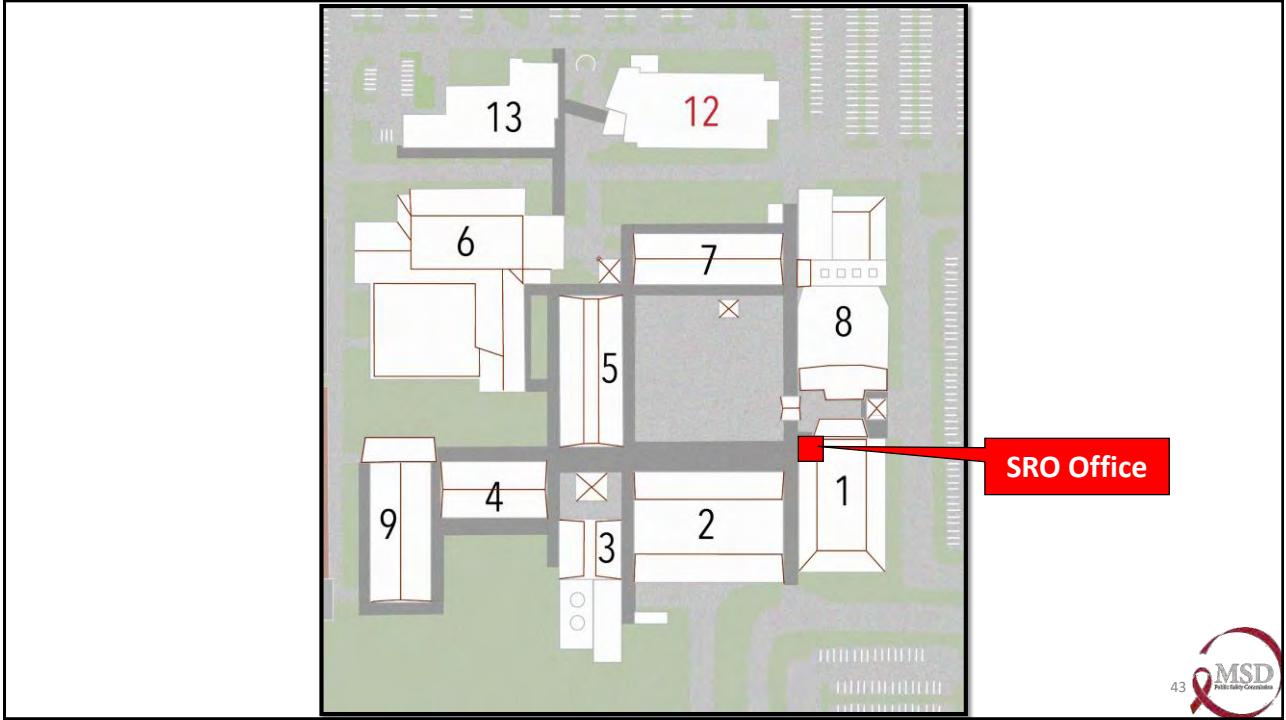


Deputy Peterson - Today Show interview June 05 and 06

Guthrie: “Why did it not occur to you that it could be an active school shooter when we've had so many school shootings and you would have all that training? Why wasn't that the first thing you thought, ‘my goodness...its happened here.’”

Peterson: “Right. It..it really wasn't because when I heard those shots outside, I didn't even think that someone was inside the building. And it just didn't even...those first several minutes, because my mind was racing.”

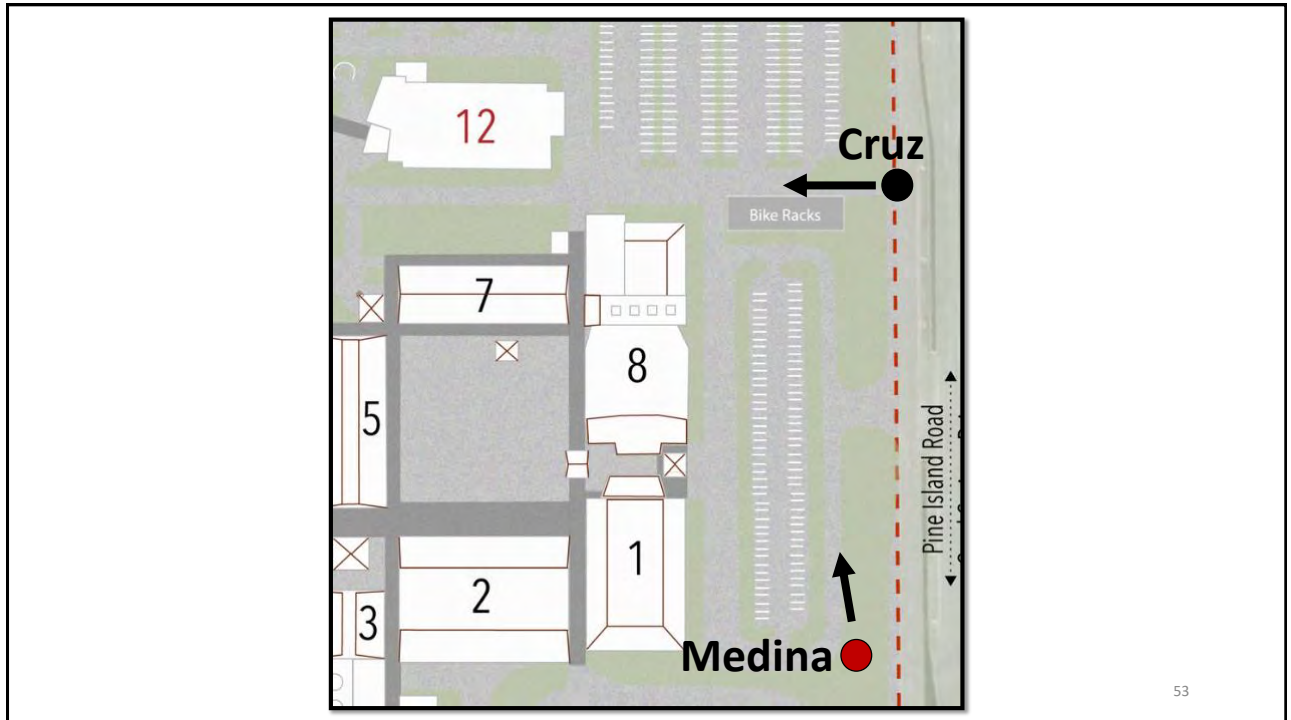
- Medina denied having any history with guns, hunting or the military.
- History with Cruz:
 - Unaware of Cruz bringing knives, ammo to school.
 - Unaware of Cruz threatening to shoot up the school.
 - Heard rumors of Cruz hurting animals.
 - Previous year the campus monitors had a discussion that if anyone would shoot-up the school, it would be Cruz.
 - Referred to Cruz as “that crazy kid.”
 - Described Cruz wearing a camouflage mask and scaring students.



