

It came up in a crab pot and ever since, Madelaine has been entranced by this creature and their representation of resilience, agility, creativity, knowing, and adaptability. Using Spruce wood sourced from local Alaska Specialty Woods, she sawed each slab to size before hand painting each award individually. Using frames crafted by Donna Halvorsen from locally felled cedar and Alaska Laser Maid to engrave the boards, each award is a true representation of what POW's local resources can offer. Supporting local economy through promo-

The POW ROCKS were inspired by the Fidalgo Island Rocks Facebook Page (check out their Facebook page) and all of the fun that they are having. POW Island residents decided to start our own painted rock community here on Prince of Wales Island.

The idea is to decorate rocks or other found items in nature and hide them in various locations to brighten someone's day. You can use paint, sharpies,or whatever- as long as it has a coat of sealer over it to help preserve the art. On the back of your masterpiece write in Sharpie- Post a picture to the Facebook Page "POW Island ROCKS". You can also write- Keep or Re-Hide Me.

Perhaps a Marathon visitor would like to bring a painted rock from home to leave behind on POW?

Our POW visitors are almost guaranteed to find these treasures on the Sunnahae Trail or the Cemetery Island Trail, both within walking distance from the Marathon Registration Headquarters that is located at the Craig Tribal Association facility in the middle of Craig, Alaska. From the opening of Race Headquarters at 2PM on Friday, May 26th, until the 7PM program start, there is ample time to head to one of these trails.

On Saturday, depending on the finish time of your Marathon event, there is another window to "stretch" out your legs until the 6:30 Awards ceremony.



The view from the Sunnahae Trail pleases the senses no matter what time of day!



When Joan Wargi first arrived in Alaska in 1987, she did not see how she would be able to survive our Southeast Alaskan weather and soon left Alaska for Hawaii. However, she moved back to Alaska in 1999 and now says she cannot imagine living anywhere else in the world and loving it so much.

Joan drew inspiration for the 2017 Prince of Wales Island Marathon from indigenous materials that are common in our community. She handcrafted decorations for the marathon, including table runners, table trays, and potted plants. Her husband, Tom, assembled the trays, and she decorated them using the octopus which is the 2017 marathon theme. She and Tom, also an eminent local artist, used alder wood and other materials salvaged from our local area. Joan has decorated for a variety of venues and events around Prince of Wales Island. In addition to creating from scratch, she often prefers to take things people already love and rearrange them in new ways to make them flow together. She is always excited about her work, and many local residents are inspired by her accomplishments.
