INVESTIGATIVE:

(U) The subject, who remains identified only as a Native American male, initially went to the residence of his grandfather, a sergeant on the Red Lake Police Department. The subject shot and killed his grandfather and his grandfather's girlfriend. Prior to leaving the residence, the subject

handgun and shotgun. A Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms (BATF) trace analysis determined that both were police-issued weapons.

(U) The subject proceeded to the Red Lake High School where he shot and killed an unarmed security officer who was managing the school's magnetometer. Subsequently, the subject proceeded down a hallway where he shot and wounded a teacher. The teacher sought refuge in a classroom. The subject followed her into the classroom where he shot and killed the teacher and three students.

(U) Preliminary investigation indicated that the subject then entered a second classroom and discharged his handgun. However, no one was killed in this second classroom. The subject re-entered the hallway where he engaged local police and there was an exchange of gunfire. Neither the subject nor the officers were wounded. After the firefight, the subject then returned to the first classroom and killed another two students before shooting himself in the face with the shotgun.

(U) To date, there are 10 deceased individuals as a result of this incident. The subject, the subject's grandfather, the grandfather's girlfriend, a school security officer, a schoolteacher, and five students.

ADMINISTRATIVE:

(U) SAC Michael Tabman is en route to the Red Lake Reservation from Washington, D.C. On 03/22/2005, SAC Tabman will serve as On-Scene-Commander and will coordinate a press conference with Minneapolis Media Coordinator SA [redacted] this morning. Last night, SA [redacted] issued a press statement and fielded several questions at 6:15 PM CST and disseminated an email update to various media members at 10:00 PM CST.

(U) Acting SAC [redacted] arrived on-scene on 03/21/2005 and coordinated the efforts of federal, state, local, and tribal law enforcement.

(U) ASAC [redacted] coordinated administrative, staffing, reporting, and liaison matters from Headquarters City,

Minneapolis Division.

(U) SSRA [redacted] established a Command Post at the Red Lake, MN, Police Department and coordinated lead assignments.

(U) Special Agents from Minnesota and North Dakota RAs were on-scene on 03/21/2005 and will conduct interviews today. An additional ten (10) Special Agents from the Minneapolis Division will arrive in Red Lake on 03/22/2005 by 9:00 AM CST.

(U) Minneapolis Division SWAT secured the perimeter last night and will assist with interviews on 03/22/2005.

(U) The Minneapolis Division Evidence Recovery Team (ERT) arrived last night and is processing the crime scene at the Red Lake High School. Minneapolis Division ERT requested additional resources from FBIHQ, ERTU. The Minnesota State Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA) is processing the residential crime scene which has been coordinated with the Minneapolis Division ERT.

(U) Three Minneapolis Victim/Witness Specialists arrived on-scene last night. The remaining seven Minneapolis Division's Victim/Witness Specialists will arrive in Red Lake on 03/22/2005.

(U) BATF SAC Mike Boxler and about ten (10) ATF agents are on-scene and will assist with interviews. United States Secret Service SAC John Kirkwood has also made agents available to assist in the interviewing process.

(U) Representatives from additional tribal, state, and local law enforcement agencies are assisting in various aspects of this matter.

(U) Currently, 65% of approximately 400 interviews have been completed. The interviewees consist of 300 students, 60 school employees, and 40 family, friends, and associates of Weise.

ADMINISTRATIVE:

(U) At the request of MP SAC Michael Tabman, The Behavioral Analysis Unit dispatched two psychological profilers, SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] to assist in this matter. SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] will arrive during the evening of 03/23/2005.

(U) The Employee Assistance Unit has offered their services to the MP Division and others affected by the Red Lake, MN, events. On 03/23/2005, MP Division dispatched EAP Counselors to the Command Post (CP).

(U) On 03/22/2005, the 10 corpses from the Red Lake shooting were delivered to the Ramsey County Medical Facility, St. Paul, MN, for autopsies. MP SAs observed the autopsies, collected evidence such as bullet fragments and clothing, and documented the events. The evidence will be provided to the FBI Laboratory for examination and analysis.

CART ANALYSIS UPDATE (JEFFREY WEISE'S PERSONAL COMPUTER):

3/22/2005

(U) At 3:30 pm, MP CART received Weise's computer and the attendant consent to search form authorizing analysis. FBI pilots transported the computer from Red Lake, MN, to Minneapolis, MN.