Interviews of: Andrew Medina, Campus Monitor

- Medina was near Pine Island Rd. south of administration parking lot.
- Saw Uber car stopped on Pine Island Rd.
- Cruz walked onto campus through pedestrian gate which Medina opened minutes earlier.
- Once Cruz got onto campus he started jogging west.
- Medina radioed Taylor “suspicious kid” on campus - suspicious because he kept his head lowered down. Medina was still near the south end of the parking administration parking lot.
- Medina Drove north in his golf cart to approach Cruz.
- Radioed to David Taylor that someone was approaching building 12.

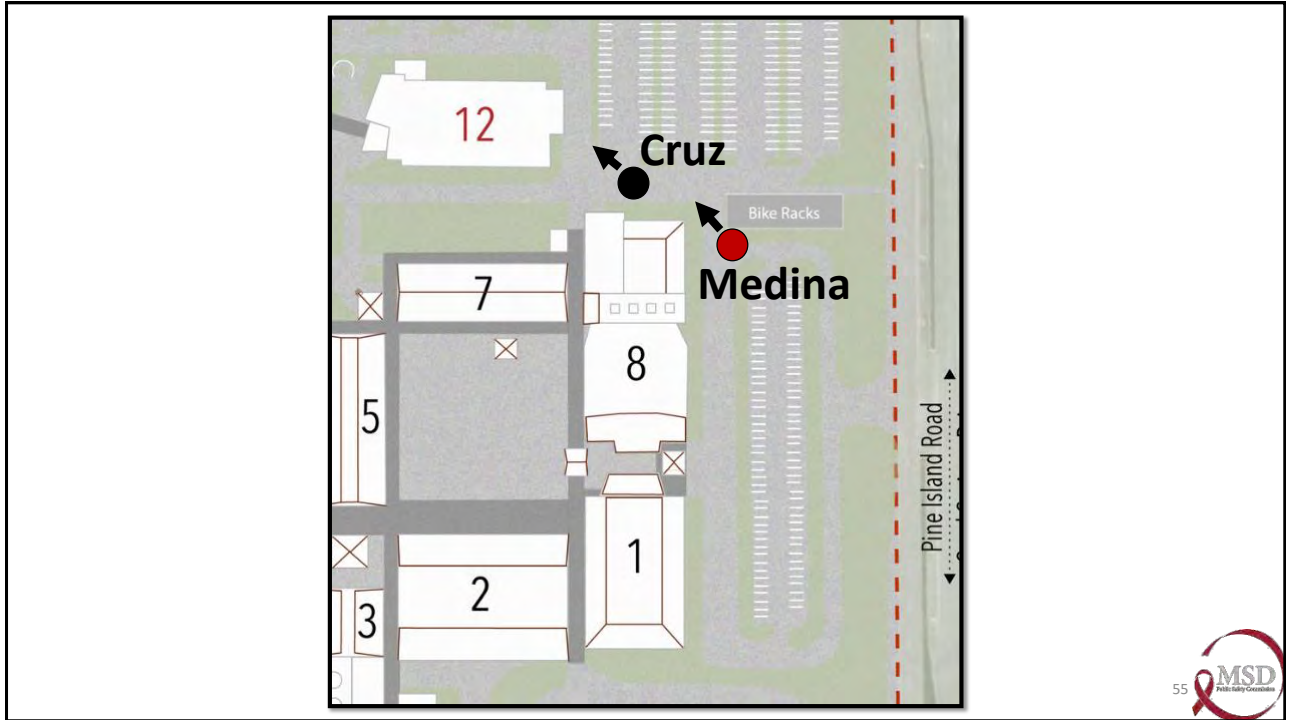

Interviews of: Andrew Medina, Campus Monitor

- Recognized Cruz after Cruz passed by the bike rack and Medina's cart went up the curb causing Cruz to turn and look at Medina.
- Medina recognized Cruz's face but could not recall his name at that time.
- Cruz was north of building 8 as Medina was south of bike rack when Cruz looked back.
- Medina was too far away to say anything to Cruz.
- BSO interview: Cruz was carrying a "nice-sized duffle bag". Sometimes ROTC and color guard carries similar bags.
- BSO interview: Cruz was not a student, withdrawn the prior year due to ongoing issues.
- MSDPSC interview: Was unaware whether Cruz was or was not a student.

Interviews of: Andrew Medina, Campus Monitor

- Taylor asked which side Cruz was coming in and Medina told him the east side.
- After seeing Medina and looking back forward, Cruz ran toward building 12.
- Medina continued toward building 12 when he heard the first shots.
- He turned south toward the courtyard and radioed there were “suspicious noises” coming from building 12.
- Additional unidentified staff got on radio talking about the noise possibly being firecrackers.
- Medina did not call a code red, he was focused on going to get help.
- First heard Bonner call a code red when he was en route to Peterson. We know this to not be true.



Interviews of: Andrew Medina, Campus Monitor

- Told Peterson what Cruz was wearing, did not recall Peterson saying anything to him.
- It occurred to Medina that they were gunshots while approaching building 12 with Peterson.
- After dropping Peterson off near the water pipes, Peterson told him to leave.
- Heard Peterson repeatedly saying “active shooter” on his BSO radio. We know Peterson said “shots fired.”
- He quickly left and did not see what Peterson did or did not do.



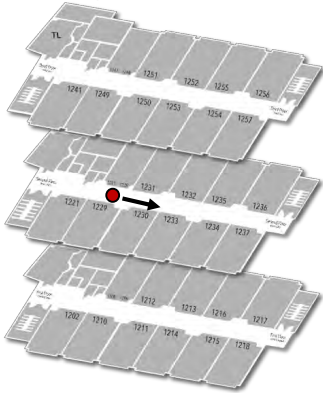
Interviews of: Andrew Medina, Campus Monitor

- Quotes from BSO interview:
 - “Something inside me told me not to approach him”
 - “Report like...do what we’ve been taught...report it.”
 - “Just let him go, and report it and make sure your boy inside (Coach Taylor) is good...I called him on the radio, ‘Coach Taylor, be careful because a suspicious kid’s coming inside that building.’”
 - “I really wish I would have stopped him before and we would have saved all those...but there wasn’t really anything I could do about that. I was just doing my job of what they trained us to do.”
 - “I don’t know if he had a handgun. Maybe he could have had a handgun in the pocket.”

