



Combustible cladding regulations in Queensland

Time is running out for building owners to meet the 29 March deadline set by the Queensland Government for completing the combustible cladding checklist and registering buildings under the [Building and Other Legislation \(Cladding\) Amendment Regulation 2018](#).

What do I need to do?

If your building meets certain criteria (refer to the [Safer Buildings](#) website to check), it must be registered through an [online portal](#) and have a preliminary risk checklist carried out by **29 March 2019**.

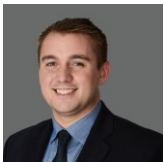
Then what?

Dependent on the outcome of the preliminary risk checklist, subsequent stages may apply if a building is deemed to be at risk of being affected by combustible cladding.

What will happen if I don't register in time?

You run the risk of penalties being applied by the Queensland Building and Construction Commission (QBCC).
