
## FOR WHAT PURPOSE MEDICO LEGAL REPORT IS PREPARED?

A medico legal report is a document prepared by a physician assistant that documents the details of the suspected mesothelioma case. This report is used to provide medical professionals with an accurate diagnosis of the disease to receive appropriate treatment. This is a specialized form of medical evidence that is used in lawsuits involving mesothelioma. A medical records expert is needed to prepare medico-legal reports, and this form of the expert witness is called a medico legal report writer.

The purpose of a report is to determine whether or not a person is a victim of negligence or if another party was at fault. For example, if a person working in a factory were killed because his work helmet was faulty, the accident would be reported first by the factory's safety inspector and then by the lawyer representing the family on behalf of the worker's family. Suppose the personal injury claims against the factory are found valid. In that case, the accident will be reported as a

"worker's compensation case" in court. The company will pay the lawyer who represents the worker on behalf of the injured worker's family.

## HOW DOES A MEDICO LEGAL REPORT GET WRITTEN?



First, the <u>personal injury claim</u> attorney needs to get the report from a doctor who has diagnosed the disease to begin collecting medical records. These records will become an important part of the case once it gets to the courtroom. This means that the attorney needs to hire a competent, qualified expert

witness to write the report. The witness will need to examine the patient well to determine if they should be awarded compensation.

After the doctor writes the medico legal reports, they are submitted to the court. The family law courts are the bodies that hear and decide cases under their jurisdiction. Once the papers are filed with the court, the next step is for the employee or family member to get copies of the reports and present them to the court during care proceedings.

## **SOLUTION WITHOUT ANY MEDICAL RECORD**



Many times, injured people have difficulty finding doctors who will accept their medical records. Fortunately, this is no problem when it comes to medico legal reports. Once the documents are filed with the court, the injured person can have the records professionally translated for their benefit. This means that the doctor who originally wrote the report will have an opportunity to make small changes to the medical records to ensure that the person understands exactly what they are being treated for. This same process is also useful for the injured people who travel to different clinics.