- Campus Monitor David Taylor was on the west end of the second floor.
- He began to use his radio and walked toward the east end of the hall guarding the bathrooms due to vaping issues.



Interviews of: David Taylor, Campus Monitor

- History with Cruz:
 - Unaware of Cruz bringing knives or ammunition to school.
 - Unaware of Cruz threatening to shoot up the school.
 - Recalled conversation among campus monitors and AP Morford last year about Cruz's potential to be a school shooter.
 - They joked that Cruz would likely come for AP Morford first because Morford frequently had issues with Cruz.



Interviews of: David Taylor, Campus Monitor

- Notified by Medina of a suspicious young man on campus and another transmission about him coming to building 12.
- No description over the radio about him carrying anything.
- Went down the west stairs and down the hall and saw someone in burgundy shirt carrying a three foot long duffle bag.
- Did not recognize Cruz as he entered through the door.
- Turned to go up the west stairs in order to cut-off Cruz.
- Heard gunshots while in the stairwell and fled into closet.
- Heard someone over the PA telling people this was not a drill and they needed to evacuate.



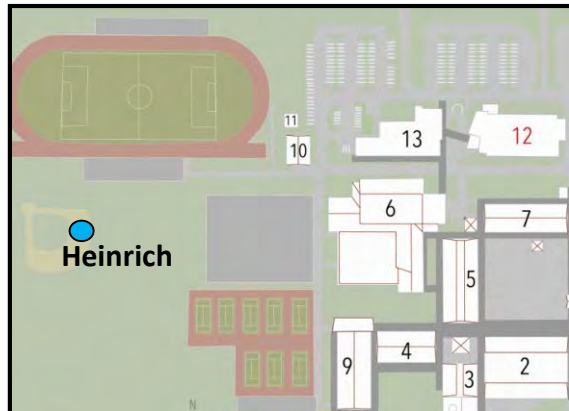
Interviews of: David Taylor, Campus Monitor

- Never heard a code red called over the PA.
- Heard AP Porter announce the evacuation order before he heard the code red called on the radio.
- Heard transmissions on the radio about firecrackers, perhaps two or three people and one of them was female.
- Believes he also made a transmission saying they were not firecrackers.
- Heard Peterson asking for radio silence while he spoke with someone in camera room.
- Believes he heard Coach Bonner say "Coach Feis is down."
- Definitely heard Coach Bonner say "That's not fireworks. That's gunfire. Code red. Code Red. Code Red."



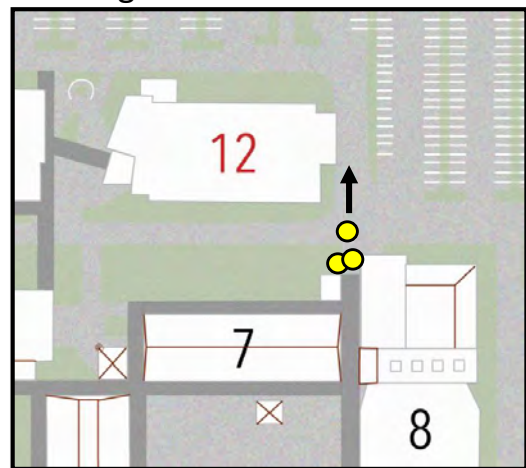

- Greenleaf exited building 1 but did not hear gunshots at that point.
- Told Peterson he was going to AP Rosario's office to get a key for a cart.
- Once Medina picked them up, Medina and Peterson were in conversation on the cart but he could not hear what they were saying.

- He made a u-turn to his right in the golf cart and did not see anything which Peterson did or did not do.



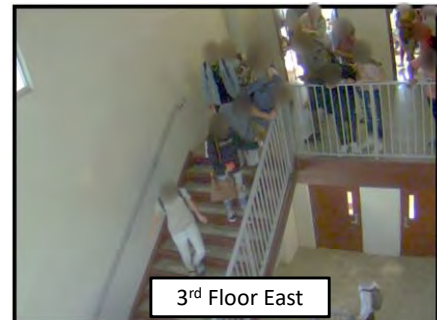
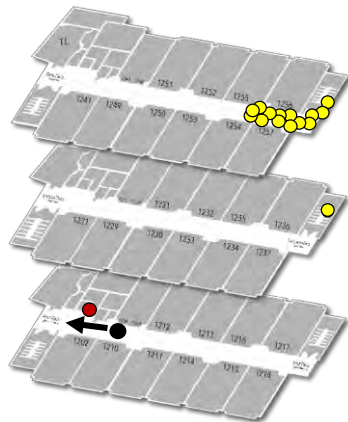
Interviews of: Kelvin Greenleaf, Security Specialist

- Greenleaf stated that Medina dropped he and Peterson off between buildings 7, 8 and 12.
- Peterson told him to get back since he did not have a weapon.
- Peterson did not approach east doors, did not look into the windows, did not access keys or ask Greenleaf for his keys.
- Peterson had his weapon out and seemed "stressed."
- Greenleaf heard 5- 7 gunshots coming from building 12.
- Bonner was the first to call a code red. Greenleaf repeated it over the radio at least twice. No one acknowledged the code red.
- PA system cannot be heard outside in common areas.

- Believed shooter was outside due to the way the shots sounded and because Peterson was directing roads to be shut down.
- Got behind his vehicle and put on his vest.
- Saw Deputies Seward and Hanks and Hanks told him that he was going in.

- Was working as an SRO at Park Trails Elementary School when he heard the radio transmissions (1.3 miles from MSDHS).
- Put on vest, collected rifle and magazines.
- Upon arrival, saw Detective Goolsby on Holmberg Rd near his trunk.
- Deputy Perry parked in left hand turn lane which accessed west gate.
- Heard approximately 3 – 5 shots while exiting car/approaching gate.
- Saw Sgt. Heinrich in NE parking lot, Heinrich was the “parent” Perry referenced on the radio.
- Heinrich yelled to Perry and Goolsby from the fence.
- Heard radio traffic about football field.



