Following an incident, it takes around eight minutes for emergency services to arrive at the scene. For every minute that goes through when a victim of SCA isn't treated, it is thought that their chance of survival decreases by 10%. Sadly, in most cases, this could be too late to assist a victim of sudden cardiac arrest. But, knowing how to do CPR effectively could be the difference in saving a life.

Bystander [CPR](#) can be very effective in doubling or triple the chance of survival of those suffering who suffer a sudden cardiac arrest. But only 32% of cardiac arrest victims receive CPR due to the fact that they aren't conscious of the best ways to assist.

A patient experiencing sudden cardiac arrest needs efficient CPR and defibrillation. Because the chances of survival decrease by approximately 10% for each minute without bystander CPR, until they are defibrillated. It is therefore vital to ensure that bystanders practice CPR as quickly as they can because their survival depends on those nearby in the time it takes for the emergency assistance to arrive.