(U) Senior CART Coordinator/Field Examiner Special Agent [redacted] was assigned this matter. Upon receipt, SA [redacted] immediately initiated the exam, photographed the evidence, and noted condition of unit. SA [redacted] removed the hard drive in the subject computer and created an image of the hard drive to a long-term storage device (ultrium tape). In addition, SA [redacted] created an additional image to a working hard drive for immediate review.

(U) SA [redacted] continued his CART Examination until approximately 12:15 AM on 3/23/2005. During this time, SA [redacted] was created aforementioned images of the subject hard drive. Once the images were completed, SA [redacted] initiated indexing of the images which allowed rapid search methods to be employed. Based on the size of the hard drive, SA [redacted] estimated that the indexing process would take approximately five hours to complete.

(U) On 03/23/2005, SA [redacted] returned to work and found the indexing of the hard drive complete. Approximately 180,000 files had been identified on the 40 gigabyte hard drive.

(U) SA [redacted] retrieved e-mail information for assessment of lead value. Then, SA [redacted] exported e-mails from Outlook Express to the server. During this portion of the examination, SA [redacted] identified an additional e-mail account for Weise: neonecrosis@hotmail.com.

(U) SA [redacted] also certified CART examiner, proceeded to print the exported e-mails and provided one copy to the CP in Red Lake and provided another copy to [redacted] a MP [redacted] analyst. While the CP is reviewing the emails for lead

value in the area of the crime scene, the [redacted] analyst is reviewing the emails for lead value outside the crime scene.

(U) Additionally, SA [redacted] printed a log entitled, "Chat Log" containing hotmail addresses logged during chat sessions. Chat Log did not contain transcripts of chats, only e-mail addresses of those who may have participated in the alleged chats. SA [redacted] provided those e-mails addresses to SA [redacted] to include in [redacted]. SA [redacted] also provided neonecrosis@hotmail.com to SA [redacted] to include in [redacted].

(U) Further investigation by Special Agent [redacted] revealed that "text string" searches contained e-mails addresses of Weise's associates, to include:

(U) The report for text string searches of [redacted]@hotmail.com alone was in excess of 100 pages. SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] continue to review reports to find e-mail address and information of lead value.

(U) SA [redacted] located approximately 900 hits for the word "todesengel" (death angel) in approximately 130 files on the Weise's computer. These files were accessed from June 2004 through March 2005. It should be noted that files accessed in 2005 appear to be large common files that also contain "todesengel". It is the preliminary opinion of the CART examiners that most of the activity concerning "todesengel" appears to have taken place in 2004. SA [redacted] continues to review the report for additional information of lead value related to the search term "todesengel".

(U) SA [redacted] located approximately 320 hits for the term "nativenazi" on the Weise's computer. These files were accessed from June 2004 through March 2005. It should be noted that files accessed in 2005 appear to be large common files that also contain "nativenazi". Initial review suggests that most of the activity concerning files containing the word "nativenazi" took

place in second half of 2004.

(U) SA [redacted] advised that the Weise's hard drive had dozens of files which contained www.nazi.org. The hard drive continues to be exploited and examined for additional information of lead value.

(U) SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] located a chat log containing references the construction of improvised explosive devices (IEDs). However, the log does not clearly identify who is chatting in log. The file revealed a hit for [redacted] and [redacted] but no mention of either screen name was located in text of the chat portion of the file. SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] reviewed the file utilizing multiple techniques and agreed that the results were inconclusive. There was no evidence to support that [redacted] or [redacted] had any knowledge or participated in a chat concerning pipe bombs or explosive devices.

(U) Field Examiner (FE) [redacted] continued a CART examination on [redacted] desktop computer. FE [redacted] focused on chat logs and text searches of [redacted] desktop.

(U) FE [redacted] coordinated the arrival to the Minneapolis Division of FE [redacted] FBIHQ, CART.

(U) FA [redacted] contacted SA [redacted] with an additional chat log detailed a chat between neonecrosis (Weise), [redacted] (previously identified as [redacted] and [redacted])

Central Standard Time, Jeffrey James Weise, a tenth grade student who attended the Red Lake High School located on the Red Lake Indian Reservation, Red Lake, Minnesota, shot and killed nine adults and students, before turning the gun on himself.