Interviews of: Deputy Perry

- Goolsby had keys to gate and unlocked the west gate.
- Never saw Deputies Marchese, Kratz or Eason on scene.
- Heard Deputy Peterson identifying building 12 but Perry says he thought building 12 was actually building 9.
- Perry transmitted “We’re just going to building 13 and the 900 building.”
- Perry thought the shots were coming from the area north of the basketball courts based on:
 - Hearing the shots

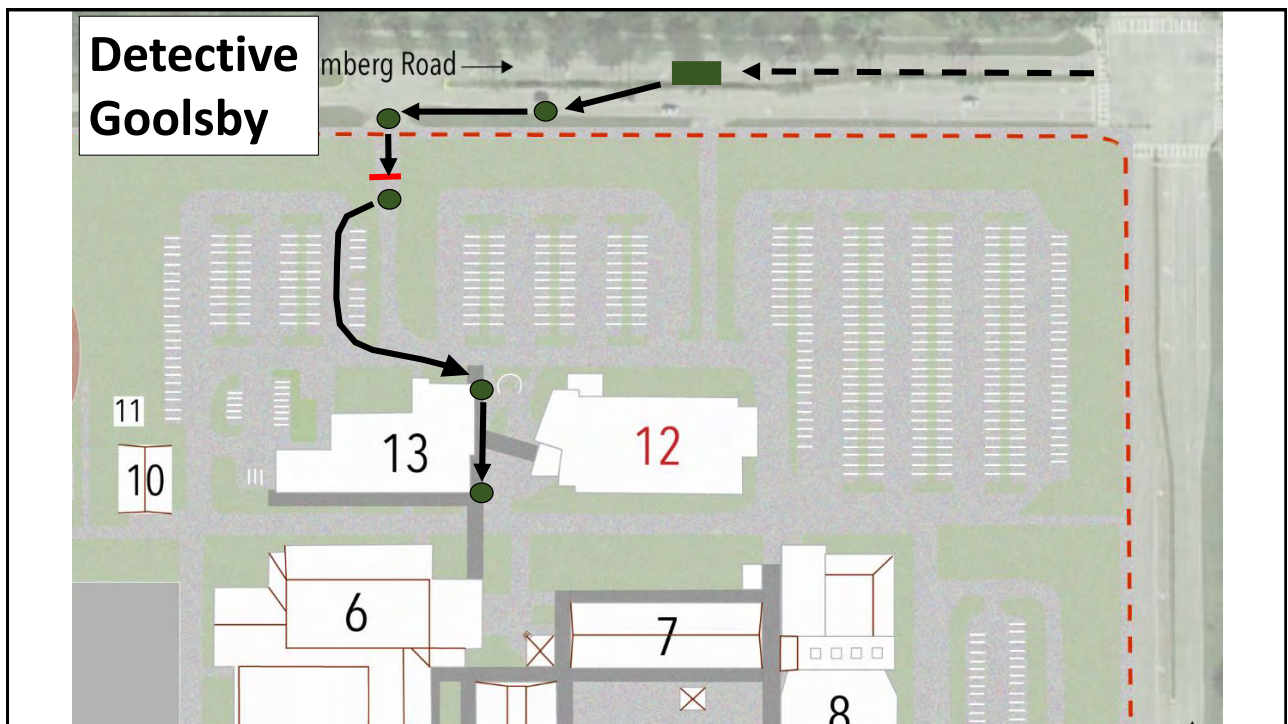

- Approached a position behind (north of) a car on the north side of building 13 “waiting for people to arrive and we’re looking because we’re hearing nothing.”

- He thought that someone had been on the west side of building 13 shooting at building 12 and Coach Feis.
- When asked why he did not approach the basketball court where he thought the shots were coming from, he stated that was what Detective Goolsby was continuing to that location.



Interviews of: Deputy Perry

- One CSPD officer approached to his east and a group ran past him toward building 12. This group included CSPD, Deputies Volpe and Hanks.
- In a later interview with CSPD Officer Wilkins, he described someone consistent in appearance with Deputy Perry standing behind a tree who told Ofc. Wilkins and Detective Monzon “we all can’t stand behind this tree, we’re gonna get shot.”
- Perry did not join CSPD and Deputy Volpe approaching building 12 because:
 - “If I leave this area, he can run out the gate, he can circle back around and ambush, someone has to do an overwatch...If I leave this spot, who’s going to cover this area?”
- Captain Jordan later joined him behind the car.

Interviews of: Detective Goolsby

- Was at his desk at the Parkland District when he heard the call.
- Parked on Holmberg Rd between the west and east gates.
- Upon reaching the west gate he heard the final five gunshots. Believed shots were coming from between buildings 12 and 13.
- Perry was nearby as Goolsby used a key to unlock the gate.
- Saw Laman and Heinrich, tried to get intelligence from Laman. Directed them to continue west to the other deputies.
- He went south towards the southeast corner of building 13 and saw the holes in the building 12 windows but was not sure of directionality.
- After continuing to building 13, he lost track of Perry.



