

10 May - Sea Robbery/ Vega Aquarius/ Bulk Carrier/ Liberia Flagged/ Underway/ Eastbound lane of TSS, Singapore Strait/ DB110520

1. IFC has received information from POCC that a Liberia Island flagged bulk carrier, Vega Aquarius reported on VTIS Ch 10 that she was boarded by five armed perpetrators while underway (01 15.10N 104 05.48E) along Eastbound lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait on 09 May at 2345LT (UTC + 8).

3. Incident Details

The shipmaster reported that one of the ship crew was injured, however no assistance is required. The master conducted a search on board and no perpetrator was found. Two breathing apparatus and one handphone was reported lost. The vessel continued her journey to next port of call in China

25 Mar - Sea Theft/ Bateleur and Naashi/ Tug and Barge/ Panama Flagged/ Underway/ Alang Anchorage, India/ DB130520 (Update from DB100420)

It has been reported that a jack up barge being towed by a tugboat for dismantling, was boarded by robbers at Alang anchorage. Four robbers, carrying torches boarded the barge from a small boat. The Master of the tugboat spotted the torch lights and the alarm was raised, resulting in the robbers escaping. The local Vessel Traffic Information Service were informed, who in turn reported the incident to the Indian Coast Guard. Local marine Police were then requested to send their vessels to the incident location by the Coast Guard station at Pipavav. It has been confirmed that the robbers have been arrested and the stolen items have been recovered.

IFC received information from Philippine Coast Guard ILO that the Chief Engineer of a cargo vessel was medically evacuated by Coast Guard Sub-Station (CGSS) North Harbor SAR team off North Harbor, Manila on 11 May 20. Based on the report, the from representative of Moreta Shipping Lines, the Chief Engineer of their vessel was found breathless inside his cabin. CGSS North Harbor with Emergency Operation Center (EMOC) Manila North Harbor Port Inc., (MNHPI) medical team assisted the shipping company in securing appropriate medical clearance. The team onboard the tug proceeded to the vessel to extract the victim. The victim was extracted and return to port and was sent to Gat Andres Bonifacio Memorial Center. The victim was declared dead on arrival by the attending Physician.

On 9 May 20 at 15.00 LT (UTC+7) a tanker departed from Bangkok's Mahachai Port to Kantang – Thailand. On 12 May 20 it transited in the westbound of the Singapore Strait around 19.00 LT (UTC+7), then turn right to Takong Island for anchoring. But at 19.45 LT ship ran aground on the reef near Island of Pelampung (01 07.518' N - 103 41.929' E). The ship is still waiting for high tide to come out of shallowness / aground. Indonesian Navy and Indonesian Coast Guard are still in the area of this ship for monitoring. The investigator said that 5 of 7 crew do not have any passport.

The two vessels grounded in sequence and not simultaneous. POCC was warning container ship on collision avoidance but she ended up grounding. Shortly after, the bulk carrier grounded even after POCC gave navigation warning on MMS. Both vessels reported no assistance is required.

IFC RECOMMENDATIONS

IFC advises:

1. All mariners to report any incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and to the IFC at the earliest possible time.

2. Ships moving at slow speed or are choosing to remain at anchor in areas where sea robbery/theft is regularly reported should remain vigilant and adopt necessary and/or added security measures.

3. All mariners to take note on the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.

4. Shippers and Seafarers operating in the Sulu-Celebes seas are strongly recommended to be vigilant and to establish contact with the Philippines, Malaysian and Indonesian Authorities to report their presence. Please refer to IFC Spot Commentary 4/18 for the latest assessment of the situation in that affected area.

5. Shippers are advised to take note that the threat of terrorist activity in the maritime domain remains a possibility in the region due to ISIS and the Al-Qaeda. The possibility of this threat was previously quoted in Al-Qaeda's online magazine "Resurgence", which called for the disruption of global trade and shipping through acts of piracy, among other tactics. Shippers are therefore advised to exercise vigilance and to adopt self-defensive measures as stated in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery against Ships in Asia, especially when transiting narrow choke points and areas which are known to have experienced incidents of sea robbery/piracy.
