MANAGER PREVIEW WITH JOHN ROBERTSON

Good afternoon and welcome to today's Ladbrokes Championship fixture with Partick Thistle here at the Caledonian Stadium. I would like to warmly welcome Gary Caldwell, Brian Kerr and their squad to the stadium as well as their directors and, of course, the fans who have made the journey today for what I am sure will be another close encounter.

Thistle have picked up some good results of late and been very active in the transfer market as they look to pull away from the relegation area, they will come here hungry for all 3 points. The quality of their additions allied to the already very good squad will make them dangerous opponents and we will have to keep up the fine form we have been showing ourselves of late to win this match.

We have won both matches previously by the odd goal, with Thistle scoring two late goals here and of course the last one saw a tremendous Tom Walsh strike, and a penalty save from Mark Ridgers to win the points at Firhill, so there has been very little between the sides.

We have had two away games at Falkirk and Ayr since our victory in the cup against East Kilbride and we were very unlucky not to take all 3 points from the Bairns in a game we dominated for long spells as we were denied a very clear penalty in the closing minutes.

We responded well with a fantastic victory down at Ayr in difficult conditions were we were, once more, roared on by our small but passionate away support and came away with the points in a great match.

We currently sit in 4th place but we must keep our sights fixed firmly on the teams above us as we are still in with a fighting chance of being at the business end of the table going in to the last quarter. That is the target for the players, to be right in there fighting, and their form and application of late has been first class and we must keep up that intensity for remainder of the season.

We have added Darren McCauley from Coleraine and Anthony McDonald from Hearts to the squad and both bring real competition for places in the team. Both are attacking players, with Darren coming from part time Coleraine where he netted 20 last season and 8 this campaign and Anthony has 20 odd Premiership games under his belt at only 17 so both will be pushing the current players for a starting berth. We are delighted to get them here and sure they will be fine additions to the squad.

Once more, I ask for you to get right behind the team in another important match.



It's been a frustrating season for Nathan Austin to date with injuries causing him to miss many matches this season but the Caley Thistle striker now has earned his place back in the side.

John Robertson's selection of Austin was rewarded on Tuesday night as the striker netted twice in the first 12 minutes in the Caley Jags' 3-2 win over Ayr in midweek and Austin was delighted to help the side to three points.

The Caley Thistle striker said: "I felt for myself it had been a long time coming to be getting into the team, I think I played quite well against Falkirk so it was good to get a couple of goals against Ayr and help the team and we're right back in the hunt now."

Now Austin has forced his way into the side he is hoping to stay consistent and keep his place as he said: "For me personally, I've said this a lot, once I start playing and I am fit I think my football does the talking. So if I can keep myself fit, I know I'm more than capable of scoring goals to help the team, for me it's not worrying about the football side of things but it's about keeping myself at the top fitness wise then I know I can help the team."

Austin said that through his career he always seems to finish the season stronger and thinks this could be because the goal becomes within reach.

The striker said: "I think if you look right through my stats through my career then I always seem to do well in the second half of the season. I don't know what it is! I couldn't put it down to one certain thing but when you have the finishing line in front of you, you are hungrier and know you can finish in a good position so I think the performances come from that. Hopefully I can call upon that in the second-half of this season and kick on again."

There is no break in the big games coming for Caley Thistle as Partick Thistle come to the Highlands this afternoon. Austin has said that the new signings have given the squad an extra buzz going into the business end of the season.

Austin said: "The big games are coming now, I think all the boys are looking forward to it. I think it is good to see a few new faces around the dressing room as it gives us an extra buzz, the training has been good."

He added: "The new signings have been good in training, Anthony played against Ayr on Tuesday and looked quite good on maybe not the kind of pitch that he is used to but he adapted himself really well. We've seen a bit of McCauley too, he's a big powerful lad and he's been good in training."

"We're looking forward for them getting going. We've also signed Kevin McHattie, I know Kev and he's been about for a while, he's got quality and is a good player."

Austin is under no illusions that today's match will be a tough one for the Caley Jags with Thistle dipping heavily into the transfer market this January. Austin thinks Gary Caldwell now has the players he wants, making it a complete different game to the previous two meetings between the sides.

Austin said: "I think Gary Caldwell has the team he wants now so I think it's a totally different game to when we've played them earlier on in the season."

"We've played quite well against Thistle this season, maybe the fans think it'll be an easier game but it certainly won't be because of the new signings they have made and I think they'l be trying to push right up the league to get away from the relegation zone."