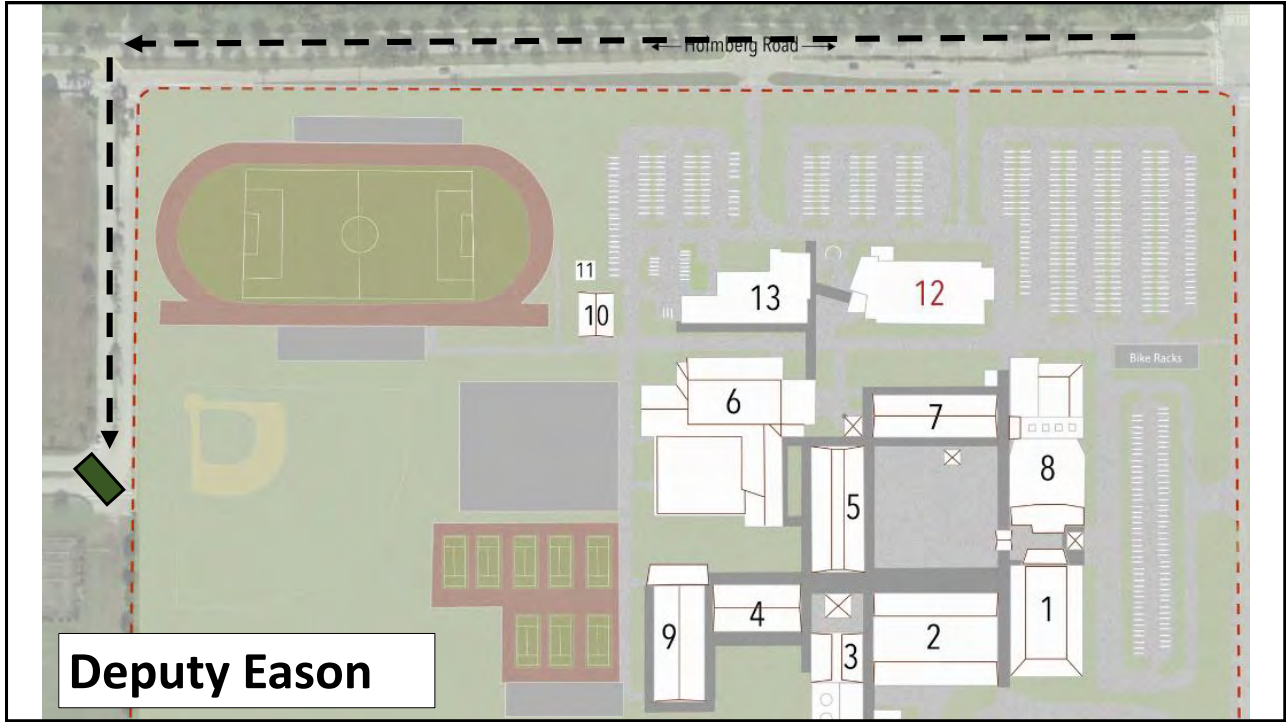
Interviews of: Detective Goolsby

- Goolsby did not advance further south onto campus as he had not heard shots for a couple of minutes.
- Goolsby was approached by Officer Harrison and they checked the doors to building 13 which were locked.
- He did not recall hearing much radio traffic at all and did not hear anything about building 12. He knew building 12 as the 900 building.
- CSPD officers ran to check Feis and spoke about getting into building 12 which didn't make sense to him, due to Feis being outside and Laman being outside he anticipated the shooter was outside.
- Deputy Volpe joined officers on west end of building 12 with Hixon.
- Goolsby maintained coverage to the south as they went in.



Interviews of: Detective Goolsby

- Goolsby later went to check on Feis again and looked into building 12 where he saw several officers advancing through the building.
- He later saw Captain Jordan among cars north of building 13.
- McKeone and Heinrich (CSPD) joined him from the south.
- Goolsby almost shot Heinrich due to Heinrich's clothing.
- He then broadcasted for all responding officers to come from the north.



Deputy E. Eason

18 years with Broward SO

Active shooter training: April 28, 2016



Interviews of: Deputy Eason

- Previously the SRO at Westglades Middle School.
- Reviewed his bodycam footage prior to the MSD-PSC interview.
- Was leaving Heron Heights Elementary where he was assisting with traffic control and going east to handle another call.
- Could not recall where he was when he activated his bodycam.
- Initially said he could not recall if he had to put on his vest.
- Later in same interview, “I believe I put on my vest when I got there so I had to redo the camera when I arrived on scene, I had actually put my camera off my shirt and put it onto the vest. So, it took a few seconds to do that, I had to find a place to put it on.”



Interviews of: Deputy Eason

- Said that he “probably” had his windows down in his car.
- Passed a deputy and other patrol vehicles on Holmberg.
- Not issued a rifle.
- In one interview, described hearing shots after getting out of his car, “as soon as I got there” and from the direction of the high school.
- In another interview:
 - He claimed he could not tell where the gunshots were coming from or where he was when he heard them.
 - “I’m not sure exactly when I heard (gunshots) if I was approaching the school or when I got there but it could have been anywhere between six and a dozen total.”



Interviews of: Deputy Eason

- Q: *What made you park there (west side of MSD campus) versus anywhere else on that campus?*
- A: "I believe when I was getting there I heard a deputy say 'shots by the football field.'"
- Evidence contradicts his claim:
 - 2:24:35: Kratz says that he's shutting down Holmberg between WMS and MSD
 - 2:24:40: Eason says he'll go to the west side of MSD on Holmberg
 - 2:25:08: Kratz says he hears shots by the football field



Interviews of: Deputy Eason

- Said that his focus was on the football field and he was worried middle school kids might have been outside as well "...I was the SRO there and I knew upon responding that the SRO was not on scene at that school."
- Evidence contradicts his claim:
 - 2:28:03: Eason's bodycam began recording once he's at WMS.
 - 2:32:08: Eason asks Deputy India (WMS-SRO) over the radio if he has the school locked down.

