A popcorn maker is a device that heats up the popcorn kernels until it pops the popcorn. It is also known as a popcorn machine. The process of popping varies with every machine, but there are basic types of popcorn makers such as Oil Popcorn Makers, Air Popcorn Makers and Microwave Popcorn Makers.

There are many types of popcorn makers already out in the market. Thus, there are many options available for you now. Here are some tips on what kind of machine to get.

There are popcorn makers that use oil to cook popcorn kernels while others use hot air. Hot air popcorn makers provide a healthier option sans the oil. Other popcorn makers can let you add seasoning usually butter, salt and different powdered popcorn seasoning.

<u>Hot air popcorn makers</u> work by generating heat in an enclosed container. The heat circulates inside until the kernels are popped out. Although this machine cooks without oil, some people do not like the taste of it without a little oily taste. However, it is a matter of personal preference. Without oil, the popcorn tastes somewhat drier than usual.

Oil popcorn makers, on the other hand, heat oil on a hot plate or on a stove, providing several forms of containment for the popping of popcorn seeds. This is the more traditional way of popping popcorns.

Oil is normally a staple in any cooking method. However, oils are known to be very high in cholesterol content, and may be not friendly to those with heart problems.

Microwave can now also pop popcorn. The advantage of buying this machine is that it can also reheat your other foods on top of just making popcorn all the time. For some, this will be the more budget-friendly route. It is like buying a multi-purpose machine that serves different reheating needs in the kitchen.

However, if the main purpose of buying the microwave will be for popping popcorn, it is important to take note that this machine needs a special kind of kernels to turn into popcorn. These are known as microwaveable popcorn. They come in special packaging and are available in the market. This special package is designed to not burn inside the microwave while it concentrates the heating to the kernels.

Microwaves make popping popcorn easy and less messier. Just place the package inside, set the time and wait for just an average of three minutes. Afterwards, the package expands as the kernels are popped.

The package serves as the container also after popping. Therefore, there is no need to pour the contents out on a separate bowl. It is easier to dispose after eating.

<u>Old fashioned popcorn makers</u> were used with an open fire. Similar to the oven or stovetop model, this type of popcorn maker also has a stainless steel or cast iron body. The handle is longer and is often a combination of wood and metal. It also has a long handle to keep hands from getting too close to the flames.

When buying your own machine, first make rounds on the different appliance stores. Look for models that suit your budget and personal needs. If it will be for personal use only at home, don't consider buying the commercial machines anymore. They are very heavy and bulky.

Check the features of the machine. Relative to your diet, you might opt for those poppers not requiring oil for cooking. It will be the healthier alternative.

Also consider maintenance. Look for models that are easy to clean, as it is often a chore to clean up after every cooking. Also, it is important to clean these devices well after each use to make them last you longer.

The Best Tips When Looking For the Best Popcorn Maker

Different kinds of popcorn machines work in different ways. The hot air type uses a mixing band of heated air onto its kernels. It does not require butter or oil, therefore considered the healthiest way to cook popcorns. It is also less expensive as compared to the oil type popcorn maker. These machines are quite big and bulky.

Consider three things in buying a popcorn machine: O Chutes O Warming Cups O Wattages

Chutes control popcorn popping out to the waiting pan. This eliminates the need to shovel the popcorn from the machine to a bowl.

The warming cup is placed on top of the popcorn machine. You can melt butter in this cup while popcorn is popping. Warming cups also serve as measuring cups.

The machine wattage determines how much popcorn you can make in less time. 860

watts is ideal to pop more popcorn in lesser time. If speed is not your concern, you can choose 480 watts or 640 watts capacity.

Choose to buy machines that are easy to clean because making popcorn tend to be messy. Look for labels that indicate these machines safe to put inside dishwashers.

<u>Several modern popcorn machines</u> have a 16-ounce kettle and can produce about 260 ounces of popcorn per hour. This is ideal for arenas, convention centers, amusement parks, stadiums or large ball parks and movie theaters.

Medium-duty machines have a seven or nine ounce kettle. Production level is about 155 to 150 ounces of popcorn per hour. It is ideal for game rooms, small bars or restaurants.

For personal use, a four-ounce popcorn machine is enough. It can produce more than 92 ounces of popcorn per hour.

Non-automatic popcorn machines need to be watched closely to avoid overcooking. Automatic popcorn machines, on the other hand, contain a thermostat to automatically shut off heating elements by the end of its popping process.
