MANAGER PREVIEW WITH JOHN ROBERTSON

Good afternoon and welcome to today's Ladbrokes Championship match against Dunfermline Athletic.

This fixture brings down the curtain on the league fixtures and of course today's results will dictate the order in which we play Ayr Utd next week in the first of the play off rounds. I would like to warmly welcome Stevie Crawford, his staff, players and fans of the Pars to the Caledonian Stadium today.

Last week saw us fight back for a deserved victory at Alloa where their obvious hunger and determination to stay in the Championship was evident for the first half hour before we started to make in roads with our passing game.

I felt we needed the second striker to press them more in their half of the field and also give us an attacking edge that we had lacked. This eventually saw us take control of the game, score two goals in quick succession, through Shaun and Charlie, and then see their goalkeeper make a couple of good saves from Jordan and another Rooney effort cleared off the line. Then just as we had wrestled control of the game we lost Carlo to a calf injury and had to see the final 15 minutes out with only ten men but apart from a late scramble we did so relatively comfortably.

We are still battling for third place so with Ayr winning it was important to keep pace and take it to today's final scheduled league match. It will be another tough game as they all have been with the Pars, they will be looking to sign off with a win and finish in the top half of the table.

They have being playing a mix of senior and younger players over the last few weeks and their youngsters have been impressing in the Reserve League and in the Fife Cup and will be no doubt hoping that they get an opportunity to play today.

On that note we must once again congratulate our U18 squad who followed up last years title win by wrapping up this years title with games to spare. We are absolutely delighted that they have done so and in some style with a 4-0 victory over Ross County on Tuesday. We have high hopes for many of these young lads with Mackay, MacGregor, Harper and Brown having already played for the first team and Machado, Fyffe, Kennedy and Nicholson being on the bench, so they are making excellent progress and we are very happy with their continued development.

Their opportunity will come soon enough, people have to realise that whilst they are excelling against players in their age group it is a big jump from Academy football to the first team. In an ideal world they would be playing reserve team football and be even closer to playing for the first team.

We hope to rectify that next year by getting our Colts team in to the Highland League as part of project brave but this will require a number of things to fall in to place in order for us to do so but we believe it will significantly speed up the development of these youngsters towards our first team.

Once more we hope you will stay right behind the team as we bring the League to an end and prepare for the cut and thrust of the Premiership play-offs.

Second-Half goals from Shaun Rooney and Charlie Trafford secured a 2-1 win for the Caley Jags against Alloa, after Alan Trouten had put the hosts ahead with a penalty.

The win keeps Caley Thistle level on points with Ayr United going into today's match and results today will decide who finishes third and fourth.

John Robertson made three changes to the side which lost 2-0 to Dundee United as McHattie, Mckay (suspended) and Walsh were replaced by Tremarco, Donaldson and McDonald.

Jordan White went just wide after 16 minutes, while Cammy Mackay was called into action after 23 minutes as he saved Jack Aitchison's close range effort.

Alloa were awarded a penalty after 27 minutes as Donaldson was judged to have fouled Zanatta in the box. It looked a soft call but Alan Trouten stepped up and scored.

John Robertson made two half-time subs as McCauley and Austin came on for Polworth, who was struggling with a knock and Anthony McDonald.

On the 47th, Shaun Rooney saw his effort cleared off the line as he met a corner from Charlie Trafford.

Rooney got his goal after 68 minutes as Joe Chalmers' cross found him on the edge of the box and he fired past Neil Parry.

Five minutes later it was 2-1 to the Caley Jags, Charlie Trafford prodded home Joe Chalmers' corner to complete the turnaround.

Carl Tremarco was struggling with an injury and couldn't see out the game. With the Caley Jags making all three subs they had to play the remainder of the match with just ten men.

Cammy was called into action late on as he produced two fine saves to deny Connor Shields and Dario Zanatta.

Walking Football is 2 days a week



TALKS HIS TIME AT THE CALEY JAGS SO FAR



Anthony McDonald is hoping his Caley Thistle career can last a little longer as the Caley Jags look to go far in the upcoming Premiership play-offs. McDonald is on loan from Hearts and he will return to the Jam Tarts at the end of the season.

Anthony has really enjoyed his time at the Caley Jags, where the loan spell has provided him with the chance of getting more football under his belt, even though he is frustrated he couldn't have played more due to injury.