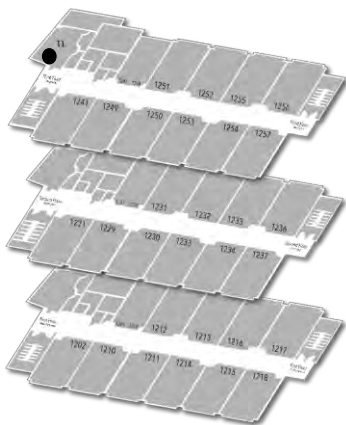

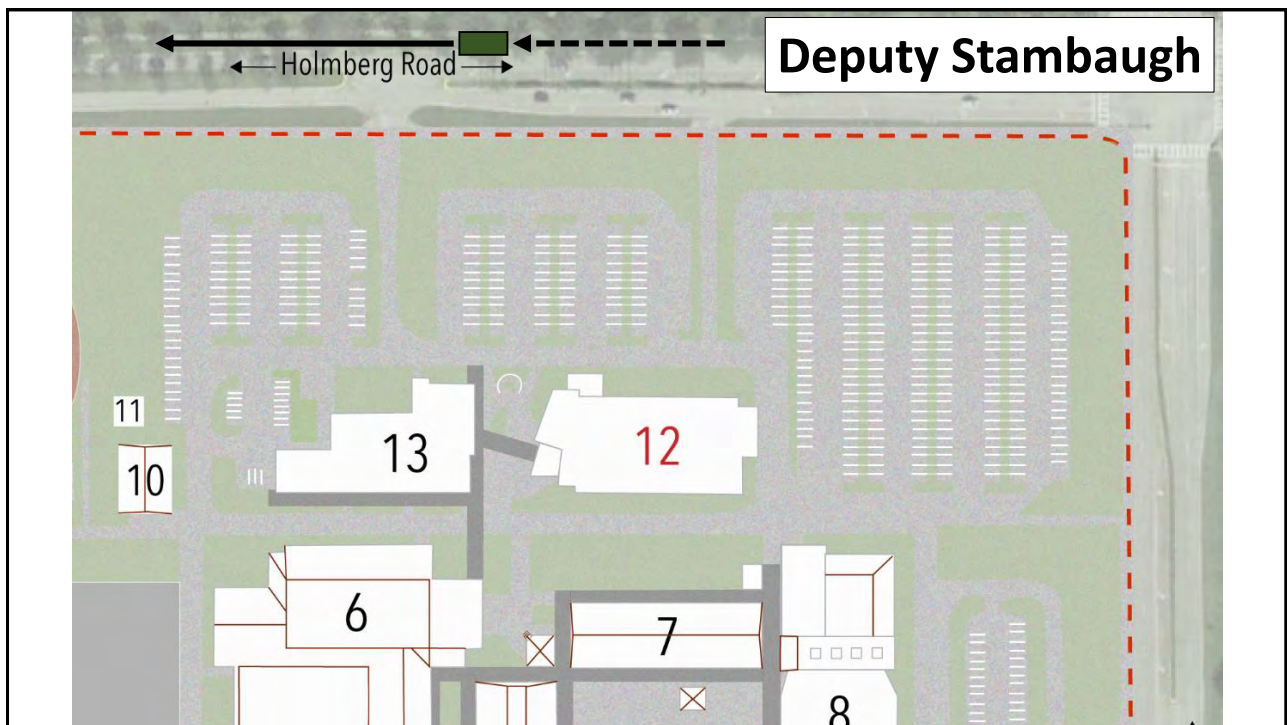

Interviews of: Deputy Stambaugh

- While waiting by his vehicle he called for another deputy/officer to come over by him.
- It appears that a CSPD officer pulled up next to him, exited his car and then moved south towards the campus.
- He claimed in an interview that dispatch asked several times for someone to go the Sawgrass Expressway and that was why he went there.
- We know there was a single request to have someone on the Sawgrass Expwy. and 12 seconds after that request, he responded saying he would go.
- Chief Babinec (CSFD) approached him and Stambaugh told him that there's "three people down" and that Babinec needed to go further west.
- It took Stambaugh 5m 30s to get to his position on the Sawgrass Expwy.

- After checking Schentrup, Medic Bradley exits room 1213.



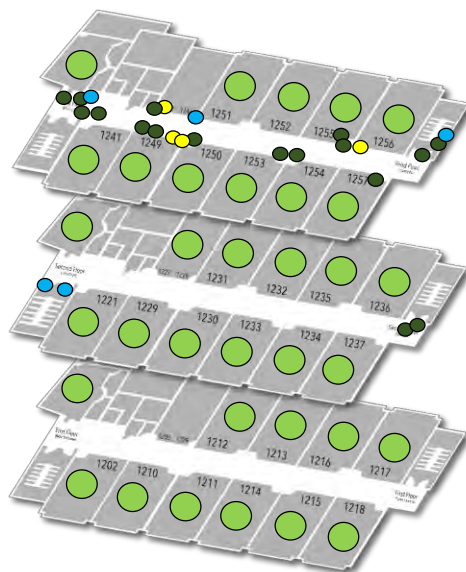

- Deputy Chief Lees (Coconut Creek PD) approaches Sgt. Rossman and Lt. Feeley beneath the Sawgrass Expressway.
- He asks “is the CP (command post) here?” and he’s told it is.



Interview of: Deputy Chief G. Lees (Coconut Creek PD)

- Retired from BSO after nearly 30 years. Former SWAT commander.
- Stated that upon his arrival he saw SWAT medics removing victims from building 12.
- Directed his SWAT commander to the TOC and he went to locate CP.
- Saw Lt. DeVita on Pine Island who directed him to the CP which he said was beneath the Sawgrass Expressway.



Interview of: Deputy Chief G. Lees (Coconut Creek PD)

- Met with DCs Parry and Backer near the CSPD command bus.
- He could not recall who from BSO was present at that time.
- Conceded that these operations are always chaos and things go wrong, they can be “confusing, overwhelming, a lot of personnel, a lot of staffing.”
- Initially, no one he spoke with could identify to him who the IC was.
- “It seemed like Coral Springs...was running the show from what I could see, for the most part.”



3:10:20 (+ 48m 42s)

- Chief Pustizzi and Deputy Chief Backer met in the middle of Pine Island Rd. approximately 120 yards north of the command post.
- DC Backer said after leaving the east side of building 1 he went to the south side of campus to assist in setting up a perimeter.
- DC Backer left building 1 at 2:41 according to Sgt. Rossman's BWC, elapsed time of approx. 29 minutes.



3:11:04 (+ 49m 26s)

- After approaching numerous rooms and expressing confusion over which rooms have been cleared, Detective Polo stated aloud they need "spray paint or a marker or something."



3:11:20 (+ 49m 42s)

- Deputy Peterson ran north from building 7 to the east side of building 12.
- This is the first indication that Peterson left his position despite an overwhelming law enforcement presence.

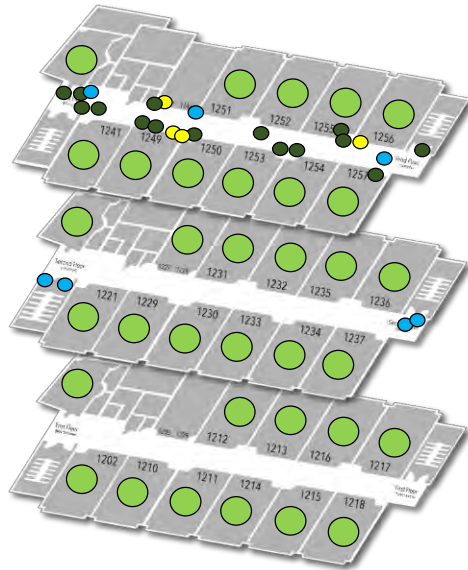


Interview of: Lieutenant Cardinale, Sunrise PD

- Arrived on the east side of building 12 and at some point saw Deputy Peterson.
- He described a deputy as pacing back and forth, breathing heavily.
- He asked the deputy who he was and he said "I'm the SRO."
- Lt. Cardinale asked Peterson "What's the deal? What's going on?" and Peterson said "I don't know. I don't know...oh my God, I can't believe this."

- CSPD SWAT Medic I. Ceciliano asked Detective Polo on the first floor, “where do you guys need a medic?”
- Medic Ceciliano stated “I don’t have comms (radio communication) with anybody.”

- Captain Soberon (CSPD) approached Sgt. Rossman beneath the Sawgrass Expressway and asked him which channel they're using.