Jeffrey Weise, a Native American male, 16 years of age, initially went to the residence of his 58-year old grandfather, Daryl Lussier, a sergeant on the Red Lake Police Department (RLPD). The subject shot and killed his grandfather and his grandfather's 32 year old girlfriend. While in the residence, Weise attempted to take an M-4. However, the weapon jammed as Weise attempted to load the ammunition and he left it at the residence. Prior to departing the residence, the subject took

possession of a police issued shotgun and Glock pistol. Weise fled the residence in Lussier's RLPD Sport Utility Vehicle (SUV).

Weise proceeded to the Red Lake High School in the SUV and rammed the vehicle into the school building. After entering the school on foot, Weise shot and killed a 28 year old unarmed security officer who was operating the school's magnetometer. Subsequently, Weise proceeded down a corridor where he shot and wounded a teacher, who sought refuge in a classroom. Weise followed the teacher into the classroom where he shot and killed her and three students.

Investigation indicated that Weise then entered a second classroom and discharged his handgun. However, no one was killed in this second classroom. Weise reentered the hallway where he engaged four RLPD officers and there was an exchange of gunfire. Portions of Weise's activities in the hallway were captured on a security camera videotape. After the firefight, Weise returned to the first classroom and killed another two students before shooting himself in the face with the shotgun.

At this time, there are 10 deceased individuals as a result of these incidents. The subject, the subject's grandfather, the grandfather's girlfriend, a school security officer, a schoolteacher, and five students. An additional seven students were injured and treated at hospitals.

For information of the Bureau and Legat Ottawa, as a result of searches of subjects Weise's computer a chat log was located in which Weise is discussing a school shooting with another individual in August 2004. Initially the only name used was [redacted]. Since the reference telcall, Minneapolis believes [redacted] last name could be [redacted]. They first discuss "Columbine" briefly and how more students could have been killed.

[redacted] later advises Weise that he [redacted] Weise at one point asks [redacted] "What reason do you have to blow away people at your school." 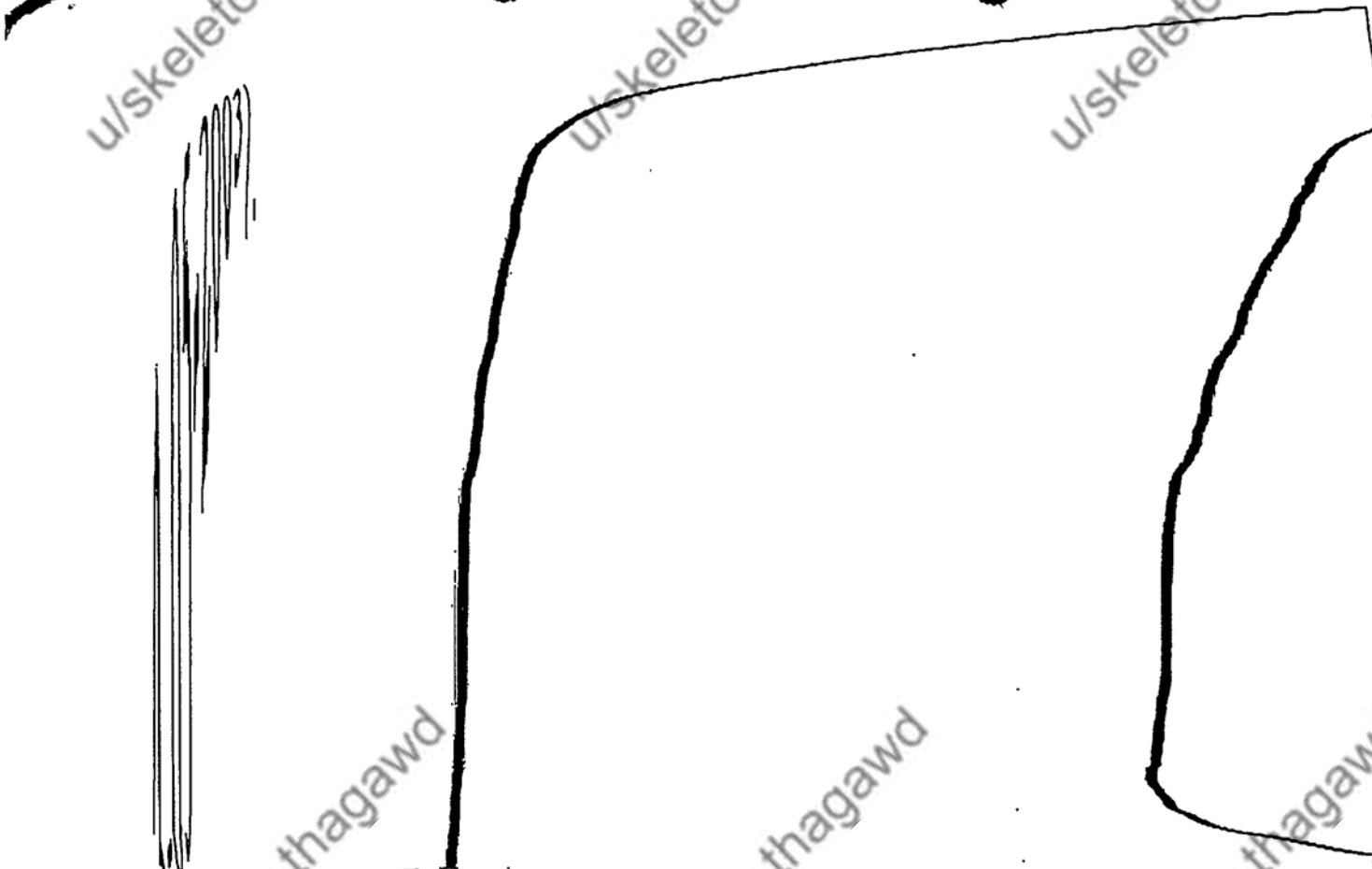

