Overview

Brandeis Bridges is a student-led initiative to bridge the gap between the Black and the Jewish students at Brandeis. This initiative began as a partnership between the Brandeis Israel Public Affairs Committee (BIPAC), the Brandeis Black Student Organization (BBSO), and Martin Luther King and Friends. The Brandeis Bridges Fellowship will be composed of 5 Black and 5 Jewish fellows. This initiative is a full year commitment. It will include monthly programming between September-May, discussions and meetings, and a 5 day intercultural trip to the South of the United States, retracing the path of the Freedom Riders. The trip will take place **February 10-22, 2015**. The Brandeis Bridges program is a full-academic-year commitment. Students planning to study abroad or graduate early are not eligible to apply.

Program Benefits

Program costs—airfare, food, hotels, cultural program expenses—are fully covered for all fellows. The flights to and from Brandeis are also fully covered. Fees associated with obtaining passports are not included.

In addition to this cost-free trip, fellows will build a leadership network among fellow Brandeis students and will engage in deep learning and leadership development activities.

Eligibility

- You must be currently enrolled as a Brandeis undergraduate who is not planning on studying abroad during the current academic year, and who will not be graduating early.
 You must be able to commit a considerable amount of time (7-10 hours) per week to attending workshops, meeting with professors, programming for the trip, and planning events on campus, and attending and planning Brandeis Bridges club meetings.
- You must be available February 10-22, 2015 to attend the intercultural trip to the South.
- You must be willing to commit yourself to a full year as a fellow. Following the trip, you will be responsible for on-campus programming, helping to lead the Brandeis Bridges club, and for ensuring the continuity of the program for the following year.
- You must identify as either a member of the Black and/or Jewish community at Brandeis.
- All participants are required to complete medical forms if selected for the fellowship.