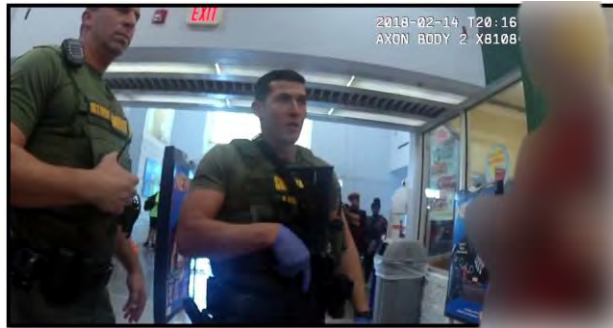

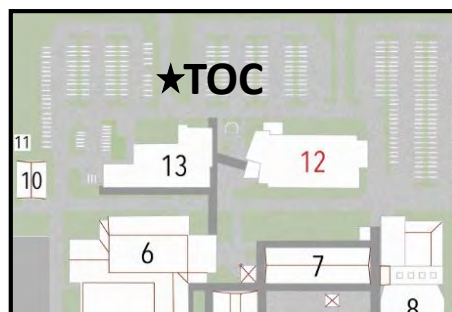

Colonel Polan: Identified himself as the incident commander and stated he's at the tactical operations center.



Interview of: Colonel Polan

- Was walking to the movie theater when he got a call from Major Osgood notifying him of the shooting.
- Listened to the radio and attempted to locate the IC.
- Described radio, throttling problems during his response.
- Parked north of Westglades Middle School and walked to the TOC where he met with Captains Robson and Jordan.
- They both provided him with a brief summary.
- When he arrived, believed Cruz was still in building 12.



Interview of: Colonel Polan

- Only identified Captain Lasseter (BSO SWAT Medic) as fire/rescue command staff at the TOC.
- Had no recollection of discussion about a rescue task force with Captain Jordan or anyone else.
- He was aware that SWAT medics were inside building 12.
- He never had knowledge of any void in medical care.



Colonel Polan on Rescue Task Force:

Q: *Do you recall while you are in the TOC any conversation about the use of rescue task force to go inside building 12?*

A: "Do not...and if there would have been, I wouldn't have agreed to it anyway."



Colonel Polan on Rescue Task Force:

Q: *Can you explain why, please?*

A: "The building is still hot, without a doubt it's still hot, and we still believe we have a shooter inside. It's a multi-floored structure with a minimum of two different entrances. And there is no possible way that I would agree to put a rescue task force into that atmosphere. You know, God forbid, you got an east and west door, and you bring a team into the east, and I bring a team into the west, the bad guy is in the middle, there's kids running everywhere, bad things can happen...So I'm not going to put a rescue task force in that atmosphere."



Interview of: Colonel Polan

- Directed Captain Jordan to set up a command post on Pine Island Rd.
- Her primary role was to ensure the perimeter was secure. The CP location also gave her access to the staging area beneath the Sawgrass Expressway.
- They spoke over the radio and phones, both devices failed at various times.
- Colonel Polan remained at the TOC as the incident commander until around 9pm.
- Described that clearing the entire campus was his priority at the TOC.



Interview of: Colonel Polan

- Changes made since February 14:
 - SRO chain-of-command has been brought under the operational branch of BSO and away from Community Services.
 - Reached an agreement with BCPS to put safes for rifles in each school.
 - Each SRO has been issued a carbine to carry on campus in a bag.

- Deputy Pianelli spoke with Captain Morse about the frustration of CSPD having more current information than BSO.

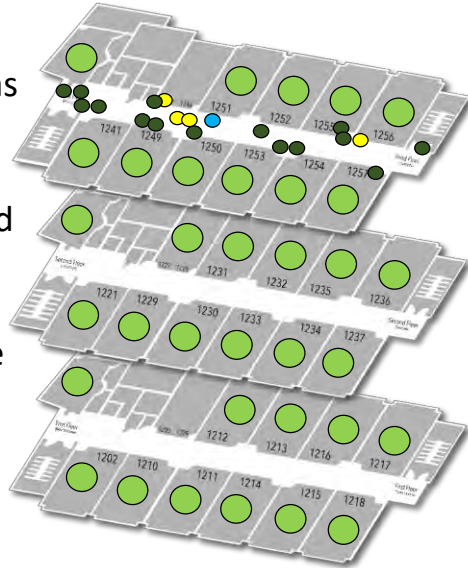

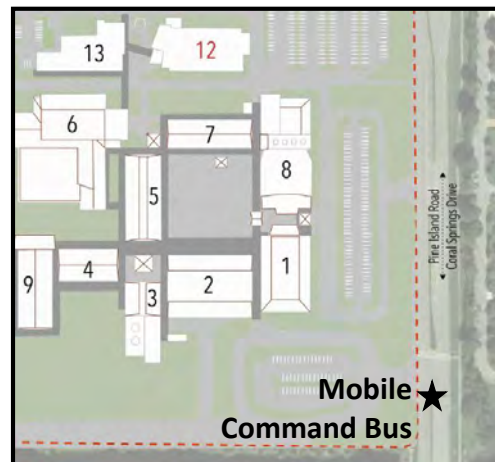

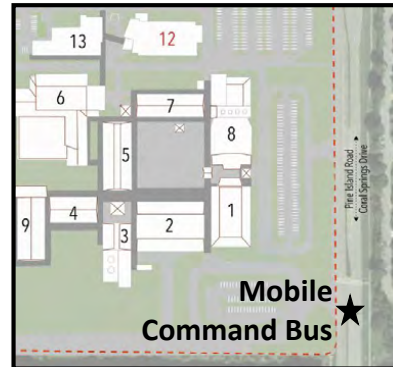

Interview of: Captain Jordan

- Viewed herself as the person responsible for setting-up and coordination of supporting roles at the mobile command bus.
- Viewed her primary role as:
 - Finding a safe place for fleeing students
 - Identifying witnesses for the investigation
 - Family reunification
 - PIO/Media relations
- Jordan identified Colonel Polan as the overall incident commander.
- Described multiple commanders from various agencies being present.



Interviews of: Captain G. Soberon (CSPD)

- Once the command buses were set-up, CSPD turned-over operations to BSO which was the first time he saw Captain Jordan.
- His assessment was that BSOs supervisors/command staff got too entrenched in the operation and did establish command-and-control.
- It did not appear that BSO has a single person running operations at the command buses.
- He expressed frustration with politicians being present at the command post.



