The Mecca Center Fast Facts

The new Mecca Center, which opened its doors in January 2017, is built on a 4.7-acre site and located at 16W560 91st Street in Willowbrook, Illinois. The new center provides the following facilities:

- A main foyer connecting major building elements while serving as the main mosque entrance
- Spacious prayer halls, a library, classrooms, meeting rooms, and a visiting Imam office
- An Olympic-size gym which is used by the Mecca Center youth and others
- A banquet and multipurpose hall, administrative offices, and a conference room
- LED monitor screens and wi-fi available across all common areas of the building
- Plenty of green landscape and parking around the facilities
