# **MANAGER PREVIEW**

### WITH JOHN ROBERSTON

Good evening and welcome to tonight's Ladbrokes Championship match with Greenock Morton, which is the first of back-to-back matches against the Ton as we have been paired with them in the Challenge Cup as well.

I would like to welcome David Hopkin, his backroom staff, the players, directors and, of course, the fans who have made the trip north tonight to the Caledonian Stadium

We believe the Morton fans may protest by staying away and we can sympathise with their feelings as it's along way to come for the 7.05PM kick off, with many being asked to take time off work to get here as it is a 3 ¾ hours each way trip and not ideal for the visiting fans.

ICT fans are well aware of the Friday night traveling times with our trips to Dundee at that time as well as Partick last season. It is impossible to get there at that time and it frustrates most fans as it is not ideal.

Our home fixture with Ross County was down by two thousand and virtually no hospitality sold last season. Morton suffered a similar fate with their game last week against Partick Thistle that would easily have seen a 6-7000 crowd on Saturday at 3pm.

Financially it is not a brilliant deal for the Championship clubs but with the deal being agreed we have to accept the scheduling and get on with the business of winning tonight's match.

This will be no easy task against a free scoring Morton side who racked up some impressive wins so far this season, which is no surprise, given the attacking players they have recruited and kept at the club since David returned to the club he served so well as a player.

Last week showed all you need to know about the qualities he has brought to his side, who never gave up despite trailing Thistle by two goals with less than 20 mins remaining. They will come here in buoyant mood on the back of the three goals they scored to take all three points.

I'm sure David will want to repeat the success he had at Livingston with the Ton and the early signs are good with two wins from their first three games

Our performance in our last home game was good and had we been a bit more ruthless in front of goal we could have scored more. We then followed that up with a very strong performance against Dundee at Dens Park, that saw us unlucky not to bring all three points north.

We will need to show both attacking and defensive strengths tonight in, what I am sure is going to be, an exciting and well fought match.

The squad is coming together nicely and we have real competition for places, not only in the starting 11 but also for the bench as both Sean Welsh and Mitch Curry are returning from injury and will be available to push for starting places soon.





Miles Storey got off the mark on his return to the club and we will continue to work on his match fitness to get him up to full speed along with Sean and Mitch. The squad will be well utilised with back-to-back games against tonight's visitors and a North of Scotland Cup match with Clach at home in-between.

We watched our younger players deliver a fantastic performance in helping Fort William reach the other semi-final of the North of Scotland Cup, with a stunning 5-1 victory at Rothes. Although they have yet to register a league win, their performances have been hugely encouraging and have been a lot closer than the scorelines suggest.

They are out learning their trade against experienced players and we can already see an improvement in their understanding of the game above youth football. It will stand them in good stead travelling to the likes of Fraserburgh and Brora and experiencing the highs and lows that football brings

The staff will once more be down at Claggan Park tomorrow watching them against Wick Academy and are sure the lads will get that elusive first league win of the season

But for the moment it is all about tonight and the 3 points at stake and once more I ask you to get right behind the team,

# Caley Thistle drew 0-0 with Dundee in a tight match at Dens Park last weekend.

John Robertson made one change from the side which beat Arbroath in our last league match as Miles Storey replaced Jordan White. Sean Welsh returned from injury to make the bench.

The first chance came after only one minute on the clock as James Keatings met Mile Storey's cross in the middle but his header looped on to the roof of the net.

Aaron Doran then forced a save from Jack Hamilton as he unleashed a strike from 25 yards.

Dundee had their first chance after 17 minutes as Ridgers collected a powerful effort from Danny Johnson after he was set up by McGowan.

Coll Donaldson was booked for a late challenge on Sean Byrne, Mark Ridgers parried the resulting free-kick over.

Caley Thistle then hit the base of the post from Tremarco's deflected shot as he met James Keatings' corner.

Kane Hemmings had a big chance for Dundee right before the break as he was slottted in by Sean Byrne, but he dragged his effort wide. In the second-half, Caley Thistle started strongly as Tom Walsh saw an effort blocked by Jordan Marshall after he was played in by Miles Storey.

Shortly afterwards, Doran saw an effort go just over after he cut inside from the right hand side.

Miles Storey then found himself in some space through on goal after Jordan McGhee misjudged the bounce of the ball but the striker put his effort just wide.

James Keatings' free-kick then found Doran in the box, he saw his initial effort blocked, the ball then fell to Jamie McCart and his chipped effort went just wide of the post.

Roddy MacGregor and Jordan White replaced Miles Storey and James Keatings for the final 20 minutes.

Kane Hemmings headed over from 6 yards after he met McDaid's free-kick in the box after 82 minutes.

Jamie McCart then headed just wide as he connected with an Aaron Doran corner.

McCart then played in Todorov but the striker's effort was deflected behind.

Jordan White had the final chance of the game as he connected with Doran's cross in the middle but his header was inches wide.

Recalling his memories of Friday night football Doran said: "I personally like Friday night football better, I think the first Friday night game I played up here was against Ross County, that was a good game and a full house so it has always been nice. It's good to play out there under the lights, we usually give good performances so lets see how it goes."

Tonight, it's Morton that the Caley Jags face at the Caledonian Stadium and Doran is excited for the match. The Irishman said: "We're excited, I think we had a decent result and performance last weekend against a strong Dundee side. We're confident, we've had a good week of training and it's always good to play under the lights on a Friday night."

Caley Thistle started their season in difficult fashion as Dundee United beat them 4-1 on the opening day, thanks to four goals from Lawrence Shankland at Tannadice. However, Caley Thistle followed that up with a win over Arbroath and a draw against Dundee.

He said: "I think we weren't at our best when we started the season against Dundee United, last weekend we were decent and we could've nicked it too. We won our first home league match of the season against Arbroath, which we didn't do last term, so I think it has been a decent start.

Last season, home form was a slight frustration for the Caley Jags and with them grabbing their first home win already this term, Doran wants to keep the home wins coming. Doran also thinks the Caley Jags have an improved squad this term.

"We want to kick on at home so tonight is another chance to do that."

"I think we're in a better position this season, I think we have a better squad than we did last season, there is more depth. There is more people fighting for their positions this season. I think we are in a good position and, as we showed last weekend, we're good away from home as well."

"If we can pick up points away from home and get our home form sorted I'm sure we'll be up there."





Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

**Disorderly conduct includes:** 

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
- Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender Identity
- Disability
- Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting
- Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000

All persons entering The Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible criminal proceedings, ejection from the stadium, withdrawal of a season ticket and/or exclusion from future matches at the club.