The 18-year old said: "My time here has been brilliant, I don't think I've played as much as I would have wanted because of the injury but when I have played I've really enjoyed it."

"I need to give credit to the manager and the players for bringing me in and making me feel really like I'm apart of the squad, it's been really good and I'll go back to Hearts and see what happens."

"I stay with Kevin McHattie, so it's been good to stay away from home. Obviously it's been a real change and it's been tough but I'm kind of used to it so I'm enjoying it now."

McDonald has scored his first career goal during his loan spell with the Caley Jags but he wants to add more goals to his game. He said: "It's good to get the recognition, especially from the Hearts fans as I'm still one of their players. It was great to score my first goal against Morton but I think I need to score more so we'll see'

Today, Caley Thistle could seal third place if they better Ayr United's result, who face Alloa at home, and McDonald thinks home advantage in the second leg would help the Caley Jags.

He said: "it's a big game, we're not going to rest up or do anything to prevent us to getting third place. We've got big play-off games coming up but we need to try and secure third before we look to them."

"I would be massive to have the second leg at home. Going away to Ayr is somewhere we've done well this season but we know what we can do at home. I think we could potentially go through into the next round."

The on-loan Hearts winger realises that the play-off schedule will be demanding on the Caley Thistle squad but he thinks the squad can deal with it.

McDonald said: "It's going to be tough playing in the play-off as the boys have had a long season, it's a lot of games in a short period of time so it'll be tough but I think we've got the mentality and the preparation to get through it."

McDonald also wanted to thank the supporters for getting behind during his time with the Caley Jags and he urged the fans to get behind the side in the play-offs.

He said: "The support from the Caley Thistle fans has been brilliant, especially away from home as they travel such a long distance to every game."

"We all really appreciate their support and they've been brilliant. The home fans have been brilliant too, especially against Ross County, where they made a really good noise. I think they just need to get behind us in the play-offs and we'll do what we can."

Dunfermline head to the Caledonian Stadium this afternoon without any fear of being relegated but will be disappointed to not have a chance of getting themselves into the play-offs.

Stevie Crawford replaced Allan Johnston in the new year and the Pars looked to be in the play-off hunt after five straight wins without conceding in Feburary and March. However, they have been on a poor run recently with six losses in their last seven matches.

Bruce Anderson joined from Aberdeen on loan in January and has scored five goals. Dunfermline won the last meeting between the sides 1-0 in February, with Joe Thomson's goal separating the sides.

The overall record between the sides favours the Caley Jags as it reads:

ICTFC wins- 13, Draws- 16, Dunfermline wins- 9

Caley Thistle Under 18s secured the Under 18s Progressive Tier title in style as they beat Ross County 4-0 at the Caledonian Stadium thanks to a brace from Roddy MacGregor and goals from Donald Morrison and Matheus Machado.

The first chance of the match fell to Matheus Machado as he shot from around 20 yards but his effort was saved by Dixon-Hodge.

Jack Brown then fed in Ross Gunn on the edge of the box but the winger fired his effort wide of the post.

Cameron Harper looked to open the scoring with a free-kick from about 25 yards but the left-back's effort was narrowly wide of the post.

Just after the half-hour mark, Machado went close as Jack Brown's corner found its way to him and his shot was inches wide.

Machado caused more trouble down the left-hand side as he cut inside and shot but his effort was palmed away by Dixon-Hodge.

Caley Thistle took the lead on the 43rd minute as Machdo unleashed a powerful effort which hit the crossbar and the rebound fell to Donald Morrison who prodded it home to make it 1-0 to the Caley Jags.

It was 2-0 just a minute later as some good play by Machado found Roddy Kennedy in the box and he cut it back to Roddy MacGregor and his low finish beat Dixon-Hodge.

They Caley Jags made it 3-0 in the second-half as Cameron Harper's floated in free-kick was played across the box by Machado to find Roddy MacGregor for a tap-in

The win was sealed on the 83rd minute as Shane Harkness found Matheus Machado in the box and the winger took it past the Ross County defender and chipped the ball over the Ross County keeper.



ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

Disorderly conduct includes:

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
- Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender Identity
- Disability
- Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting
- Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000

All persons entering the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible criminal proceedings, ejection from the stadium, withdrawal of a season ticket and/or exclusion from future matches at the club.
