On the longest day of the year there is no total darkness over the northern isles of Scotland. Lerwick, in Shetland, has 4 hours extra daytime at midsummer than London, although this is turned around in midwinter. Annual average sunshine total amounts differ from as low as 711-- 1140 hours in the Highlands and also the north-west up to 1471-- 1540 hrs on the severe eastern and also south-western coasts.

Ordinary temperatures are lower than in the remainder of Wonderful Britain, with the chilliest ever UK temperature level of 27.2 ° C (17.0 ° F) tape-recorded at Braemar in the Grampian Mountains, on 10 January 1982 and also at Altnaharra, Highland, on 30 December 1995. Wintertime optimums typical 5.0 to 5.7 ° C (41.0 to 42.3 ° F), with summer season maxima averaging 14.9 to 16.9 ° C (58.8 to 62.4 ° F). Western coastal areas of Scotland are warmer than the eastern and also inland locations, because of the impact of the Atlantic currents, and also the colder surface area temperature levels of the North Sea; nonetheless, during rare warm spells, the west is cooler than the east. The greatest temperature level tape-recorded was 32.9 ° C (91.2 ° F) at Greycrook in the Scottish Borders on 9 August 2003.

Therefore, the majority of the population stay in the Central Lowlands of Scotland, bordering

the primary cities of Glasgow and also Edinburgh. Various other focus of populace include the northeast coastline of Scotland - principally surrounding the city of Aberdeen as well as its environs - and also around Inverness. With a populace density of 8 people per square kilometre, the Highlands are one of the most sparsely populated component of the country, and one of the most sparsely populated locations in Europe.
