service their customers. High Pharmacy may be computerized, but the personalized service, which originally made the pharmacy - a neighborhood drug store". is anything but lacking.
Both Merlinos state the computer's uses are "invaluable." because not only does the computer maindoes the computer main-
tain accurate records on tain accurate records on
all clients, but also alerts all clients, but also alerts
the pharmacists to possible the pharmacists to possible
sensitivities that certain sensitivities that certain
medications may cause an individual
In addition to alerting the pharmacists of possible sensitivities, the computer is able to keep a record of family as well as individual medication history. This is again. "invaluable" in the again. invaluable in the
treatment of some treatment of some hereditary illnesses
"We have entered into the day of specialization." stated Carmen Merlino. By means of the computer. I can keep records of all the medications taken by a person. I have had in-
stances where I have had to let one doctor know about another doctor's prescription which may offset the new medication prescribed,
Richard Merlino stated most people are unaware of the volume of work
required in the "business" required in the "business" end of a pharmacy. "Most people think we just sit back here and count pills, That's simply not true explained Merlino.
Some may fear that the service received at High Pharmacy may change as Pharmacy may change as a result of the computer Both Merlinos state that the computer is only a "mechanical aid" which will help service their custorners more efficiently. but stressed that "there is no substitute for our professional responsiblity
The computer services the pharmacity in a number of ways. In addition to being a "real time saver", the computer keeps records on all prescriptions. prices, and doctors.
Carmen Merlino explained customer receipts are also stored for one year which is important for all third party billing such as insurance companies Medicare and Medicaid By recording this informa tion. customers who may lose their copy of the receipt may obtain another copy in order to file for reinbursement. something reinbursement. something able to do in the past
As for customer reaction


Merlino stated the feelings are mixed. The older clientele are weary of the modern advancements while the younger cust the younger customers
enthusiastic.

The first step to helping the addict is breaking down that denial in ways that he/she can hear. Therefore velling, accusing. judging, are not effective. But yo can tell the addict about the behavior that has affected vou and connect it to drug use. "You threw a chair las night and I was scared. And you don't do that when vou're not drinking (drugging).
Each person, whether addict or not can be held responsible for his/her behavior. You don't have to suffer in silence.