rampage at RLHS, shooting and killing a security guard, a teacher and five students before killing himself after being wounded by police gunfire.

Prior to the spree at the RLHS, Weise had apparently gone to the home of his grandfather, a veteran police officer, and shot and killed his grandfather and the grandfather's girlfriend with a .22 caliber semiautomatic pistol. Weise is believed to have then obtained his grandfather's .40 caliber Glock service pistol, 12 gauge Remington shotgun, his duty belt and radio, his ballistic vest as well as his police 4X4 cruiser. Weise is believed to have then driven to the RLHS where he conducted his rampage.

Initial investigation has revealed the indications of a conspiracy involving at least four other juveniles and one juvenile male has been arrested and charged in this matter on 03/27/2005.

An initial search of Weise's room at his home, the residence of [redacted] resulted in the seizure of many items of evidence. However, on 03/29/2005, a family member contacted a member of the shooting investigative team and turned over a photocopy of the floor plan of the RLHS. On this plan, Weise had made a number of notations which clearly indicated a planned assault on the school, possibly by three shooters or more shooters.

A number of family members have handled this note, which was found crumpled in a ball in another container. A BIA SA and a Tribal Criminal Investigator (CI) have also handled it.

Minneapolis will prepare a comprehensive list of people who have been known to have handled it, and possible conspirators who may have handled the note. Additionally, Minneapolis will obtain major case exemplars from all known exemplar persons and suspects, as well as DNA samples from any possible conspirators and forward to Laboratory as soon as possible.

The Laboratory Division is requested to immediately begin evaluation for examinations on the plan in order to exploit any forensic evidence regarding same, to include indented writing, latent fingerprints, DNA.

Further, Operational Support Section, Investigative and Prosecutive Graphic Unit (OSS/IPGU) is requested to arrange 10 enlarged color copies of this floor plan to be made and shipped directly to the Bemidji RA to assist in ongoing investigation.

Immediate priority is requested in this matter due to current outstanding investigation and possible co-conspirators as yet unidentified and possibly posing future threat, as well as the tolling of the Juvenile Delinquency Act time period which requires resolution in 30 days in lieu of continuance motions.

He is unaccounted for during the intervening time period but is believed to have walked the relatively short distance from his residence, the [redacted] home, through the woods to the home of his grandfather, Darryl Lussier, where he murdered his grandfather and the grandfather's girlfriend, Michelle Sigana with a .22 caliber Ruger semiautomatic pistol.

It appears that the grandfather was shot as he slept while Sigana was surprised while doing laundry, shot initially with the .22 caliber Ruger pistol but later received a coup de grace shot from the grandfather's service pistol. Numerous rounds of live .22 caliber long rifle ammunition and the top to a plastic box of CCI .22 long rifle ammunition were left in the living room of the Lussier/Sigana home, and interview of [redacted]

[redacted] Darryl Lussier and Michelle Sigana, indicated the absence of any .22 long rifle-caliber weapons or ammunition in the household.