Caley Thistle beat Ayr United 3-2 at Somerset Park, with the Caley Jags racing into a 3-0 lead inside the first 18 minutes of the first half as Nathan Austin scored double and Liam Polworth got the other.

John Robertson made two changes from Saturday's 2-2 draw with Falkirk as Anthony McDonald came in for his first Caley Thistle start, as the injured Aaron Doran missed out, while George Oakley came in for Jordan White.

The Caley Jags had the lead after just 8 minutes played as Nathan Austin scored for the first time since the 3-3 draw with Queen of the South in November. Austin was played in by Polworth and initially saw his first effort saved by Doohan but then tapped in the rebound to give Caley Thistle the lead.

Only four minutes later, Austin got his second of the match to double Caley Thistle's lead. George Oakley sent Austin through on goal and the striker rounded Doohan and slide his effort over the line to make it 2-0.

Somerset Park was stunned and only six minutes later Liam Polworth made it 3-0 to the Caley Jags. It was good work again from Oakley as he put pressure on the Ayr centre-backs and ball found Polworth 20 yards out who's effort arrowed into the bottom corner.

It was 3-0 to the Caley Jags at the break and Ayr boss Ian McCall made two half-time subs with Lawrence Shankland and Chris Higgins coming on for Craig Moore and Ross Docherty.

Ayr responded well in the second-half and got one back on the 52nd minute, Shankland put Jamie McCart under pressure and won the ball off him and he cut the ball back for Delcan McDaid to tap in.

Shankland set up a grand stand finish as his free-kick deflected past Cammy Mackay on the 84th minute.

Robbie Muirhead had a big chance late on to earn Ayr a point as he met a brilliant ball from McDaid but a slight touch from Tremarco meant the ball was slightly too high for Muirhead, who headed over.

PARTICK THISTLE THE OPPONENT

Partick Thistle have suffered a disappointing season so far with them sitting one point above bottom spot, in 9th place in the Ladbrokes Championship table in their first season since be relegated from the Ladbrokes Premiership.

Thistle started the season with Alan Archibald in charge but he has been replaced by Gary Caldwell. Caldwell has brought in Steve Saunders, Conor Hazard, Joe Cardle Alistair Roy, Lews Mansell, Jack McMillian, Steven Anderson and Gary Harkins in the January transfer window while the Glasgow side have knocked back offers from clubs down south for the services of Aidan Fitzpatrick

Thistle picked up a big win against Queen of the South at Firhill last weekend as they got themselves off the bottom of the table. The past two meeting this season have been wins for the Caley Jags, with a 3-2 win at the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium in September and 1-0 win in November at Firhill, thanks to a Tom Walsh stunner.

Thistle hold a slight advantage in the overall head-to-head between the two sides with them winning 13 matches to ICTFC's 12 and there being 10 draws between the sides.

Caley Thistle drew 2-2 with Falkirk away from home as Shaun Rooney and Aaron Doran scored for the Caley Jags, while Zak Rudden and Ian McShane hit the goals for Falkirk.

ICTFC were missing Mark Ridgers who had a back injury as Cammy Mackay came into the side. The other change for the Caley Jags was Nathan Austin coming in for George Oakley.

The Caley Jags took the lead in the 13th minute as Joe Chlamers' low free-kick was turned in by an unmarked Shaun Rooney.

Aaron Doran then saw an effort from just outside the box saved by Burgoyne as he cut inside on the left-hand side.

Falkirk levelled things up with their first chance of the match as Zak Rudden tapped in from close range after meeting a cross from Mark Waddington.

Caley Thistle did have the lead before the break though as Liam Polworth's free-kick found its way to Aaron Doran who's stunning volley flew past the Falkirk goal keeper to make it 2-1 to ICTFC at the break.

On the 55th minute, Falkirk drew level as Ian McShane's corner went directly in as it flew past Cammy Mackay.

With just 15 minutes left, Joe Chalmers found Oakley in the middle with a super ball into the box from the left-hand side but Oakley's header was well saved by Burgoyne.

There was to be some late drama as McCauley felt his effort inside the box was blocked by a Falkirk defenders arm but nothing was given by the referee.

At the other end, Rangers loanee, Zak Rudden was presented with a big chance to win the game for Falkirk but he blazed his effort over the crossbar.



ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Tullloch Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

Disorderly conduct includes:

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
- Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender Identity
- Disability
- Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting
- Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000

All persons entering the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible
