Shutterstock Letting Agency - The name of the Letting agency is also the name of a stock image company that owns the footage of the man in the office. The narration "informing her that if the money she owned them wasn't paid by Friday" could be seen as the money Claire owes for rent, or the money 'Claire' the show, owes for royalties due to the inclusion of the watermarked footage.

• Furthermore, later whilst on the phone with her Lettings agent, Claire remarks "I could have sworn it was 360 but fine." She could have been disputing price of the rent or the screen resolution of the footage used, which is distinctly lower than the rest of the show coming in at 360p or arguably 480p resolution.

• **Fascion** - The Hugo Boss poster in the background of the shoe shop shows a soldier in military uniform with 'The 1934 Collection' written underneath. In 1934, Hugo Boss infamously designed the uniform for the Nazis.

• **'Strap's Broke'** - Claire is unable to return the shoes she purchased because of a broken strap. This is because she broke it by kicking the bed in frustration when realising that she needed to return the shoes in the scene before.

• **Missing Two Legged Cat** - As well as having a framed photo of her handicapped cat on her desk, on her whiteboard Claire's written: 'Tuesday - Feed Cat FIND CAT'. The fact that she needs to write on a whiteboard to remind herself to feed her pet, and also that it seemingly only gets fed on a Tuesday, may explain why her two legged cat had somehow run away.

• **Enjoying a 'Good book'** - The *50 Shades of Grey*-esque dialogue that Claire reads in bed are genuine extracts from the Song of Solomon part of the Old Testament.

• **Do the Gumtree** - The Gumtree poster shows a girl dancing and wearing a shirt with chickens on it. Claire is seen dancing in a very similar way but wearing a shirt with fried eggs on it.

• **Catholic Roots or...** - After selling her ex's MacBook, Claire accidentally knocks some books off her shelf whilst dancing. One of the books was the Bible, which she saw as a sign that her religion was reaching out to her. The other book that falls is "Unbelievable: The Bizarre World of Coincidences", which she completely ignores.

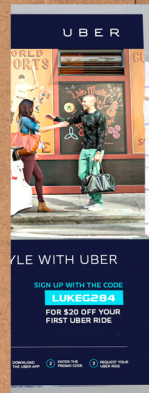

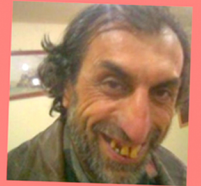


THE 1934 COLLECTION

• **More Ignored Signs** -

- Claire tells Daniel that her flat is located on the 5th floor but later we clearly see a sign that shows she lives on the 6th floor.
- When she first meets Daniel, she ignores numerous signs that indicate he's blind including the fact he's wearing a 'I am Visually impaired' badge - albeit upside down.

- Whilst looking at the box of cheap iPhones, she ignores the sign that reads "MAY CAUSE FIRE. NOT FOR SALE" although in fairness, the way she was holding the box meant she only saw "FIRE SALE"

- **Aha A-ha!** - The phrase used to express surprise is used by Daniel immediately after Claire's 'A-ha!' fantasy, as well as by Claire herself, immediately before her second 'A-ha!' fantasy about David Dickinson.

- **Axe Murderer** - The scary looking Axe murderer is seen 3 times during the episode. As well as in the background whilst Claire buys shoes and being featured in a newspaper article, he's seen when Daniel points to a photo of his girlfriend in his wallet. The photo is of the axe murderer. Is Daniel a con-man and this is his partner of crime - or - the poor, blind Daniel has been tricked and the axe murderer has killed his girlfriend and now plays the role of Daniel's love. Who knows?

- **Is Claire Responsible?** - The date of the Car Boot sale where Claire buys a batch of cheap Chinese iPhones is August 24th 2015 - which in China was also known as Black Monday. Black Monday was a huge disaster for the country's economy, with China suffering a huge market crash.

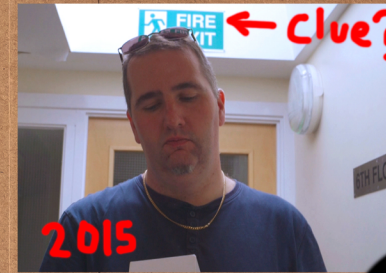
- **Car Boot Confusion** - The poster advertising the sale, includes the footnote "No Actual Car Boot Parts Are Sold Here". An annoyed mechanic can be seen reading this and waving his spanner in annoyance.

- **Homeless Man's Origin** - Claire is the reason why the homeless man whom she takes the money from... is homeless.

- Two years before she sold him a dodgy iPhone that inevitably burns down his house, including his prestigious wine cellar.
- In the present day, the now longhaired and scraggy man is seen living in the streets and next to him is a recovered wine bottle from his cellar - with the label visibly burnt. The name of the wine is 'Casillero Del Diablo' which translates to 'Cellar of the Devil' which is an apt name for what his own wine cellar looked like during the fire.