Interviews of: Chief Tony Pustizzi (CSPD – Ret.)

- 30+ years in law enforcement, 17 years on SWAT, 5 years as SWAT commander.
- “I don’t think any of us are prepared for the magnitude of that kind of call.”
- Became frustrated at one point with not having a single IC, the two BSO majors identified Captain Jordan as the IC.
- Captain Jordan sought assistance from Chief Pustizzi and DC Lees (CCPD) and seemed receptive to their guidance.



Interview of: Deputy Chief G. Lees (Coconut Creek PD)

- Major Holmes (BSO) introduced Captain Jordan to everyone as the IC.
- After Captain Jordan's arrival, witnessed BSO radio problems and Captain Jordan told him she was not able to communicate on her radio.
- Described BSOs radio failure as "incomprehensible" and something that would hinder any law enforcement response.
- There was no documentation in the CP of assignments, responsibilities.



Interview of: Deputy Chief G. Lees (Coconut Creek PD)

- The CP did not have strong leadership or cohesion but Captain Jordan did make attempts to bring command staff together.
- "Listen, Jan Jordan was overwhelmed. She was overwhelmed. I could see it. I tried to help her."
- Told Captain Jordan, Sergeant Kallman and CSPD command they needed to split the tactical channel and command/logistics channel.
- County commissioners, school board members and city officials were unnecessarily present at CP.



Interview of: Deputy Chief G. Lees (Coconut Creek PD)

- CSFD Chief McNally expressed to the group he wanted to use RTFs; expressed a concern victims were not getting treatment.
- Deputy Chief Lees never became aware of a void in medical care for the victims.
- He told Chief McNally that SWAT medics were treating/evacuating.
- Could not recall if Captain Jordan was present.



Interview of: Captain Jordan

- Captain Jordan recalled Chief McNally (CSFD) asking on one occasion about using a rescue task force.
- Chief McNally said he asked approximately six times and brought a great deal of attention to this issue.
- Captain Jordan said “as far as I remember” she asked Colonel Polan about using RTFs. Colonel Polan stated confidently this never happened.
- Captain Jordan was not overseeing tactical operations and could not have authorized use of a rescue task force, only Colonel Polan could have done so.
- At some point, Captain Pumariega (Margate FD) was at the TOC.
- Captain Jordan was never aware of any students needing care in building 12 who did not receive that care.



Interview of: Chief Tony Pustizzi (CSPD – Ret.)

- Recalled conversations between DC McNally (CSFD) and Captain Jordan on use of RTFs.
- Captain Jordan told Chief McNally she would have to check and get back with him.
- Pointed out issues with BSO providing law enforcement and CSFD providing fire services; BSO does not train for RTF with CSFD.
- Chief Pustizzi was aware that SWAT medics were inside.
- Was never aware of a void in medical care; if there was he would have circumvented BSO if necessary to ensure additional medics made it inside.



Interview of: Captain G. Soberon (CSPD)

- Was not a witness to discussions about RTFs.
- He knew that their SWAT medics were inside treating victims.
- Captain Soberon was aware of CSFD's concerns, his opinion: "That's people who didn't get a chance to go in who felt they should have gone in, but we had that well in-hand."
- Captain Soberon referenced the medical packs which their officers carry.



3:21:03 (+ 59m 25s)

- Deputies at WalMart located another student who was friends with Jameson "JT" Snead.
- Cruz was friends with JT and living with the Sneads.
- The student provided deputies with information about Cruz and contact information for JT's father, James Snead.
- Deputy Valdes later used that information to contact James to try and get information on Cruz's location.

Captain Mock: Be advised 1200 building is almost done – out with BSO and their command – we are going to get all building numbers and CSPD SWAT will be clearing building 13.

This is the first indication that CSPD command staff and the BSO Incident Commander(s) were in communication.

- CSPD's mobile command bus moves from beneath the Sawgrass Expressway next to the BSO mobile command truck.



3:24:16 (+ 1hr 2m 38s)

- While at Wal-Mart, Deputy Valdes encountered radio problems while trying to broadcast information about Cruz and the Snead family.

- James told Valdes that his son, JT, said that Cruz was at a nearby McDonald's.

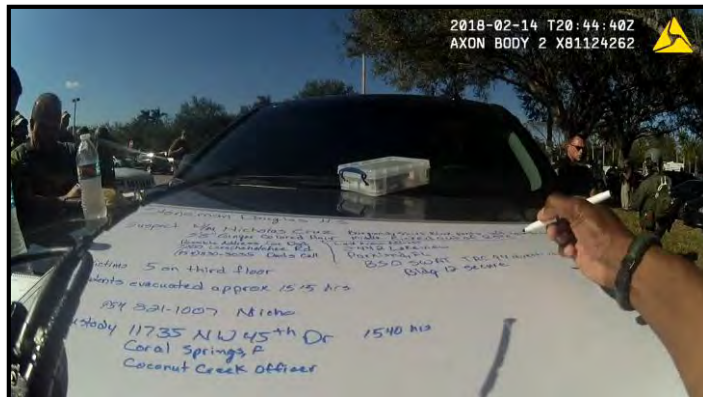

Consistent Themes



Consistent Themes

- While several deputies were identified as not responding to hearing gun shots, many other deputies responded in the proper manner by running to the scene, seeking out the shooter and providing first aid.
- Non-functioning radios hindered BSOs ability to manage the response.
- BSO patrol deputies taking time to put on vests, reapply bodycams.
- Confusion over which rooms have been cleared and which have not.
 - Deputies/Officers staged at each door
 - Glow sticks
 - Markers
- School board members and other politicians/government officials crowding the command post.



Consistent Themes

- Confusion over the location of the command post(s)
 - Staging area
 - TOC
 - Command Post (command bus) for law enforcement on Pine Island Rd.
 - Command Post for fire/rescue at Holmberg Rd/Pine Island Rd.
- Coral Springs PD officers:
 - Consistently praised their training.
 - Without hesitation they all knew they have received active shooter training each year for several years.
 - They had no difficulty in explaining the proper response to an active shooter.



Consistent Themes

- Broward SO deputies:
 - Most remembered attending training in the past few years.
 - Some could not remember the last time they attended active shooter training.
 - Some could not recall what type of training they received.
 - Several referenced the policy saying deputies “may” go toward the shooter.
- Deputies/Officers suggested additional training would be beneficial.
- Deputies/Officers said that no training is adequate to prepare you for an event like this.