It is believed that after initially shooting Lussier and Sigana, Weise retrieved his grandfather's Red Lake Police Department (RLPD) service weapons, a Glock .40 S&W pistol, a Remington 870 12 gauge shotgun and a DPMS M-4 .223 rifle from either the home or the RLPD cruiser. He or someone else attempted to load the .223 rifle but was apparently stymied by the fact that the weapon was so dirty it jammed and the rifle was left at the Lussier/Sigana household.

The shooting at the Lussier/Sigana household has two critical questions:

(1) Where did Weise get the .22 ammunition for his pistol, which is believed to have been owned by [redacted]

[redacted] (who has denied any knowledge of the weapon)? It is known from interviews that just a short time before the shootings Weise was seeking to obtain ammunition for that weapon.

(2) Sigana was initially shot with the .22 pistol, but, even though Weise still had ammunition for the .22 Ruger, she was shot again with the grandfather's .40 caliber Glock service pistol.

Both questions could point to the involvement of a second or more individuals in the shootings at the Lussier/Sigana home. Of particular interest in this regard is that two known conspirators of Weise's, [redacted]

[redacted] both of whom had admittedly agreed to assist Weise in a school shooting spree but allegedly withdrew some time prior to 03/21/2005, remain unaccountable for the time period when the Lussier/Sigana murders took place, estimated between 12:30 pm and 2:50 pm on 03/21/2005. [redacted] had graduated the previous year, was unemployed and living at a mutual friend's house and was supposedly walking from one neighboring town to another at the time of the shooting, while [redacted] had taken the day off from school, allegedly to study.

Minneapolis and the District of Minnesota are currently exploring the feasibility of charging further individuals in connection with this matter. Of particular concern are (1) any persons of interest who may have handled the "assault plan," as delineated in referenced serial 67 with leads; (2) any person who may have been present during or shortly thereafter the murder of Darryl Lussier and Michelle Sigana, which took place at the Lussier/Sigana residence before the shooting spree at the Red Lake High School; and (3) any person who might have provided the .22 caliber ammunition to Weise which was used to kill Weise's grandfather, Darryl Lussier and Lussier's girlfriend, Michelle Sigana, at their residence.

Laboratory Division is advised that the crime scene examination at the Lussier/Sigana home was conducted by the Mobile Crime Laboratory search team of the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension. During that search, numerous boxes of .223 caliber and 12 gauge ammunition, as well as plastic ammunition holder strips were recovered, as well as .223 magazines. Also recovered were three soda cans in the kitchen and living room and a Buck knife from the living room sofa.

Of particular and priority interest is the fact that at the afore-mentioned top to a box of .22 long rifle caliber ammunition was discovered, apparently carried by Weise to the

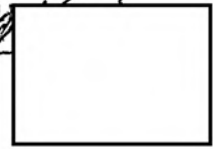

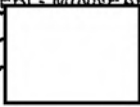

Comparative examinations of the above bullets or bullet fragments against test fired bullets from Items 50 (one DPMS Panther Arms Model A-15 223 Remington caliber rifle bearing serial number F006810) and 71 (one Ruger 22 Long Rifle caliber pistol bearing serial number 181073) showed the presence of different features. This means that the above items can be eliminated as having been fired from Items 50 and 71.

Comparative examinations of the above bullets against test fired bullets from Items 50 and 66 show the presence of different features. This means that the above bullets can be eliminated as having been fired from Items 50 and 66. Item 73 (one magazine, 1B42, Area E, Item 8B) was used to test fire Item 71.

Comparative examinations of Item 53B (one bullet fragment recovered from Jeffrey Weise's buttocks, from 1B1) and one of the fragments of 53 D (three bullet fragments recovered from Jeffrey Weise's left thigh, from 1B1) against test fired bullets from Item 50 were inconclusive. However, based on similar class characteristics, these bullet fragments can not be eliminated as having been fired from Item 50. Comparative examinations of the above bullets or bullet fragments against test fired bullets from Items 66 and 71 showed the presence of different features. This means that the above bullets or bullet fragments can be eliminated as having been fired from Items 66 and 71. The remaining two fragments of Item 53D were not suitable for comparative examinations.

Examination of Item 53A (recovered from Jeffrey Weise's head, from 1B1) showed it to be consistent with shotshell components (buffer and apparent pieces of shot cup or wad). Examination of Item 53C (recovered from Jeffrey Weise's sweatshirt) showed it to be consistent with one flattened 00 buck shot pellet.

