# PADRES HISTORY

The San Diego Padres joined the MLB in 1969 alongside the Expos, Royals, and Pilots. The franchise got off to a rough start, finishing last in the NL West in each of their first 6 seasons. Unfortunately, there's been little light at the end of the tunnel for the Padres. Through nearly 50 years, they've won the National League West 5 times and made the World Series twice, but have never brought home a Commissioner's Trophy. Perhaps worst of all, the club has only had 14 winning seasons since addition to the MLB.

Success has been hard to come by for the Friars, and things didn't look any brighter in 2016. The 2016 Padres went 68-94, the worst record in the NL West. There were some bright spots from the offseason; including the signing of former All-Star and Gold Glove winner Erick Aybar. But, if there's one thing to like about this team, it's their youth. The club acquired top prospect Manuel Margot from the Red Sox back in 2015, and at age 22 he's soon going to take a lead role with the team. The young outfield corps is backed by another top prospect, Hunter Renfroe, and rounded out by the speedy Travis Jankowski.

It's safe to say the Padres are in rebuilding mode, and will look to add more young talent to their roster.

This series begins with the signing of new GM Scott Frederickson. He's only 36 years old, but he's worked as a farm director for the Pirates and done some lower management for the Reds and Blue Jays. Frederickson has been an avid baseball fan his entire life, and he's been analyzing the sport for decades. The young GM is excited to work with this team and prove his worth as a general manager.

Frederickson is brought in with a year-1 goal of finishing over .500 and is expected to make the playoffs in his 3rd season.

# OFFSEASON

Scott Frederickson will begin his tenure with the Padres on a slim budget of \$93 million. But, the team is projected to make \$1.57 million per week, and with no big salaries coming in, the team will expect to make big profits in 2017.



The front office made some headlines by releasing nearly all major coaching staff. It was a bold move, but Frederickson was confident in the new guys he hired to take over, including new manager Rex Romero, who was signed on a 2 year, \$5.4 million contract. A couple other signings to keep an eye on were hitting coach Alan Zinter and steal-happy 1st base coach Hideo Mathieson.

Not only were additions made to the coaching staff, but to the scouting corps as well. Top scout William Trotter was signed; hopefully he can help bring more young prospects to the organization.

After taking care of the staff, it was finally time to improve the roster. Many cuts were made, most of which were 27+ year old pitchers stagnating in the minor leagues. 2 capable relievers, Carter Capps and Kevin Quackenbush, were promoted to the MLB bullpen. Despite being full of vets, the Padres starting rotation was one of, if not the worst in the league. So, Frederickson decided he might as well bring in some youth and turn them into great MLB pitchers from day 1. The Padres signed Japanese star pitchers Shintaro Fujinami and Shohei Otani both to 1 year, \$80k contracts. Hopefully, they stick around. A couple other new signings to watch are 23 year old 2nd baseman Tetsudo Yamata, and 19 year old shortstop Ricardo de La Torre.



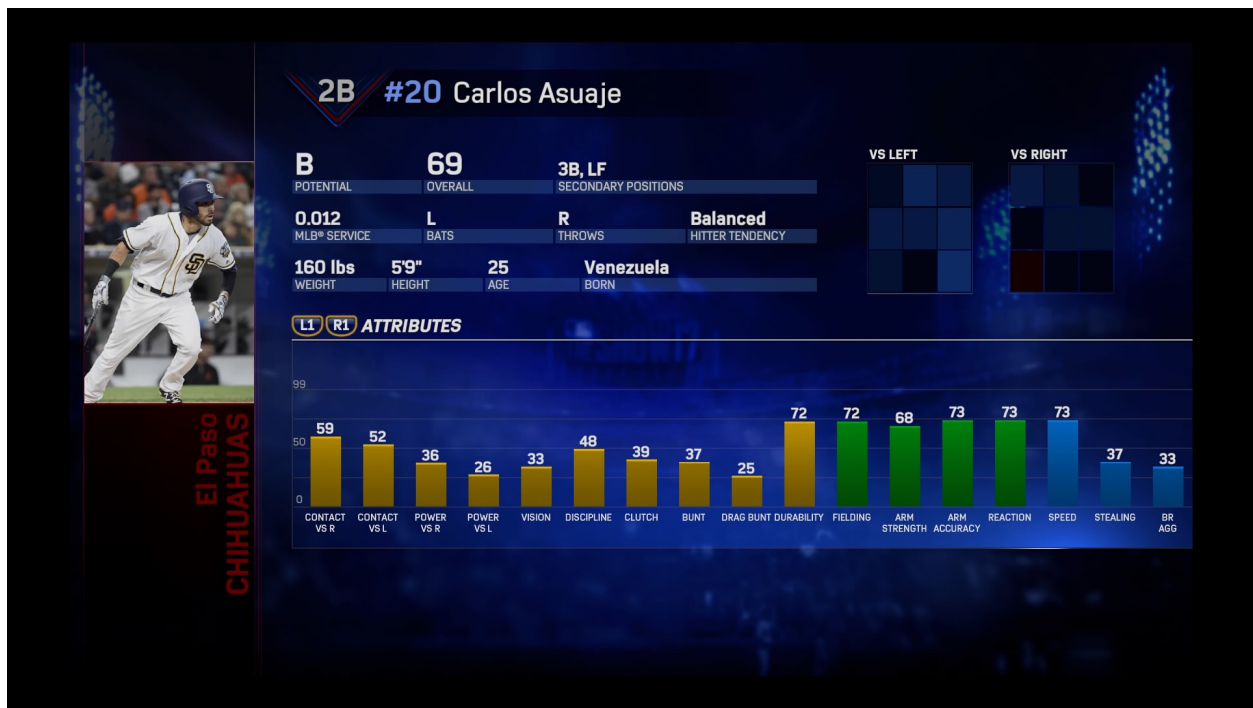
