The latest update to the Apple Tv model of this hit sport enables "Realms," Minecraft's subscription-based multiplayer system. This upgraded version additionally contains Xbox Reside authentication assist, which will let players access their linked avatars and character skins.

Once you buy a Realms account, it is like getting a Minecraft server, solely it's maintained by Microsoft so you do not have to mess with things like hosting or IP addresses. You get to regulate who can go to your personal Minecraft Realm, too.
