# Pacific Islander Access project Mission

#### Mission

The Pacific Islander Access project focuses on increasing higher education opportunities for Native Hawaiians and all other Pacific Islanders.

#### **Our History**

Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders are one of the fastest growing populations in the United States. However, this population lags behind other minorities in terms of many socio-economic indicators, including income, health, and education. The Pacific Islander Access project focuses on the educational disparities. Pacific Islanders are approximately 50% less likely to have a 4-year degree and 60% less likely to hold an advanced degree compared to the general population. Financial concerns are known to be a major factor in whether or not students graduate from college.

The Pacific Islander Access project started off as a micro nonprofit. We found that although many nonprofits did amazing work, many spent a significant portion of their energy sustaining themselves instead of accomplishing their mission. We felt that the micro-nonprofit model – all volunteer or small groups that use their expertise and technology as leverage could affect change by narrowing its focusing on a specific problem.

Our goal is to convince institutions of higher education and scholarships that support minorities to open their eligibility to include native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders. Within the first three years we were able to convince 13 institutions and scholarship to include Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders and we opened up \$1.1 million in potential scholarship funding for these groups. We hope to continue this advocacy until all scholarships for underrepresented minorities include all Pacific Islanders.

Advocacy & Template Letter

#### Advocacy

It is our hope that one day we will no longer need initiatives like the Pacific Islander Access project. Our goal is to open up all scholarships that target underrepresented minorities to Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders. However, as this scholarship book shows there are still quite a few that exclude Native Hawaiians and/or other Pacific Islanders.

The Pacific Islander Access project believes that scholarships targeting underrepresented minorities are benevolent and that any exclusion has been done due to a lack of understanding of the issue. We have communicated with all scholarships listed in this book and many have changed their stance when provided with additional information.

However, some have still not changed their position. Of those that have not, the reason has varied from that they do not believe that Pacific Islanders should be categorized separate from Asians to that they still do not believe this community is underrepresented and in need of assistance. In each of these cases, we encourage you to use our template letter and share your story about how you have been negatively impacted by their decision not to include Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders.

By working together and using our collective voice we can open up the few scholarships that are lagging in changing their policy of excluding Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders. We believe that these scholarships do not intend to exclude groups that meet their mission, but rather need to see the implications of their decision. Therefore, they need to hear from you, those Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders who are adversely affected by their policy. Please consider contacting each of those organizations that do not include all Pacific Islanders. Appendix A and B has a listing of contact information for you to utilize.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing to you to express my concern with a specific provision in your policy. Your underrepresented minority scholarship states that Native Hawaiians and/or other Pacific Islanders are not eligible to apply. This policy negatively impacts me and my community. I urge you to change this policy immediately.

Although Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders are one of the fastest growing populations in the United States, we lag behind other minorities in many socio-economic indicators, including income, health, and education. Pacific Islanders are roughly half as likely to graduate from college. Financial reasons are known to be a major factor in whether or not students graduate from college.

Federal policy dictates that federal data be classified in either Asian *or* Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander categories. OMB Directive 15 states "by creating separate categories, the data on the Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islander groups will no longer be overwhelmed by the aggregate data of the much larger Asian groups." Thus, our government recognizes that combining Asian and Pacific Islanders into one category has obscured valuable information about the Native Hawaiians/Pacific Islanders group.

The current data highlights that Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders are underrepresented in higher education. We encourage your scholarship to come in line with federal policy, current educational data, and solid moral actions and change your policy to allow Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders to apply. Our community is clearly deserving of the same chances provided to other minority groups facing similar barriers.

Further we support the efforts of the Pacific Islander Access project and encourage you to work in coordination with this nonprofit organization to change your policy and promote your scholarship in our community. Again, please allow us the same opportunities that your organization has opened for so many other minority groups.

# Actuarial Scholarships for Minority Students

**Mission:** To promote diversity within the profession through an annual scholarship program for Black/African American, Hispanic, Native North American and Pacific Islander students.

#### **Requirements:**

- Intent on pursuing a career in the actuarial profession
- Must have at least one birth parent who is a member of one of the following minority groups: Black/African American, Hispanic, Native North American, Pacific Islander
- Will be a full-time undergraduate student at a U.S. accredited educational institution
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale), emphasis on math or actuarial courses
- Entering college freshmen must have a minimum ACT math score of 28 or SAT math score of 600

#### Award levels:

\$1,000 – high school senior applying for freshman year;

- \$2,000 college freshman applying for sophomore year;
- \$3,000\* college sophomore applying for junior year; and
- \$4,000\* college junior applying for senior year

\*Actuarial exams are an important factor in evaluating scholarship qualifications for applicants entering their junior year and beyond. Additionally, exams passed will be considered for renewal.

- An underrepresented minority in the accounting profession (e.g., Black or African American; Hispanic or Latino; Native American; or Asian American
- Maintain a 3.0 GPA
- Demonstrate some financial need (e.g. not receiving scholarships that exceed educational expenses)

#### American Educational Research Association- Minority Fellowship Program

#### Requirements:

- U.S. citizens and permanent residents who are members of racial and ethnic groups historically underrepresented in higher education (e.g., African Americans, Alaskan Natives, American Indians, Asian Americans, Hispanics or Latinos, and Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islanders).
- At the writing stage of their dissertation by the beginning of the fellowship.
- Dissertation study should focus on an education research topic such as high stakes testing; ethnic studies/curriculum; tracking; STEM development; measurement of achievement and opportunity gaps; English language learners; or bullying and restorative justice.

# MARC Undergraduate Student Training in Academic Research

**Amount:** Stipends for individuals selected to training program will be based on the annual NIH stipend levels at the time of award. The fiscal year 2012 annual stipend level for MARC trainees was between \$8,304-11,628 per annum, depending on educational level. Part of tuition and travel fees may also be covered.

For institutional training grants, an amount per trainee equal to 60% of the level requested by the applicant institution, up to \$16,000 per year.

# NIH - National Research Service Awards for Individual Pre-Doctoral Fellowships to Promote Diversity in Health-Related Research

- African American, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans/Alaska Natives who maintain tribal affiliation or community attachment, Hawaiian Natives and natives of the U.S. Pacific Islands.

**Amount:** 5 years of full-time research training, a stipend, funds towards tuition and fees, and an Institutional Allowance which can be used to help defray fellowship expenses.