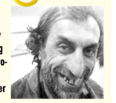

Cat/Cardigan Symmetry - The flashback to the 8 year old Claire mirrors the scene where she gets Joe's cardigan stuck in the washing machine. Both scenes involve a loss of a limb - in the younger flashback, her cat loses it's limb which is stuck on the left side of the washing machine, and years later Claire loses the arm (limb) of the cardigan - also stuck in the left side of the washing machine. On both occasions she promises 'it'll come straight out!'

- **Counterproductive** - As an 8 year old girl Claire's Lies Per Minute counter image shows her holding up a drawing of a happy family with the sun shining. As a 23 year old, Claire's LPM counter image shows her holding up a court order.
- **Save...the Blinds?** - When thinking of the fictional charity to lie about giving the money to, Claire looks up at her kitchen blinds for inspiration before settling on the name. This is rather than the much more obvious influence - the blind man standing in her living room to the left of her.
- **Lack of Awareness** - 'The Little People' newspaper (a play on 'The People' - a British weekend tabloid) is dated as the October 26th 2017 edition. The article is reporting on the day before's events which means Claire had chucked out the little person on October 25th... which happens to be International Dwarfism Awareness Day.
- **Literally letting down** - There's numerous double meanings planted during the montage. Claire let herself down at school - by falling (letting herself down) to the floor. She did the same at university. She let down her nephew, again by literally letting him fall down into the snowy road and she drove tyres which had been let down, causing car problems. Later in the episode, she doesn't let down Daniel - but only because she literally couldn't 'let him down' due to the lift not working.
- **It hadn't been a good week for Mark...** - The Shutterstock Lettings Agent Mark hadn't taken Claire's rejection at their first date well and he almost mirrors Claire's depression at the start of the episode. He's seen listening to Radiohead's 'Creep' and empty tubs of Supergreen Supplement Diet pills are scattered on his desk.

• **What Really Happened?** - The narration explains that Claire decided to tell Daniel what happened when she accidentally spilled water on the MacBook. However, if you listen carefully, underneath the narration, she clearly tells Daniel that he was the one who "hit it over" and repeatedly tells him "it was you".

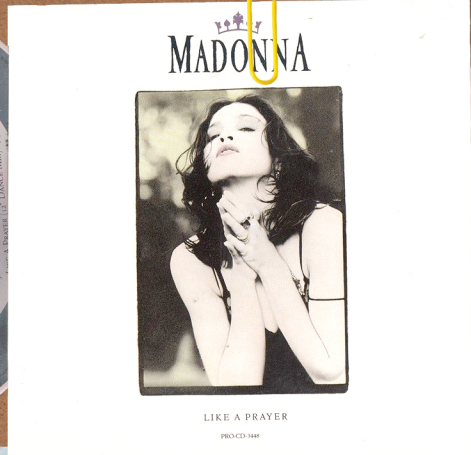
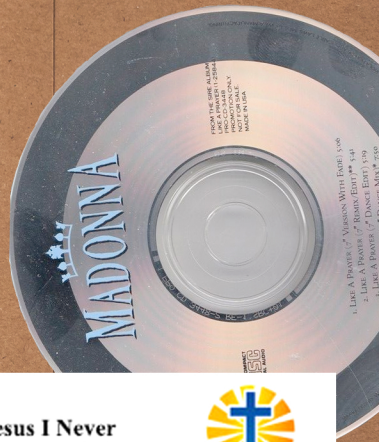
• **Blind Faith** - Stan's Catholic Church flyer contains a picture of Jesus helping a blind man...which is literally the opposite of what Claire was doing when she sees it.

• **Bible Timeline** - "Inspired by her religion today, Claire had done a truly touching thing"...she had indeed. Chopped up in a different order in the episode, here is the chronological timeline of the morning's events:

- Influenced by a poster she's seen, Claire advertises her ex's MacBook and dances, knocking the bible from the shelf.
- She decides to read the bible for moral guidance on what she should do...but ends up reading a chapter of an erotic nature.
- Inspired by the saucy segments of the bible, Claire does...a touching thing under her bedsheets.
- She falls off the bed with the bible she had just read falling beside her.
- All this happens as she listens to Madonna's 'Like a Prayer' - a song that has dual religious/sexual meanings. Claire falls off the bed as the line "down on me knees" plays.

• **Like a Virgin Mary** - The image of a praying Virgin Mary appears 4 times in the episode:

- Claire falls to her knees and recreates the praying Virgin Mary stance after she believes her laptop has been placed in her room by God.
- Madonna also creates the same pose on the single cover of 'Like A Prayer', which Claire listens to in her bedroom.