Item 54B (one apparent JHP bullet jacket fragment recovered from Chanelle Rosebear, 1B2), Item 59C2 (one apparent lead bullet fragment with copper plating recovered from Michelle Sigana) and Item 69 (one apparent JHP bullet jacket fragment recovered from [redacted] 1B70) were not suitable for comparative examination.

Examination of Item 57 (projectiles recovered from Derrick Brun, 1B5) showed it to be consistent with two 12 gauge rifled slugs and one 12 gauge wad.

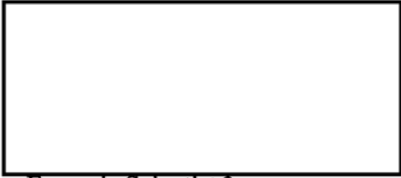

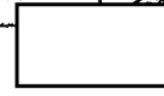

Also their investigation had led to another male, [redacted] who may have also had "chats" with [redacted]. The chat logs would most likely be those involving MSN Messenger. There were a number of unidentified "chats" recovered from WEISE's computer that they were hoping to identify. [redacted] stated he would fax a list of "chat" screen names and email addresses.
3. On 2005May04 I received the fax. Also on this date Det. [redacted] turned over to me exhibit #1 along with supporting documents (Request for Service, Possession of Property Report R6-A and Consent to Search). Det. [redacted] request was to find the aforementioned chat logs and/or email conversations related to this investigation.
4. On 2005May04 I conducted an examination of exhibit #1 and found that there was only one cabled hard drive (exhibit #1a) harnessed inside. I removed the [redacted] (exhibit #1a) and using my

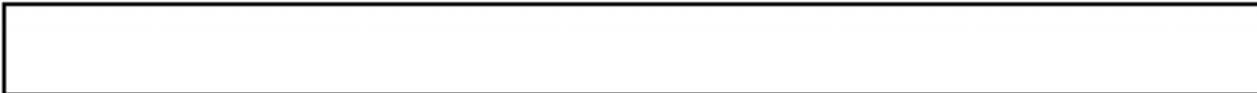

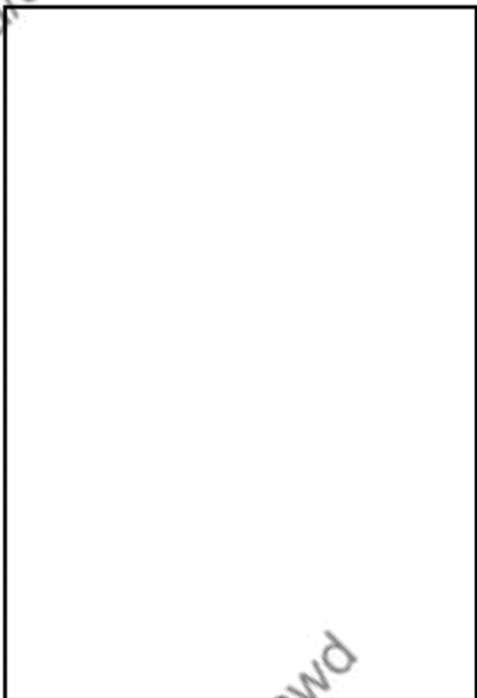

Due to the fact that the death of Ms. Rogers is part of
an ongoing investigation and prosecution, we are unable to
provide Ms. [redacted] with any records at this time. Such records
will be available at the conclusion of the investigation and
prosecution via the Freedom of Information and Privacy Act
process. In the meantime, in lieu of the above, the following
information, determined from investigation, is provided:

On March 21, 2005, at approximately 2:50 pm, a lone
individual entered the Red Lake High School on the Red Lake
Indian Reservation, Minnesota, where Ms. Rogers was employed as a
teacher. This individual immediately shot and killed a security
guard, then to a point where he was able to observe Ms. Rogers,
who was walking towards the gunman and conversing with a group of
students. Ms. Rogers was pushing a computer cart from one
classroom to another at the time the gunman encountered her. The
gunman opened fire on Ms. Rogers and the students.

Ms. Rogers and the students fled away from the gunman.
Ms. Rogers ran to a nearby classroom, the doors of which were
immediately locked. However, the gunman was able to force access
to the classroom and entered it. He shot Ms. Rogers ^{three times}
with a .40 caliber handgun, killing Ms. Rogers almost instantly,
and also shot nine students in the classroom, five fatally. The
gunman then exited the classroom and proceeded to wander in the
hallways and enter other classroom, ultimately shooting and

wounding two other students. He was then encountered by officers from the Red Lake Department of Public Safety and, after engaging in an exchange of gunfire with the officers, was wounded. The gunman then fled back into the classroom where Ms. Rogers had been killed. Inside the classroom, the gunman committed suicide. The entire incident in the school took place in less than ten minutes. It is noted that the gunman is also believed to have murdered two other persons shortly before arriving at the school.

