MUSICAL PRELUDE and PROCESSIONAL

WELCOME

We'd like to welcome you -- friends and family -- to this celebration of the marriage of ____ and _____. You are here because this couple feels close to you and asks that you join with them in this dedication of sacred purpose. We invite you to participate fully with your thoughts and prayers, asking for a blessing of this couple and their married life. They have chosen this act of marriage and this public, holy ceremony in which to proclaim it.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE
