



# Training Theatre in Global Education

Mobility of youth workers

## INFO-PACK FOR PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS AND PARTICIPANTS

### ➤ SHORT DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

The project “**Training Theatre in Global Education**” (TTGE) aims to combine methodology of global education, theatre and peer education – the approaches that are being used by leading partner organizations ([Humanitas](#), [Ephebus](#) and [EPTO](#)). Project intends to develop new methodology that will enable deeper and more efficient awareness raising of global interdependencies and the role of each individual on the local and global level. Each method (global education, theatre and peer education) itself has a big potential, however, combined in a new methodology they can prove to present even more efficient way to engage youth in proactive activities, foster their understanding of the interconnectedness of the world, and encourage them to share their ideas and experiences with their peers.

### ➤ The project is divided in three main phases:

1. First training (Slovenia, 2017) – TAT\*
2. Practicing the new methods (Slovenia & Hungary, October 2017 - March 2018)
3. Second training (Hungary, 2018) – TTT\*

\*According to the [EPTO certification standards](#) the first training is recognized as **TAT (Thematic Awareness Training)** and the second training is **TTT (Train the Trainer)**. Participants who will fulfil all required tasks will receive **EPTO passport** with certification level the end of the project.

Besides, a [Youthpass certificate](#) will be proposed to every participant after each trainings. This certificate will include the training objectives and content, as well as the main competences acquired by each participant. The objective is to validate each participant's learning experience gained throughout a particular project phase, foster their personal learning process and support their employability.

**The first training** will focus on the presentation of three methods: global education, theatre and peer education, and combine them into powerful methodology for raising awareness about global interconnectedness and interdependency, and about the importance of becoming active global citizens. The participants will understand their unique role in the society and the power they have to contribute to positive social change. We will provide participants with different activities that can be used within their work with young people, especially those with fewer opportunities. **Between the first and the second training**, participants will prepare and implement the activities in their local environment, and thus put into practice the new knowledge and skills acquired during the training. They will learn from experience and additionally develop the new methodology and adapt it to their own needs. **The second training** will be a great opportunity to share the experiences which participants gained while using the new methods in their working environment. They will present the outcomes and possible improvements of the activities to the trainers and other participants who will provide feedback to them. All participants will be invited to take part in the discussion about the opportunities of combining the three methods (Global education, theatre and peer education). **The final output** will be a brochure about the new methodology, in which participants’ experience, theory and practice will be combined.



➤ **PROFILE OF THE PARTICIPANTS:**

Altogether, 20 participants will be involved in the project, **10 from Slovenia** and **10 from Hungary**. It is very important for partners **to select participants that will be able to attend both trainings** (first in Slovenia, second in Hungary), **as well as to organize the workshops** between the two trainings.

**Participants should:**

- be of age 18+
- have previous experiences with facilitating the workshops (preferably with young people)
- be able to actively participate in English language
- to participate full time at both trainings (3 – 8 October 2017 / Slovenia, estimated date: March 2018 / Hungary)

**Participants who commit to this training will have to:**

- complete minimum 6 hours of practice between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> part of the training (facilitation of activities in their local environment)
- present a draft idea of their future action plan - how they will use the new methodology within their work (presentations will take place during the trainings)

➤ **RESPONSIBILITIES OF SENDING ORGANIZATIONS**

- The sending organization (SO) will provide support to participants during all the phases of the project, including during and after the mobility. Each SO will assign one person to be responsible from its side for this initiative;
- The recruitment of participants will be the responsibility of each partner;
- Each SO will be responsible for the pre-mobility preparation of their participants;
- Each SO will provide support related to travel (buying tickets, preparing participants for the trip, etc.) and also related to health insurance and the conditions associated to it. Upon request, the coordinating organisation can provide support or other relevant information;
- SOs must check that participants have all the necessary travel documents and that they understand the role and importance of each one, also in terms of reimbursement of costs: valid id/passport, travel tickets, visa (if required);
- Each SO will be responsible for gathering relevant evaluation data and for insuring a proper exploitation of results in each local community and the visibility of the project, including the visibility of the Erasmus+ programme;

## **FIRST TRAINING, 3 – 8 OCTOBER, MARIBOR (SLOVENIA)**

### **Important information**

❖ **WHEN:**

The training will take place **from 3 - 8 October 2017** (travel days included). **The training will start on 3<sup>rd</sup> October at 15.00**, so participants should arrive to the venue of the training **at least 30 minutes before** to register and accommodate themselves in the rooms. On the first day, lunch will be provided between 13.00 - 14.30. We will **finish with the training on 8 October at 13.00**, so participants should plan their departure **after lunch** that will be provided from 13.00 – 14.00.



❖ **WHERE:**

The training will take place in the city called **Maribor**, which is located in North-eastern part of Slovenia. Participants will be accommodated in 2 – 4 bed rooms in [Hostel Pekarna](#). Address of the hostel: **Ob železnici 16, 2000 Maribor, Slovenia**.

❖ **HOW TO APPLY:**

All participants should apply through the [ON-LINE APPLICATION FORM](#) and provide all required information. **The deadline for full-filling the application is 25<sup>th</sup> of August 2017**. Selection process will be done by Humanitas. **Participants will be informed about their selection by email** provided in on-line application form **at least 3 weeks before the training** will take place.

❖ **WHAT TO BRING:**

Towels and bed linens will be provided by the hostel. Participants should bring **all personal toiletries, comfortable clothes and slippers**. The days in the beginning in October are usually quite warm, but evenings can get chilly, so some warm clothes are recommended. Participants should also bring **a notebook and a pen** to make notes during the training sessions.

❖ **FOOD:**

Participants will be provided with **three meals daily (breakfast, lunch, dinner) and two coffee breaks during the training sessions**. Specific dietary needs and allergies should be clearly stated in the on-line application, later changes may not be possible due to the catering service policy. Clear information about allergies or specific types of food out of religious reasons will help us and the catering company to prepare and offer the best service possible.

❖ **TRANSPORT:**

Members of the coordinating team will assist partners and/or participants to organize their travel to the venue of the training. Each participant will receive a **reimbursement form** (participants' travel costs will be reimbursed according to **the funding rules of the ERASMUS+ program\***). Reimbursement will be done by bank transfer to each partner organization (they will then reimburse the participants) in 3 weeks after Humanitas will receive all original travel documents (round trip bus/train tickets, form with calculated costs of driving with a car and all pay toll receipts).

❖ **INSURANCE:**

Participants are advised to have **European Insurance card** with them or buy travel insurance before their departure. **This cost will not be reimbursed to the participants.**

❖ **TRAINING MATERIALS:**

All necessary training materials will be provided by Humanitas. Trainers will provide **learning materials in English language and use video resources** to present the topics and methods in the clearest way as possible. Both trainings will be highly interactive and inclusive, so participants will be involved in the process making as well.

❖ **INTERNET ACCESS:**

**Free Wi-Fi will be available** in the rooms and common spaces of the hostel. Internet connection may be slow due to the high number of users, so we kindly ask all participants to use the Wi-Fi in a smart way. **Participants can use the internet during the breaks and their free time**, but not during the training sessions where they are expected to actively participate full time.

❖ **PREPARATION OF THE PARTICIPANTS:**

Prior to the first training in Slovenia, **partner organizations (SO) will organize short preparatory activities for selected participants**. All the materials needed for the activities will be provided to SO by the trainers. Preparatory activities will help the participants to better prepare for intercultural encounters with participants from different cultural and social backgrounds, as well as for the learning experience abroad. **The activities should be organized by SO at least two weeks before the first training.**

❖ **PROGRAMME:**

Selected participants will receive **an email with the programme** at least one week before the training will take place.