A examination of the wounds that Ms. Rogers and the other students who were shot in that classroom, and forensic examination of all projectiles recovered from those victims, both deceased and surviving, reveal that all were consistent with having been struck with .40 caliber projectiles. It is noted that the only projectiles fired by Red Lake police officers were .223 caliber rounds fired by one officer. Additionally, this office is in possession of statements of eyewitness to the murder of Ms. Rogers.

You are further advised that there has been no information developed during the course of this on-going investigation that indicates anything other than Ms. Rogers was chosen at random for shooting by the gunman, and that Ms. Rogers, at the time of her death, was engaged in her official duties.

I hope that this information will suffice at this time for the normal processing of insurance claims for Ms. Rogers' family. Should you have any further questions, please feel free to contact SA [redacted] or Victim Specialist [redacted] at the same number.

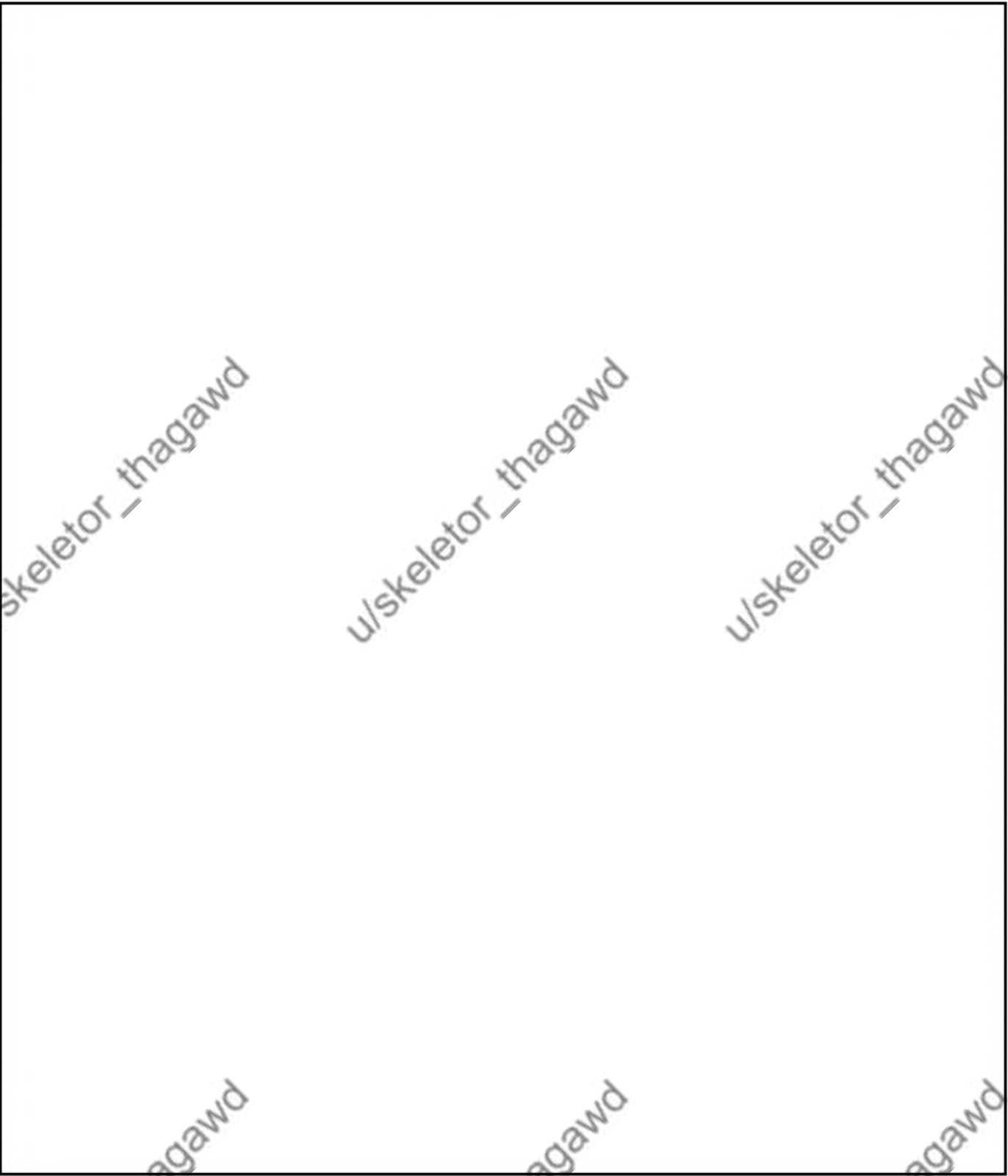

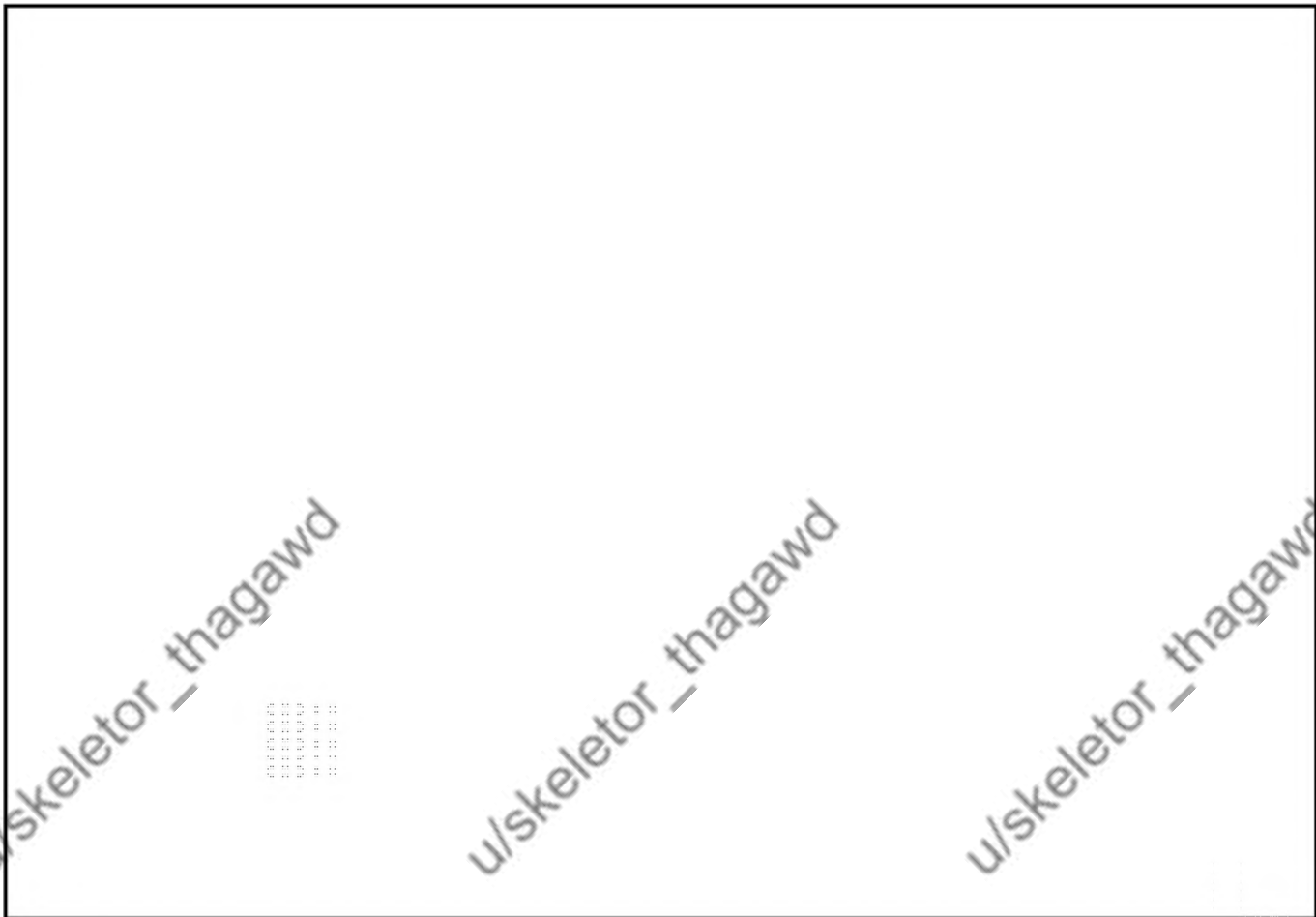
